GEAR UP goals:


- Increase student expectations and readiness for education beyond high school

- GEAR UP begins no later than the seventh grade and serves students for six to seven vears

Maximized investment

• Every federal GEAR UP dollar must be matched by one non-grant dollar.

Partnership and collaboration

• GEAR UP brings together middle and high schools, colleges and universities, state agencies, and community organizations in pursuit of the same mission

Evaluation and improvement

Grants collect data annually and assess the impact of GEAR UP
