

## P.E. WEEKLY RECAP

This week in P.E., we started a new activity called Capture the Flag. Capture the Flag is a fast-paced team game that helps students build teamwork, strategy, and physical fitness. The class is split into two teams, and each team has its own side of the gym or field and four flags to protect. The goal of the game is to cross into the other team's territory, grab their flags, and bring it back safely to your own side without being tagged. If a player is tagged while on the opposing team's side, they must go to a designated "jail" area. They can only be freed if a teammate runs over and tags them without getting caught. The game continues until one team successfully captures all the other flags and brings it back, or until time runs out. The students were really excited to learn the rules and practice the skills needed to play safely and cooperatively. It's been a fun way to get everyone moving and thinking strategically!

## **KINDERGARTEN HIGHLIGHTS:**

In religion this week, we focused on Marv as we talked about May crowning and began practicing the "Hail Mary" prayer. We also created salt dough crowns to display throughout the month of May. In phonics this week, we learned about sound buddies, more commonly referred to as blends. We know that, unlike digraphs, when we see sound buddies in words, each letter still savs its own sound. We also worked with the heart words, "there," "but," and "want." We worked with the prepositions "in" and "out" in writing, as we wrote about what is in and out of the box. We are also doing an animal research writing project in science. We have each chosen an animal to research and are working with the resource "Pebble Go" to find out facts such as what our animal looks like, where it lives, what it eats, and at least one interesting fact to share. The kindergartners dove right into this research project with excitement and curiosity! In math, we tested over measurement and have moved on to working with shapes. We are looking forward to our kindergarten Mass on May 9th, where Mrs. Westwater's friends will be readers at Mass, and Mrs. Flugum's friends will be leading one of the songs in the Mass. - Mrs. Flugum & Mrs. Westwater
