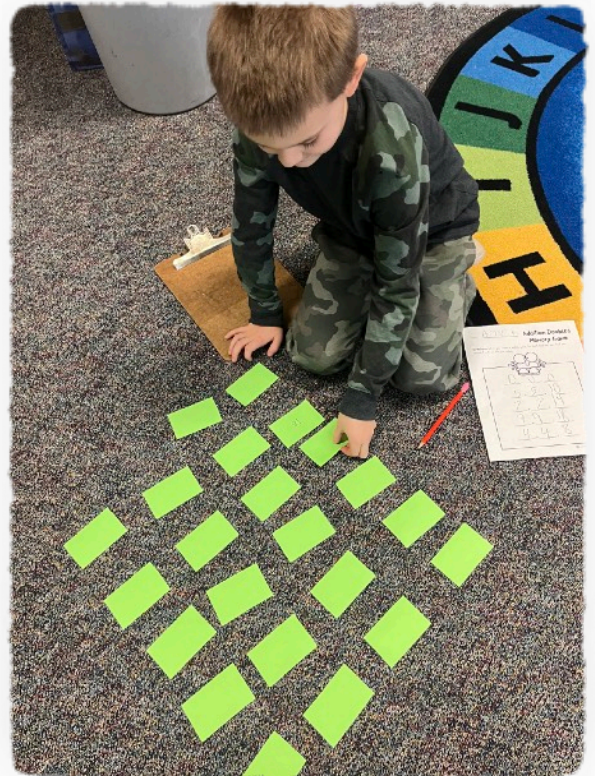
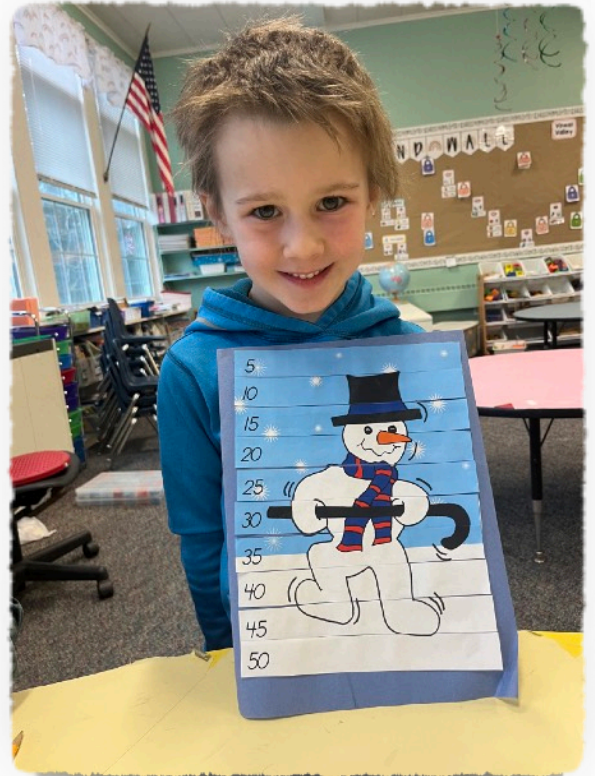
## **WINTER DRESS**

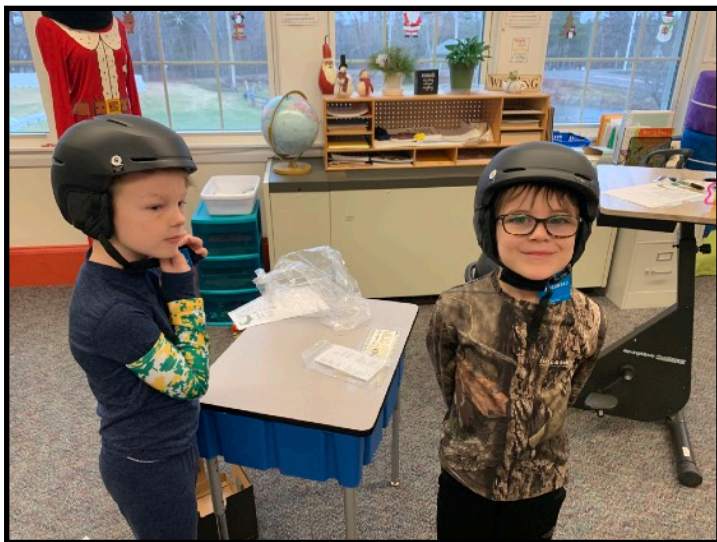


# Ms. Clarke's Grade 2 Classroom
