






















MEET THE TEAMS

PE this week, we did some work learning the different what the different whistles mean and how to move to them. We also worked on learning how we are to move when the music is on or off. We all then completed a different Fitness challenge using these movement methods based on our age level. The students did a great job with this. Some of the movements proved to be challenging, but they all tried. We also learned the expectations for how to get partners through the toe to toe method. Finally we played Red Light Green Light or Line Tag together.- **Mrs. Schueth**

For **music** this week we are doing a lot of work with beats and rhythms. The kindergarten through 2nd students have been enjoying singing songs and trying to keep beats on their bodies. One of their favorite activities this week was echoing bobo. Bobo makes a pattern for the students and then they have to make that same pattern with their voice/movements. Another new thing for Kindergarten through 1st grade we did was start to introduce instruments through the game "What's that Sound?" The 2nd graders did a great job of using color plates to dance, keep a beat, and sing the song Grand Old Flag. They were also introduced to some Tempo Vocabulary: Presto, Allegro, and Moderato. The 3rd and 4th grade students did their favorite movement activity of Jump in, Jump out. We also learned a new song called Let Us Chase the Squirrel. We then used this song to practice singing in a round. The middle school students for music this week played one of their favorite classroom games of Four Corners, but our version had a music twist. The students had to pick a corner and then rhythm cards were dealt out to each corner. A random rhythm would be played and they then had to figure out which corners rhythm would be played. The last person standing won.

EARLY CHILDHOOD

This week we did some more work on how to be a problem solver. A timer was introduced for students to use when they see a friend has a toy that they would like. They have to grab a timer, tell the friend they are going to set the timer and when it is done they would like to play with the toy. Then when the timer is all finished, they may set the toy if they would like to play with it again. The students have been doing a great job with this. For our focus wall, we have been focusing on: the color green, the number 4, the shape circle, and the letters Oo and Kk. We also reviewed the sounds of all of the letters we have learned so far and they are doing a great job with the sound and motion that goes with it. Another new thing we have been working on during phonics time is saying two words and smashing them together to make one word. They all seem to really enjoy this activity. One of the best things about this week is we had two new friends join our class and we are so grateful to have them to learn and play with. • Mrs. Schueth

Letters- B, J, A, C Numbers-1,3,5,7 Shapes- circle, square, rectangle, triangle Nursery Rhyme- 1,2 Buckle My Shoe Finger Play- Red Light, Red Light In small groups this week, one activity called tactile trackers works on eye hand coordination by tracing lines with a finger. Another small group is playing color and shape bingo with Miss Megan, and the independent group is working on fine motor skills with play dough. EARLY CHILDHOOD

This week we had the opportunity to help harvest carrots in the school garden with the help of our middle school buddies. We also had our first mindfulness yoga this week where we learned to calm our bodies. In science this week we were wrecking ball opporators and worked to knock down a concrete wall without hitting the houses. We learned that the harder you swing the ball the harder it hits the wall and knocks down the houses. How much force we use became very important. In phonics we have learned the phonemes $\frac{1}{r}$ /r//l//s/ and $\frac{1}{r}$. In reading we are learning about all the important information on the cover of our book and how that can help us to know if the book intrests us or not. In math we are working with number 0-5. We have learned about "hidden partners" in our numbers. These are the parts that make up a whole. For example 2 and 3 are hidden partners in 5. In writing we have continued to work on what makes a complete sentence and practiccing drawing and writing about things we like. -Mrs. Westwater

In religion this week, we learned about how God's love created the universe. We watched a short clip from the Brother Francis series entitled "Who Made the World and Everything in It?" We know that God made the world and all of the things around us. We will be spending the next several days learning about each part of creation. This week we started by talking about God's gifts in the skies. The moon, sun, and stars are so beautiful. We finished our "books about school" text collection this week. One of our favorite books in this collection was, "I Love You all Day Long". It is comforting to remember that even when we are away from our loved ones, their love is always with us. We tested over Topic 1, numbers to five, this week in math. Our phonics focus has been on peeling beginning sounds in words, sorting by beginning sounds, and rhyming. We worked on writing capital N, E, F, and R in our handwriting lessons. We have been working on adding details to our drawings in our writing books. Our drawings tell a story and can help us to think about things we could write about. We are looking forward to another great week of learning and growing in kindergarten! - Mrs. Flugum
