

EARLY CHILDHOOD

During 3-year-old preschool, we had short but full week. We worked on the colors white, brown, and gray and the numbers 0, 2, and 9—the week's shapes were Rectangle, Rhombus, and Hexagon. The letters we worked on were Ii, Jj, and Kk. When we review these letters we work on what their names are, skywriting them, and saying the sounds. We also added a sound alphabet song to merge our letter review and phonics time. Rhyming words, beginning word sound identification, blending two words to make one word, and taking one word and breaking it apart into two syllables are all skills we continued to work on. We added saying a sentence and then counting the number of words in a sentence to our phonics time this week. We started to work on our Turkey Dot Coloring/Painting project and also used this project to work on some rainbow writing for the word TURKEY. We also did a project where we painted, tore paper, glued on rectangle strips, and used cotton balls to make a pie of our choice. We created a chart in our class on what everyone would like the best for a pie flavor. The Turkey Dot project and the pie activity went along with two of our read-aloud books this week: 10 Fat Turkeys and There Was an Old Lady Who Swallowed a Pie. It also had students work on their fine motor skills, shape identification, and math. Through center time and outside play, we worked on incorporating some of the problem-solving skills we reviewed this week during social skills. We also discussed during our social skills time how people can have different feelings about the same event that is happening and that all feelings are okay to have. We also continued to work on learning our Christmas songs and they are doing a pretty good job of getting some of the words and actions down. Last but not least we added two new friends to our room. We are super excited to have these new friends to grow, learn, and play with. - Mrs. Schueth

Letters- H, I, J Numbers- 19, 11, 17 Shapes- hexagon, rhombus, trapezoid Nursery Rhyme- Little Boy Blue Finger Play-Little Mouse's House In small groups this week, we are working on measuring using non-standard units, number bingo, and spatial recognition with an activity called 4 squares, more squares. This week we explored how water can move balls and used blocks to retell The Three Little Pigs. The preschoolers have done some taste testing of kohlrabi and cabbage. They also made and tried black bean and corn salad as a dip for some tortilla chips. There were only a few who liked any of these foods, but almost all were willing to give it a try! We have enjoyed reading some books about fall and talking about some changes we are seeing outside. More work was completed on the playground-the new play structure is up and the preschoolers are having a blast using it! When talking about our number each day, the preschoolers are taking turns building it with 10 frames on the floor. We've started working on writing our names and holding our writing utensils correctly. There's so much going on in preschool! - Mrs. Abbott

We have been talking about fiction and non fiction during our read alouds and have been classifying our stories. In writing we have been learning about asking sentences or questions. We have been writing about what we do for fun and asking our friends what they do for fun. We had our stretching and mindfulness yoga this week. We celebrated Veterans Day. - Mrs. Westwater

In religion this week we worked with the story of Noah's Ark. We also created a saints decoration for our homes so that we can remember throughout the month of November that we have saints in Heaven that are cheering for us and wanting the best for us. We know that we can look to the saints for examples of how to live a holy life. Our text collection for this week was books about the importance of kindness. We loved the book, "Lost!" by David McPhail. In math this week we worked with comparing numbers to 10. We used 10 frames to learn about 1 and 2 more as well as 1 and 2 fewer. We are also working with a number line to understand that when we move right on the number line we are showing more and when we move left, we are showing fewer. In writing, we worked more with verbs. We enjoyed passing the microphone and naming words that are action verbs. - Mrs. **Flugum**
