Ms. Clarke's Grade 2 Classroom


In science, second graders are learning about erosion, earth's surface, and landforms. Students in the pictures are shown creating a model of contrasting elevations, then demonstrating how rivers flow by marking the highest peaks, followed by spraying water on them. This experiment provided them with a visual of water flow and the erosion it can cause.

The second part of this lesson was to learn about what causes flash flooding and where in our country it is likely to occur.
