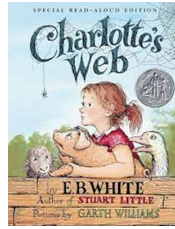
Algodones Elementary

Cochiti Elementary-Middle School

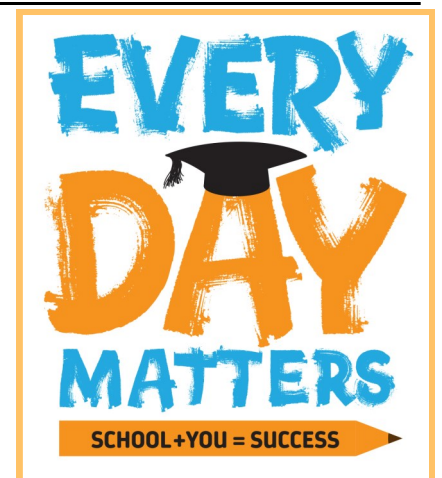

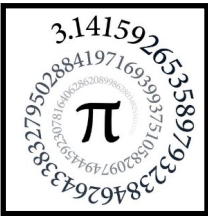


Spartan Learning Academy

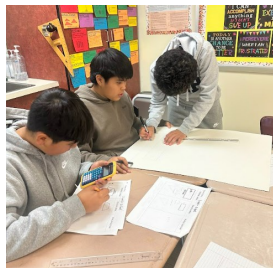
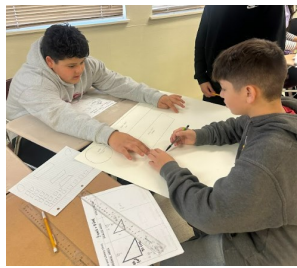
Pi Day at SLA

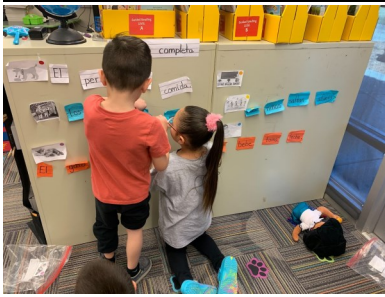
NEW MEXICO ENTREPRENEURS: EXPLORING PERCENTAGE

The culmination of their efforts resulted in the creation of vibrant marketing posters showcasing their business names, logos, and product images, along with detailed computations of selling prices post-markup or discount. This project not only fosters entrepreneurial skills but also reinforces mathematical concepts in a real-world context.

Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling (LETRS) - In her dual language Kindergarten class, Mrs. Lovato applies techniques acquired from LETRS to facilitate engaging activities for students, aimed at enhancing their language skills through decoding and constructing sentences using pictures and fragmented sentences. While the original activity was conducted in English, Mrs. Lovato has adeptly transformed it into a Dual Language exercise, maintaining the core concepts intact. The activity is as follows:

Introduction:

- Present the picture to the students and encourage them to observe it closely. Discuss the various elements in the picture, encouraging vocabulary expansion and critical thinking.

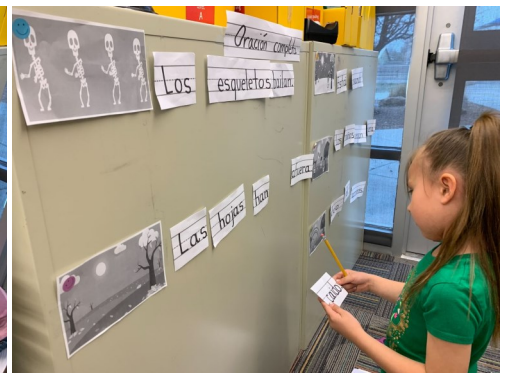
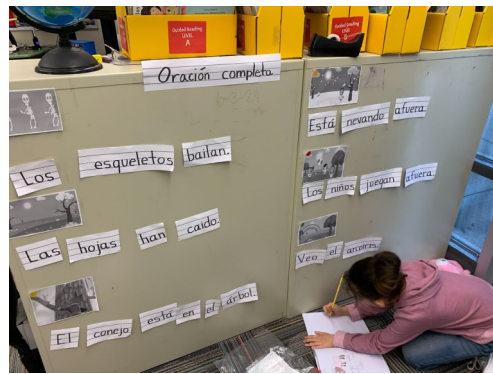
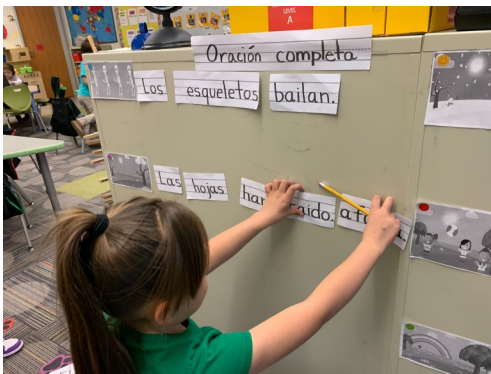
Word Recognition:

- Distribute the disassembled sentences to the students.
- Encourage students to use decoding skills to figure out the words, emphasizing phonemic awareness and letter-sound correspondence.

Sentence Construction:

- Provide guidance on sentence structure, grammar rules, and punctuation as needed.
- Encourage creativity and critical thinking by asking students to create descriptive and coherent sentences that match the details in the picture.

Through participation in this activity, students not only hone their decoding abilities but also cultivate proficiency in constructing coherent sentences and narratives. This interactive method encourages active engagement, enhancing comprehension and language skills in a fun and dynamic manner, in line with the principles of LETRS.

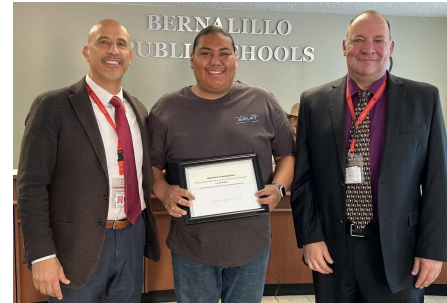

Honoring an Alumnus, Dedicated Teacher & Coach



In this edition of the Alumni Corner, we proudly honor and recognize Coach Clarence Griego for his remarkable life of service and dedication to the students and communities within the Bernalillo Public Schools district.

Coach Clarence Griego graduated from Bernalillo High School in 1965. Following his graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps and is a Vietnam Veteran. In 1966, Coach Clarence Griego married his high school sweetheart, Sandra Navarro. Together, they built a beautiful family, raising two daughters and later experiencing the joy of welcoming three grandchildren into their lives. Their family continues to grow, with the exciting news of one great-grandchild on the way, adding another generation to their legacy of love and togetherness.

Upon returning from Vietnam, Coach Griego attend TV-I (now CNM) where he obtained certifications as an electrician and welder. He later continued his education at the University of New Mexico and earning a Bachelor of Science in Education with a focus in Biology and Physical Education. Here is a more detailed summary of Coach Clarence Griego's career timeline:

- **1974:** Coach Griego began his teaching career at Bernalillo High School (BHS), where he taught Biology and Physical Education.
- **1982:** He furthered his education by earning a Master of Science degree in Education Administration.
- **1983-1994:** With his advanced degree and experience, Coach Griego assumed the role of BHS Athletic Director and became the boys' head basketball coach.
- **1994-2009:** He retired from coaching and became THE DISTRICT'S Director of Safety and Security.
- **August 31, 2009:** After years of dedicated service to Bernalillo Public Schools (BPS), Coach Griego retired.
- **December 2012 to May 25, 2018:** Despite retiring, Coach Griego's passion for teaching and coaching led him back to the classroom. He was asked to come out of retirement to teach Physical Education at Cochiti Elementary-Middle School and Placitas Elementary, where he continued to positively impact students' lives until May 25, 2018.

Coach Clarence Griego's career trajectory exemplifies his unwavering commitment to education, athletics, and the betterment of his community.

On March 28, 2024, THE DISTRICT came together in a joyous celebration to honor Coach Clarence Griego, a stalwart figure whose dedication and passion have left an indelible mark on BPS students and the wider community. With forty years of unwavering commitment to Bernalillo Public Schools, Coach Griego's journey from a dedicated educator to the esteemed role of Athletic Director is a testament to his profound impact.

(MUST BE 3 ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 30, 2024)**

Lottery Process

The QR Code above will take you to the Lottery application. Submitting the application does NOT guarantee enrollment for your child and does NOT replace registration.

- When lottery window is closed students will be placed into one of our Lottery Drawing rounds (see side panels for criteria information)
- All applicants will get a phone call before June 8th informing families of application status
- Students who do not get pulled in the Lottery Drawing process will automatically be placed on a waitlist
- All applications will be time stamped and students will be placed on the waitlist according to submission date and time, with Bernalillo District Residents being ordered before non-Bernalillo District Residents.
- Two (2) documents, proving residency in the Bernalillo Public Schools District, can be brought to La Escuelita Pre-School during the lottery window (April 8th -April 29th), Monday-Friday between the hours of 8:30am-3:30pm.
- Acceptable documents include current rent or lease agreement, current utility bill (water, gas, electric), or current mortgage statement.
- Documents must have parent name listed on document.
- Also, please bring your child's original birth certificate.

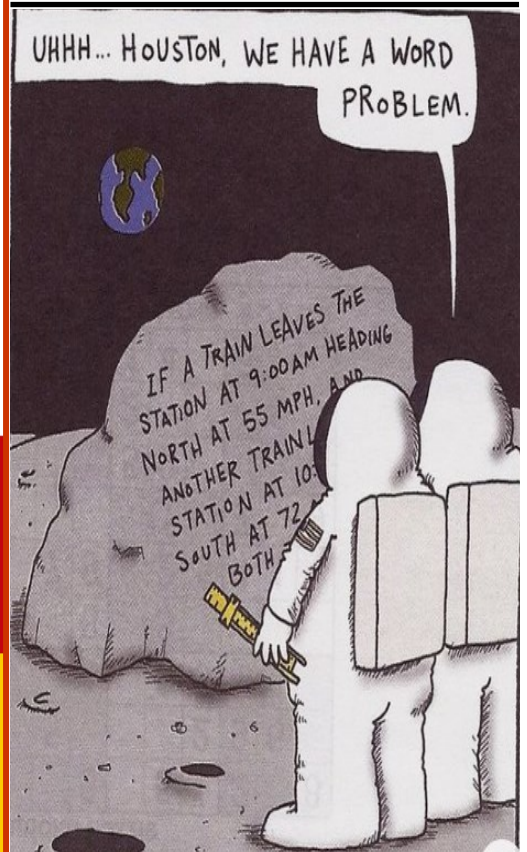
