Yellowjacket Highlights



Vex Robotics teams from East End Middle School won the top three places in statewide competition and participated in international competition.

Sheridan groups competing in FBLA, FCCLA, HOSA and Educators Rising all placed in the top 3 in Arkansas and were eligible for national competition.

SHS JAG students competed with students from across the nation at the National Career Association Conference and all seven SHS students placed in the top 10. Kyler Morrow won first place nationally in the Financial Literacy category.





Sheridan athletic teams qualified for the state tournament in a number of sports. SHS track and field athletes won a combined 11 state titles in various events in indoor and outdoor track.

Aaron Webb was named by the Arkansas Democrat-Gazette as the 2022-23 Boys Outstanding Track & Field Athlete of the Year.





Approximately 1,900 SSD students ride the bus daily






The District raised its bus driver pay to \$20-\$28 per hour in 2023.



Food & Beverage Revenue

Sheridan School District has established a fund for the remainder of the revenue from the original beverage contracts with Coke and Pepsi. The interest earned from the balance of this fund is expended each year for the Sheridan School Board Scholarships and the A.R. McKenzie Scholarships. The ending balance as of August 2023 is \$164,180.67.

The only revenue the district currently earns from competitive food and beverages comes from the commissions of items sold in vending machines at each campus. Principals utilize these funds to benefit students on their campuses. The total amount received in Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2023, was \$360.15.











OUR CURRICULUM

The Sheridan School District offers a rich curriculum based on the Arkansas state standards in addition to a variety of enrichment courses and extracurricular activities.

We continuously invest in research-based Professional Development for staff.

We have one of the leading Gifted & Talented/Advanced Placement programs among 6A school districts in Arkansas.

Our Career & Technical Education Program is among the best in the area and includes a partnership with the Saline County CTE Center and neighboring school districts.





GIFTED & TALENTED

The Sheridan School District has a robust Gifted and Talented Program, serving 207 officially identified GT students in grades 3-12. The program offers 19 AP courses, six of which are concurrent credit courses. There were 523 AP exams given in the spring of 2023.









ACT ASPIRE SCORES 2022-23


3rd grade proficiency scores




4th grade proficiency scores




5th grade proficiency scores




6th grade proficiency scores






