





EARLY CHILDHOOD

This week was Community Helper Week in preschool. We had a lot of items we worked with and did that were related to community helpers. On Monday, Sally Shekleton came to talk with the students about going to the Dentist. We were able to see different tools that are used there and did an activity where we tried to get the soda off of an egg with a tooth brush and toothpaste. In our room we also painted a tooth on paper with white paint and then gave it some sparkles so it was sparkly clean. We had the fire truck, ambulance, and rescue squad come to school on Thursday and the students were able to hear all about ways they try to help people when they are in need. They were able to look at different tools they all use to help people and also were able to go inside of them. We painted a flame on this day well. On Friday, we had Debbie Schissel come in to talk with the students about healthcare. She showed us some of the tools that they use and were able to try some of them out. We read the nursery rhyme Humpty Dumpty this day and received poor ole Humpty Dumpty broken apart. The students glued him back together again and gave him some bandaids to help his cracks get better. We also had community helper puppets we played with and a firetruck and firefighter clothes in the dramatic play area. We also worked on the letters Hh, Jj, Ff, and Gg. Our numbers for the week were: 3, 4, 5, and 6. The colors of the week were: black, white, blue, and brown. Last, but not least the shapes were: rectangle, triangle, and circle. We continue to work on rhyming words, beginning of word sounds, and blending words together to make a new word. The new one the students seem to be liking is when we work on segmenting a word. We clap the word together and then chop it apart. Our puppets, Josie and Joey also helped to teach us about listening to directions and asking a teacher if we need help. We continue to work on our other social skills through out our center times and the students have been doing a great job with using the timers when they would like a turn. - Mrs. Schueth

EARLY CHILDHOOD

This week we enjoyed seeing the firetruck, ambulence and rescue truck, and learning what they do on each. We had prayer pillows blessed and we each got to bring one home. We also had our hearing checked. In math we are working with numbers 6-10. We have been putting graphemes (letters) with their phoneme (sound) for m, t, a, and p. We are learning how to seperate the sounds in words. This will help us as we write them. In reading we have been talking about how sometimes the characters do the same things we do. We then added pictures of some of those things in our reader's notebook. We had our first apple stand this week and boy were we excited. We continue to work on our handwriting and have started with our lowercase letters. This has been a bit tougher for us, but we have done a great job working hard on it. -Mrs. Westwater

In religion this week we learned about the different roles we could have while working in our kindergarten apple stand. We practiced welcoming customers to our stand and asking questions like, "would you like sprinkles"? Students from Mrs. Westwater's classroom were in charge of our opening day on Wednesday. We had a great discussion afterwards about how God has given each of us talents and we all shine in different ways. In phonics this week we began matching sounds to letters. We worked with Mm, Pp, Tt, and Aa this week. We are working to know the names of these letters when we see them in both capital and lowercase forms, as well as the sound they spell. We also learned to write the lowercase form of these letters in handwriting. We continued our work with nouns this week in writing as we completed sentences about places that we think are fun. We tested over topic 2 in math this week as well. This was a tough one, but we did our best. We will continue to practice the concepts of 1 and 2 fewer and 1 and 2 more as we move on to numbers 6 to 10 next week.-
