EARLY CHILDHOOD

In three year olds this week we worked on identifying the colors: purple, orange, yellow, and white. We worked on the numbers 0, 6, 8, and 10 and counting to these numbers. We also worked reviewing the numbers 0-6 and matching these numbers in three different ways through a matching card game we played. We worked on identifying the shapes, oval, crescent, rectangle, and our new shape that was introduced on Friday was a hexagon. We worked on the letters Xx, Ww, and Zz. Thursday was our last day of new letter introduction and now we will be going through the alphabet from Aa through Zz to continue our work on identifying letters and the sounds that each letter makes. With it being October we read 10 Little Pumpkins and continued our Finger play of 5 Little Pumpkins. We also continued our work with the nursery rhymes of Star Light Star Bright and introduced Hey Diddle Diddle. During Phonics we also continued to work with rhyming words, first sounds of words, taking two words and blending them together to make one big word, and then taking one big word and chopping it apart to make two small words. We have been working on memorizing our Christmas songs and I would not be surprised if they are singing these some at home now as they are getting better and better at the words each day. Finally, we talked about hte feelings surprised and afraid/scared. People who know about different emotions and who are able to identify emotions tend, to have better social skills and interactions with their peers. This is one of the big reasons why identifying emotions is so important to begin working with at this age. It was another busy, but exciting week in preschool. I am already looking forward to seeing all of my students on Monday morning. - Mrs.
