

HOW TO APPLY

1. Make an appointment to visit the HSLC at CCC
2. Pick up an application from your HS counselor or download one from our website
3. Begin making the changes necessary to be a good candidate for acceptance to the HSLC (attend scheduled classes and be respectful to teachers and peers)
4. Check for the application deadlines in October, February and June
5. Successful applicants will be scheduled for an interview with a HSLC panel

MISSION

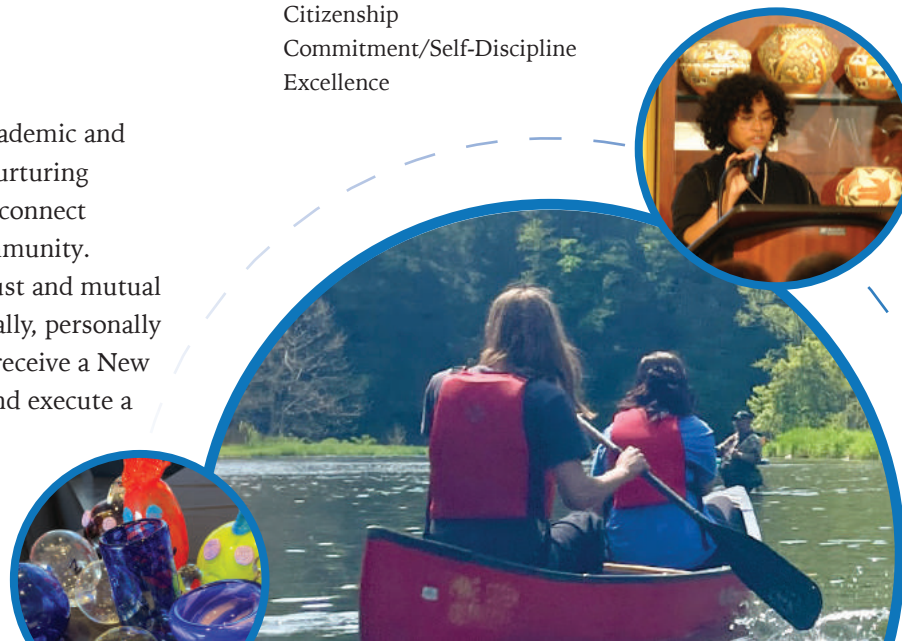

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What is the schedule like at the HSLC?

The HSLC operates on an 11-month, three trimester schedule (August-June)
Classes are held on the CCC campus from 2:00pm-5:00pm
Students will have two extended classes each day of the required Science, ELA, Math, Social Studies, and P.E.

Q: How do students receive their elective credit?

HSLC students receive their elective credits through a combination of a successful employment or internship experience (12-15 hours per week) and through art-based experiences with our community partners; The Rockwell Museum, CMOG Studio and 171 Cedar Arts Center.

Q: What about transportation and lunches?

Transportation to CCC is provided by the CPP School District. Lunches are delivered and available upon request.

Q: What are the classes like? How will I be assessed?

HSLC students are actively involved in their learning, often showing, explaining and demonstrating what they have learned. Academic standards are based on striving for excellence and quality work rather than on grades. To conclude each trimester, students will give a "Presentation of Learning" for peers, staff, families and guests that will reflect on their personal and academic growth and to set goals and make plans for the future. Students are active participants in their education and success. Public speaking is nurtured and expected.

Q: Can I take college classes at CCC?

Yes. During your final year at the HSLC you may also be eligible to take CCC courses.
