

Bernalillo Elementary strives to provide quality bilingual education in the Dual Language (English and Spanish) and our Keres Heritage Programs. The BES Multilingual Language program serves 174 students in fourth through sixth grades. The Keres Heritage program now serves Santa Ana and San Felipe pueblos.

The recognition is a rigorous selection based on academic proficiency data in both languages and qualitative measures such as cultural experiences and family engagement opportunities. We are so proud of our teachers and students being recognized. Congratulations! iFelicidades!


