Reminders

Parking Lot...Thank you for dropping off students in the marked zones and using our crosswalks. And, thank you for your continued support for our new dismissal process. SRP Protocol (Standard Response Protocol)

Our school has adopted The "I Love U Guys" Foundation Protocol. Standard Response Protocol (SRP). Students and staff will be training, practicing, and drilling the protocol.

Please take time to review the common language with your child on the following page. We will practice the following drills along with fire drills each month. We believe in practicing drills to keep our students and staff as safe as possible.

Yellow Flag Procedures

Occasionally you may see a 'yellow flag hanging on the flag pole to symbolize release' at the end of the day. This will happen if the weather conditions present a risk to your child. Typically this involves lightning within a ten mile radius of the school, but we have used this option for exceedingly strong winds/cold that posed a risk for our students.

We will be using the free app called Weatherbug to make this determination each day at 2:30 PM. If we see that a storm is moving through and/or lightning is currently within a ten mile radius of the school, or expected to be within 10 miles at the time of release, we will hang a "yellow" flag from the flagpole. Our staff will support our students by getting them to you in your car or allowing them to wait if they are "walkers." We will allow walkers to call their parents to let them know they need to be picked up.

We will also use the Weatherbug app to determine if we will be having a 'yellow flag morning'. This means that if the morning temperature at 7:40 AM is too cold (or if it's raining or snowy so heavily the students would be soaked), students will enter the building and wait in the gym for the bell to ring. You will not receive notification of this, but please know that we monitor temperatures each day. A temperature below 20 degrees at the end of the day does not prompt a yellow flag release.

Lastly, while we're talking about temperature and weather conditions, students stay inside for recess when the temperature is below 20 degrees or other severe weather conditions are present. Otherwise, all students go outside. Please dress your children for the weather.

Cell Phone Policy

Cell phones, smart watches, and other electronic devices are not to be used during the school day (from the time a student enters the school grounds until the 2:50 bell rings) without teacher or administrator permission. A student's cell phone should remain in his/her backpack turned off. If a student's cell phone, smart watch, or electronic device is used or heard by school staff in the building before/during the school day, the device will be confiscated until the end of the school day. If repeated incidents occur, a parent will be required to retrieve the device from school administration. Students are highly encouraged NOT to bring electronic devices to school in case of theft. The school is not responsible for lost or stolen personal belongings; nor will time be given to the investigation of lost or stolen items.

Cheyenne Mountain School District Child Find

Child Find is the identification, assessment, and determination of eligibility for services for children/students who may have a disability. Child Find services are available from birth through age 21. The Resource Exchange is responsible for Child Find evaluations for children, from birth to 3 years of age. Cheyenne Mountain School District provides Child Find evaluations for families who reside in the school district and are concerned with their child's development, ages 3 through 21 years of age.

Child Find (birth to 3)

If you are concerned about your infant/toddler's development, please contact The Resource Exchange (TRE) Early Childhood Services Team at (719) 577-9190.

Child Find (3-5/preschool age)

If you have concerns regarding your preschooler, please call Matthew Gordon, Preschool Coordinator/Assistant Director of Special Education at (719) 475-6140.

Child Find (ages 5 to 21)

If you are concerned about your school-age child's development, please contact your school administrator to determine whether a Child Find is necessary for addressing your concerns.
