Meals served through these programs meet nutritional standards set forth by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

If your income is less than or equal to the following guidelines you are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. These guidelines are effective 1 July 2025 through 30 June 2026. You must submit a free and reduced-price meal benefit application by: completing the paper copy that is mailed home, by obtaining a paper copy in either school office or district office, or by accessing one through UCSD.net.

If you have children who are approved for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) formerly known as Food Stamps, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), they are automatically eligible to receive free meals by filing an application that includes their assistance number from one of those programs.

Direct Certification: Children receiving SNAP, TANF, or FDPIR benefits will be automatically certified as eligible for free meals wherever possible; if you receive a letter from the SNAP, TANF, or FDPIR agency listing your children as eligible under these programs, you need not apply. Students who are migrant, homeless, or runaways are automatically eligible and do not need to fill out an application. Contact Superintendent Kim Hanisch, 907-581-3151 or email khanisch@ucsd.net. Foster children receive free meals regardless of the income of the household with which they reside. Note: Medicaid and Denali Kid Care case numbers do not qualify for automatic eligibility.
