

Updated Bus Pass Procedure

Starting January 2, 2024 the following bus pass procedure will be in place:

Please send a written note or email from the guardian's email address to the school with your student's full name, bus number they will be riding and with who they are riding with. We will also accept a phone call but it must be from the guardian's phone number we have documented in Skyward which office staff will use to verify. This is for safety and security reasons.

We request that all bus pass requests be submitted prior to lunch time in order to get it processed and delivered to your student before dismissal.

Thank you so much for your help in keeping our students safe!

As part of the Marysville School District's ongoing efforts to improve safety and security in our schools, we have installed "video doorbells" at our school entrances. Also called a buzzer system, a video doorbell is a connected camera at the school office entrance that notifies school officials when someone requests entry into the building.

The new entry system will change how parents, guardians, guests, and visitors access the school during regular school hours when children are present. In addition to the continuation of all exterior doors being locked, the school's front door will also be locked, and those requesting entry will be checking in using the new system.

During the times before and after school when many students enter and exit the building under adult staff supervision, the front door access will be open but locked when school is in session.

The video doorbell systems installed at schools across the district are funded from a past voter-approved capital levy.

Hello families!

It's that time of year again when head lice cases begin to increase. Please take a moment to check your child for head lice. If you suspect your student has lice, begin treatment and start to disinfect. Things that would need to be washed on a hot cycle and cleaned are stuffed animals, bedding, beanies, hats, clothes, jackets and anything else that comes into contact with your student's hair (If it cannot be washed in a washer, bag it up and store it away for a few weeks - lice will die off with no food supply). Please let the school know if you need any resources or have any guestions!

Is your student (or you) addicted to screens and/or social media?

Here are some warning signs:

- Lack of attention or focus
- Anger and aggression
- Poor grades
- Tantrums or a short fuse
- Avoids social interaction
- Anxiety when away from phone
- Speech delays or other learning problems
- Sleep problems
- Poor self esteem or body issues
- Loss of interest in family activities
- Depression

These are just a few of the issues caused by too much time on screens and social media. You can help by limiting their screen time and monitoring what they are watching.
