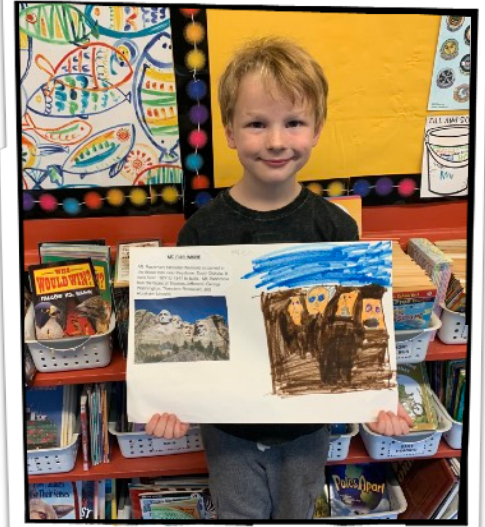
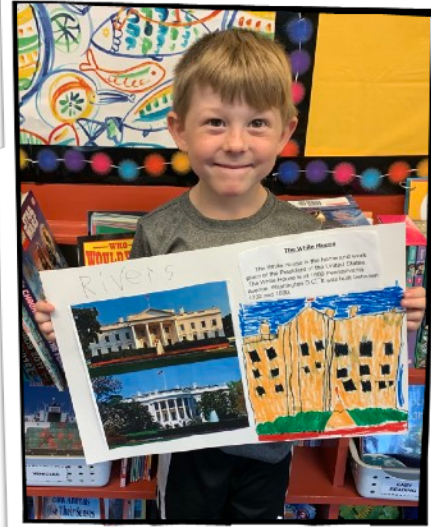


Ms. Tibbett's K/1 Classroom

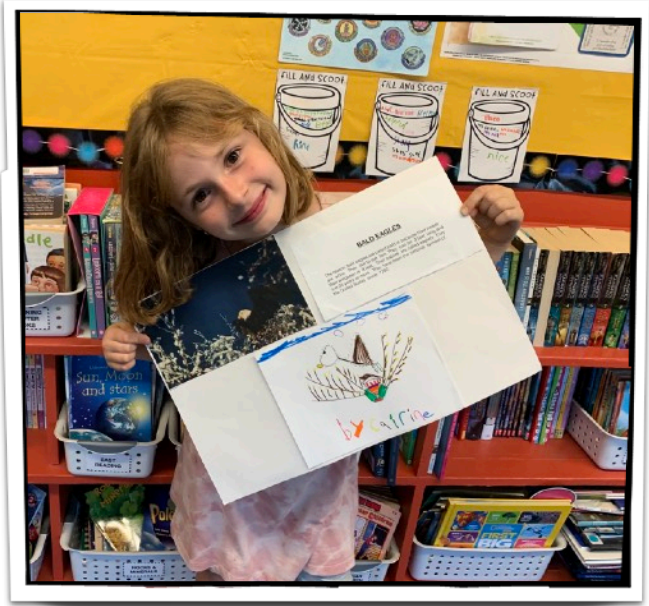
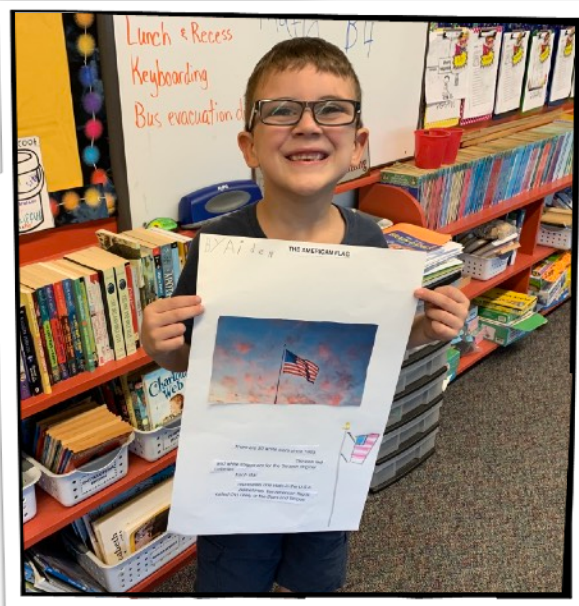


Ms. Clarke's 3/4 Classroom

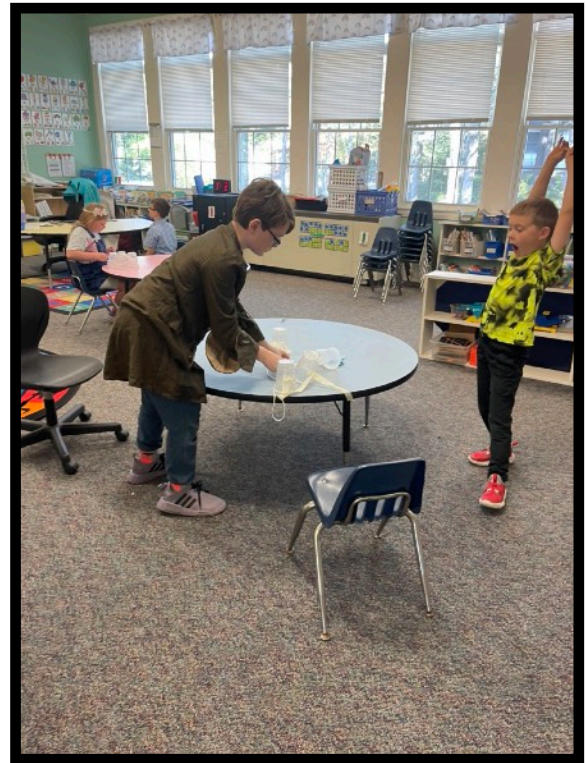


Mrs. Browne's 5/6 Classroom



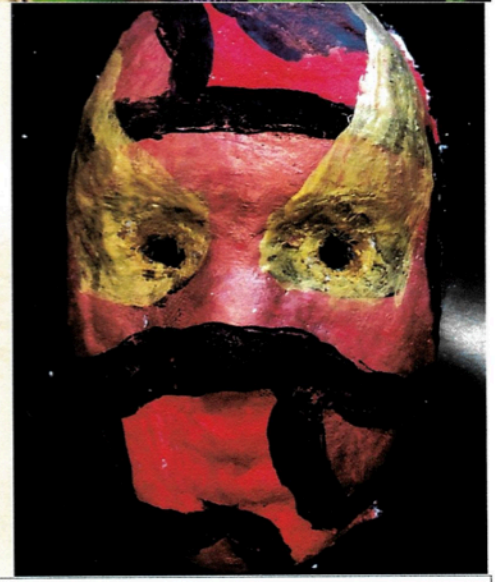
Mrs. Browne and Miss Tibbetts's classes started buddy reading this week. We loved the opportunity to read together!
