## All-New Modernized Learning Spaces at ODY

Work is nearly completed on an all new STEAM Suite in the technology/art wing at ODY. The upgrades are part of a \$3.5 million capital project which was approved by voters in November, 2021 and are being supported through state aid, and funds from the district's Capital Reserve Fund, with no tax levy impact.

The newly reimagined space is now divided into three separate and modernized learning spaces — the Ag Lab, the Shop, and the Ag & Tech Classroom — to host the rapidly expanding list of technology and agriculture classes offered at ODY.

One of the most exciting additions to the Ag Lab space is a brand new virtual welding simulator that gives students hands-on training in realistic scenarios, with instant feedback. ODY's technology and agriculture teacher Mr. Richard Dando has wasted no time in putting the new space - and equipment - to good use.

"Less than 24 hours after the virtual welder was delivered, we had students trying it out," Dando said. "They've been chomping at the bit to jump in and test their skills and are actually coming down during their free periods to get as much time as they can on the simulator."

In addition to the welding simulator, the Ag Lab hosts Dando's Food & Plant Science, Animal Science, and two Intro to Ag classes (sixth and eighth grades) with students growing hydroponic vegetables and raising trout that will be released locally next spring.

The Shop houses equipment like table saws and routers and is used primarily by students in Dando's Energy and Ag Mechanics class who study electricity and wiring in the fall, and small engine repair in the spring.

Dando's Design and Drawing for Production (DDP) class utilizes the new space for many different projects including laser sketching. DDP students also have access to a new laser cutter that was purchased last year using grant money from Cornell University.

"The continual modernization of the way we teach, and the classrooms in which we teach, is critical to our role in adequately preparing our students for life after high school," Superintendent of Schools Brennan Fahey said.
