Transfer students are not calculated into the class rank unless they have been enrolled at BHS for a minimum of 2 years.

Ability Grouping: The Stratford Board of Education is in favor of weighted grading for honors, dual enrollment, and advanced placement courses. Honors, advanced placement, and dual enrollment courses are open to all students who pass any prerequisite courses listed in the program of studies.

Advanced Placement: Indicates exceptional ability. Students are prepared for the Advanced Placement examination and can earn college credit through the Advanced Placement Program and Dual Enrollment.

Honors Level: Indicates outstanding ability and achievement.
