


Animas Elementary School
Parental Engagement Policy
Title I Requirement, Section 1118, Parent Engagement

In order to ensure that the parents of Animas Elementary students have adequate opportunity to participate in the design and implementation of the Title I program, Animas Elementary has adopted the following policies:

- 1) The Parent Advisory Committee, which will include parents and staff, will meet quarterly to:
 - a. Provide parents with information about Title I requirements and the School Wide Program
 - b. Evaluate and revise the Parent Engagement Policy and Family/School Compact
 - c. Review the 90-Day Plan
- 2) To explain Title I programs, meetings and parent activities will be held throughout the school year:
 - a. Three Academic Parent Teacher Team meetings and one Individual Parent/Teacher Conference will be held to address grade level curriculum, common core standards, assessments and how parents can assist their children.
 - b. The Title I Policy and Family/School Compact will be discussed during the first Academic Parent Teacher Team meeting.
 - c. Ready! for Kindergarten will be promoted throughout the year to address readiness skills.
- 3) Home and school connection:
 - a. Teacher's email address will be provided to enhance communication between home and school.
 - b. The school will utilize "School Messenger", school website, newsletters and social media to inform parents of important school news. Teaching materials are available for parent check out to help promote and supplement each student's education at home.
 - c. Informational brochures and pamphlets from the Parent Institute are available.
 - d. Progress reports every four weeks, Report cards every 9 weeks, K-5th grade.
 - e. Opportunities for parents to work together with teachers will be provided.
 - f. With prior notice, opportunities for parents to volunteer or observe in classrooms will be welcome.
- 4) Translation services will be provided when needed.

It is important to build a strong family-school relationship. The school will do the following:

- Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction by using research-based teaching methods.

- Host at least five (5) annual parent meetings and activities which will be held at flexible times.
