A QUICK GUIDE TO **ELEMENTARY GRADE CARD CHANGES**

Some changes are taking place in our reporting system and on our report cards that we want to ensure are clear to parents.

After the first quarter, we sent home updated report cards for students in grades K-6. These new report cards are designed to align with our district's updated curriculum and structured literacy approach, ensuring that our students receive a well-rounded

Our new report cards utilize a simple yet effective system to provide you with a clear understanding of your child's progress:

+ (Plus): Indicates that your child has met the standard in specif-

☐ **(Check):** Shows that your child is making progress toward the standard.

- (Minus): Suggests limited progress toward the standard.

These symbols are used to evaluate a wide range of structured literacy skills in both reading and writing. Additionally, spelling is now integrated into the reading grade, reinforcing the importance of letters, sounds and blending for accurate word recogni-

Starting in grades K-3, handwriting is included in the Fundations grade, ensuring that students develop essential motor skills for writing. We have also introduced comment boxes for teachers to communicate their children's individual strengths and needs, providing valuable insights into their learning journey. Further explanations will continue to accompany the elementary report cards to help you navigate the new system and better understand your child's progress.

DISTRICT UTILIZES \$554,000 GRANT TO ENHANCE SAFETY

Last fall, the East Holmes Local School District received a significant boost to our safety measures through the Ohio K-12 School Safety Grant Program. The district was awarded a grant of \$554,000, which has already substantially enhanced security across our eight schools.

The Ohio School Safety Grant program is an initiative aimed at enhancing the safety and security of K-12 schools across the state. With a total funding of over \$215 million distributed among 2,789 schools, this program provides financial assistance for physical security expenses. The grants can be used to support various safety measures, such as the installation of new security systems or the implementation of safety protocols.

We are proud to report that this investment in safety has already begun. Over the summer, we completed the installation of new PA systems and improved door access controls, two vital components in safeguarding our schools. We have also improved security by implementing security camera networks, window security film and adopting a district-wide GPS system for our buses.

By prioritizing the safety of students and staff, the Ohio School Safety Grant program plays a crucial role in fostering a conducive learning environment. It serves as a testament to the commitment of the state to creating safe educational spaces and offers valuable support to schools in their efforts to maintain a secure atmosphere for everyone involved.

The District is very grateful for this opportunity to strengthen our safety and security measures. We remain dedicated to creating a safe and nurturing environment for our students, staff and community members.




