## 7-12 Academic Eligibility Policy

The Academic Eligibility policy is intended to help students maintain passing grades while participating in extracurricular activities, interscholastic athletics and/or high school school privileges.

Students in grades 7-12 may be placed on the "ineligible to participate" list if they hold a class average of $63 \%$ or lower. Teachers may choose not to put a student on the ineligible list if the student is making progress or has overall improvement in the course.

Students who are considered Level II (ineligible to participate) in any given cycle will not be permitted to participate, practice or play in activities such as esports, athletics, drama club, attend dances(including prom) or attend field trips that are not considered part of the school curriculum(i.e. senior trip). Students may also be subject to loss of privileges during the school day(i.e. late sign-in \& open lunch).

## Level I Academic Ineligibility List- Warning

Student's grade is $63 \%$ or lower in any one class.
Students will be allowed to practice, play and participate in activities without restriction.
$\star$ Students are encouraged to attend Homework Help Club and/or meet with their teacher to discuss how to improve their grades.

## Level II Academic Ineligibility List-Ineligible to Participate

Student's grades are $63 \%$ or lower in two or more classes.
Students will not be allowed to practice, play or participate in extracurricular activities for the duration of the ineligibility cycle.
$\star$ Students who are ineligible for 2 subjects may attend practices, meetings \& rehearsals for extracurricular activities if they attend Homework Help Club for a minimum of one hour AND receive a "ticket to practice."

* Students who are ineligible for 2 subjects may appeal their ineligible to participate status. If the student is granted the appeal, he or she may return to full participation immediately.
$\star$ Students will be encouraged to develop a plan for overall academic improvement.

How to help your student if they are struggling with a class:
$\star$ Encourage your student to make sure all of their homework is completed.
$\star$ Help your student by checking their agenda and/or Google Classrooms regularly.
$\star$ Have your student meet with their teachers.
$\star$ Discuss with your student the importance of using study halls and labs wisely.
$\star$ Reach out to your student's teacher.
