Agreement between Merced Community College District and Los Banos Unified School District for California Adult Education Program (CAEP) July 01, 2023 through June 30, 2024

The purpose of this Agreement is to establish the fiscal administration and distribution of funds for the California Adult Education Program's (CAEP) documents submitted pursuant to an award by the California Department of Education and California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO).

RECITALS

Whereas The Merced Community College District (MCCD) is the Fiscal Agent and Administrator for the regional Gateway Adult Education Network (GAEN) project partners for the 2023 – 2024 CAEP Award; and,

Whereas MCCD and each participating GAEN partner institution (hereafter referred to as AGENCY) are required to enter into an agreement as a condition for the fiscal administration and distribution of funds from the Program;

Therefore, MCCD and AGENCY agree as follows:

- The expenditure of these funds shall be in compliance with all CCCCO required planning and reporting documents as specified, including – AEP Program Guidance and Allowable Usage, Consortium Fiscal Administration Declaration (CFAD), Merced GAEN Consortium CAEP Three Year Plan, Three Year Plan Update, Annual Plan (available at the California Community Colleges' NOVA System) and the CCCCO Budget and Accounting Manual (BAM).
- 2. MCCD, as Fiscal Agent to the GAEN Consortium for the CAEP, agrees to provide apportion funds to each member of the consortium pursuant to the consortium's adult education plan within 45 days of receiving funds appropriated for the program.
- MCCD agrees to provide the following services as Fiscal Administrator to the GAEN Consortium for the CAEP
 - Develop consortium and member fiscal budget templates based on CAEP approved plan.
 - Coordinate fiscal meetings with the assistance of the CAEP Program Coordinator.
 - Certify the accounting and budget data with the CCCCO on behalf of the consortium.
 - Maintain consortium approved annual budgets and budget transfers.
 - · Coordinate the collection of financial data for reporting.
 - Provide Quarterly Financial Status Report to the GAEN Board.
 - Provide fiscal updates as scheduled to GAEN Board.
 - Attend regularly scheduled GAEN Board meetings.
 - Periodically meet with peer agencies to review budget information.
 - Perform periodic peer audits to assure compliance with appropriate state and accounting requirements.
 - Contract and coordinate audit services for the consortium as needed.
- 4. The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 and shall include additional time extensions provided and/or approved by the CCCCO.

PROGRAM

By this Agreement, Agency agrees that all services provided under this agreement shall comply with the AEP Program Guidance and Allowable Usage, the CAEP Consortium Fiscal Administration Declarations (CFAD) (Attachment A), and any subsequently agreed upon modifications. The terms and conditions and reporting requirements of the CCCCO include those currently specified in Merced GAEN Consortium CAEP Three Year Plan, Three Year Plan Update, Annual Plan (available at the California Community Colleges' NOVA System) and the CCCCO Budget and Accounting Manual (BAM) available at the Chancellor's Office website.

ASSURANCES

- 1. Participant agencies will report and provide supporting documentation for all expenses, which may include purchase orders, general ledger printouts, time and effort records and/or other payroll records, as specified by MCCD in order to maintain compliance with CCCCO requirements, quarterly by the 15th day of the following month. Further, each partner shall provide a final reconciliation of expenditures for each reporting period, no later than 15 days prior to the Chancellor's Office reporting deadlines. At the discretion of the GAEN Consortium Board or Project Coordinator, such documentation may also include narrative descriptions of how the expenditures are in compliance with the annual and three year plans of the GAEN Consortium, or other documentation related to the Agency's scope of work. Agency will submit the expenditure report and all supporting documentation to MCCD at the time and in the manner specified, or later modified, by MCCD.
- 2. The expenditure of these funds shall be in compliance with all CCCCO required planning and reporting documents as specified, including- AEP Program Guidance and Allowable Usage, Consortium Fiscal Administration Declaration, Merced GAEN Consortium CAEP Three Year Plan, Three Year Plan Update, Annual Plan (available at the California Community Colleges' NOVA System) and the CCCCO Budget Allocation Manual (BAM) available at the Chancellor's Office website.
- 3. The agencies will assure and maintain complete and accurate accounting records and reporting in compliance with all required and established reporting and accounting rules and guidelines.
- 4. Ensure, where required, that all CCCCO procurement processes and requirements are followed.
- Provide annual inventory of capitalized equipment purchased with program funds upon request from MCCD.
- 6. Requests for budget modifications will be submitted to the Fiscal Administrator for validation then provided to the Project Coordinator and approved by the GAEN Governing Board according to Board agreements, with final approval by CCCCO. In the case that the California Community College Chancellors Office determines that any expenditures are disallowed, Agency will accept full liability.
- 7. No construction cost shall be reimbursed unless prior approval is obtained from the CCCO. It is the responsibility of the Agency to obtain such approval in writing. Expenditures for construction costs incurred prior to obtaining CCCOO approval shall be at Agency's own risk.
- 8. Records and Audit: In accordance with the CAEP, the agency agrees to provide fiscal records to the Fiscal Administrator on a pre-determined basis. Both Fiscal Administrator and the agencies shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to the services rendered and the costs incurred under this agreement.
- 9. Provide quarterly financial reports to Fiscal Administrator according to approved schedule.

PAYMENT TERMS AND SCHEDULE

- 1. To implement the Agreement, MCCD will provide payment to AGENCY, the amount defined as per the Consortium Fiscal Administration Declaration of the GAEN Consortium Board.
- 2. Payments shall be distributed according to the following schedule or as funds are disbursed by the State:
 - a. July 2023 through June 2024: 1 payment each month, equaling 1/12 of the member's total allocation from received and available apportionment.
- 3. The Fiscal Administrator shall receive in its allocation and hold separate from its regular adult education program, and from other funds, the amount up to 5% of the CAEP consortium budget for the ongoing management and maintenance of the fiscal reports and records for the GAEN Consortium.
- 4. The funds shall be received in line with all other consortia disbursements and paid to the agencies within 45 days of receipt of allocation.
- 5. Modifications
 - a. Any changes to this MOU must be agreed to in writing by both parties. Should changes in legislation or State funding occur that necessitate revision of this MOU, the GAEN membership and MCCD shall meet to revise accordingly.
 - b. All funding commitments contained herein are contingent on continued funding by the State of California. Should the State modify its funding commitment, this MOU shall be revised accordingly.

INDEMNIFICATIONS AND INSURANCE

- 1. The AGENCY shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless MCCD and its officers, officials, employees and volunteers from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses, costs (including without limitation costs and fees of litigation) arising out of the performance of the work described herein, caused in whole or in part by any negligent act or omission of Agency its employees, agents, subcontractors, independent contractors, consultants, other representatives, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, except where caused by the active negligence, sole negligence, or willful misconduct of District.
- 2. The AGENCY shall secure and maintain at all times during the Term, at their respective sole expense, commercial general liability or a comparable program of self-insurance at a minimum of One million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in aggregate for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage; automotive liability insurance at a minimum of One million dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident for bodily injury. The policies shall be endorsed to name Merced Community College District, its trustees, officers, agents, employees, and volunteers as additional insured. Statutory Workers' Compensation coverage, including employers' liability limits of One million dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident if and as required by the State of California is required of employers. Such polices will provide for notification at least thirty (30) days in advance of a material modification or cancellation of coverage. Insurance carries of the policies required above shall maintain during the contract term, a Best Key Rating of A: VII or higher.

MUTUAL TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this Agreement upon 45 days' written notice to the other.

In response to your request, we propose to provide construction inspection and testing services for the Los Banos Elementary School - Parking Lot Improvements Project located in Los Banos, CA.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

We understand that the project will consist of scope is to removal and replacement of an existing asphalt parking lot with related site improvements. Based on our review of plans by Blair, Church & Flynn Consulting Engineers dated 6/12/2023, we understand that construction inspection and testing services will be required during onsite earthwork, storm drain trench backfilling, and asphalt pavement scopes of work. RMA GeoScience has prepared this proposal to outline the scope of work required to provide services in accordance with the project requirements.

SCOPE OF WORK

Description of the material testing and inspection tasks required and an estimate of the costs associated with our work are detailed herein.

Compaction Testing of Subgrade and Aggregate Base Rock (AB)

This of service will consist of materials testing included in the plans of the subgrade in the construction of new parking lot and related site improvements. These services will include in place density testing of subgrade soils using the nuclear gauge. Laboratory testing will be performed to determine the laboratory test maximum density of the soils in accordance with ASTM 1557. A written report summarizing the results of all tests performed will be prepared upon completion of the work.

Observation and Testing of Storm Drain Trench Backfill

This of service will consist of materials testing of subgrade soils and aggregate base included in the plans for the backfilling of the storm drain replacement. These services will include in place density testing of subgrade soils using the nuclear gauge. Laboratory testing will be performed to determine the laboratory test maximum density of the soils in accordance with ASTM 1557. A written report summarizing the results of all tests performed will be prepared upon completion of the work.



Compaction Testing for Asphalt Concrete Pavements

This scope of service will consist of materials testing of asphaltic concrete used in the construction of the roadway pavement lab testing. These services will include monitoring the temperature and rolling procedure and the determination of the in place density testing of asphalt concrete using the nuclear gauge ASTM 1557 method. A written report summarizing the results of all tests performed will be prepared upon completion of the work.

Project Administration, Engineering Oversight, and Reporting

This scope of work will include all administrative, project management, engineering oversight, and reporting. This may include, but is not limited to, ensuring RMA GeoScience has all necessary documents and information needed to complete the requested work, reviewing plans and specifications, dispatching services, reviewing both lab and daily reports, distribution, and invoicing time.

TERMS

We propose to perform the previously described services on an hourly or test rate basis in accordance to the attached fee schedule. Our estimate is based on information given to RMA GeoScience by Blair, Church & Flynn and the following assumed construction durations. - When personnel are required to work in excess of 5 hours without an uninterrupted meal period of 30 minutes, due to project constraints, ¼ hour will be charged at double time rates in addition to any applicable hours worked.
- Rates are valid through December 30, 2023. Rates for personnel will increase by 3% per year on July 1st of each subsequent year.
- · Certified Payroll Reports will be prepared upon request. There will be a \$95.00 charge for each certified payroll report.
- · Outside services will be billed at cost plus 25% unless billed directly to and paid for by Client.
- Requests made by client for management attendance at meetings at the project site will be charged at standard rate.
- Our budget excludes import acceptance lab testing and/or DTSC environmental lab testing or related sampling.
- Our budget excludes any concrete testing and inspections per conversation Ben Alvarez (PM) with Blair, Church & Flynn.

These estimated hours will be revisited and then tied into the GC driven schedule. There is no DSA 103 form related to this project.
- The District and GC are to provide a full set of approved plans for our records and inspections, and all related aggregate base, import material, HMA paving, concrete, and structural steel submittals for our review, records, and inspections.

OVERTIME CHARGES

- Work performed in excess of 8 hours per day and / or up to eight (8) hours on Saturdays will be billed at 1.5 times the unit rate.
- Work performed on Sunday, recognized holidays, or in excess of eight (8) hours on Saturdays will be billed at 2.0 times the unit
 rate.
- A 20% surcharge will be applied for laboratory tests performed on a "Rush Basis" or on a Saturday or Sunday.

PER DIEM AND TRAVEL CHARGES

- A \$145,00 charge per day will be applied when our personnel are required to stay overnight at remote locations.
- Time will be billed at the unit rate while traveling to a remote location or if a location requires an overnight stay.
- Mileage for travel outside a 50 mile radius from either the project site or the nearest RMA facility, whichever is closest, will be charged at a rate of \$0.62 per mile.

NIGHT WORK

• A \$12.00 per hour surcharge will be added to all personnel rates for work performed during night shifts.

It is recommended the Board approve the attached contract with Momentum for Health to provide Mental Health First Aid training.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Mental Health First Aid Training provides individuals with the strategies needed to identify and aid students experiencing mental health needs. The training is an integral part of both the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP), as well as the District's partnership with the Student Behavioral Health Incentive Program (SBHIP). The District intends to provide the training to staff and parents.

HOW DOES THIS ACTIVITY SUPPORT BOARD GOALS?

LCAP Goal 2: LBUSD will provide a social emotional framework that includes universal screening of all students, multiple tiers of support services, and an integrated data collection and assessment system to inform decisions at each tier of support.

LCAP Goal 4: LBUSD will maintain safe and welcoming facilities, a well trained educational staff, access to instructional materials and programs for all students, and opportunities for parents to be involved in their student's education.

Board Goal 3: Create and sustain inspirational learning environments that are safe, drug-free, and conducive to learning by providing: access to local resources in order to develop responsible citizens who participate in and care for their community.

ALTERNATIVES/IDENTIFIED OPPOSITION:

SPECIFIC FINANCIAL IMPACT (Include Impact on School District Facilities):

The contract outlines a cost of \$350 per participant. The District expects to train between 30-60 staff/parents this academic school year at a cost of approximately \$10,500-\$21,000. The cost associated with the contract will be funded through the SBHIP grant.

SERVICE AGREEMENT

This service agreement ("Agreement") is effective as of July 1, 2023 ("Effective Date"), by and between Momentum for Health, a non-profit organization located in Santa Clara County, California ("Momentum") and Los Banos Unified School District, a public entity located in Merced County, California ("Client"). Momentum and Client may be referred to herein singularly as a "Party" or collectively as "Parties."

WHEREAS Momentum is qualified to provide the services listed under Section 1 below, and

WHEREAS Client desires to hire Momentum to provide such services to or on behalf of Client,

THE PARTIES DO THEREFORE AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Services to be Provided by Momentum. Momentum agrees to provide the following services ("Services") to or on behalf of Client:
 - a. Provide youth mental health first aid training (the "Program") to individuals referred by Client using the curriculum developed and materials provided by The National Council for Mental Wellbeing.
 - b. Coordinate with Client to schedule dates, times, and places for trainings. Trainings may be conducted in person or over video conference (Zoom, Teams, etc.).
 - c. Each training will be for 5 to 60 individuals. Trainings will be scheduled as often as reasonable to meet demand and enrollment. In the event enrollment for any individual training does not reach 5 individuals 3 business days prior to the training, Momentum may, at its discretion, reschedule that training for a later date.
 - d. Provide Client with all materials in advance of training to allow individuals participating in the Program to complete necessary materials prior to the scheduled training.
- 2. Responsibilities of Client. Client will be responsible to:
 - a. Provide Momentum with names and contact information of individuals who will be participating in the Program no less than three (3) days prior to the scheduled training.
 - b. Forward provided materials to all individuals participating in trainings sufficiently in advance of training to ensure that individuals may complete pre-work prior to training.

3. Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be from the Effective Date through August 30, 2023 ("Term"). Either Party may terminate this Agreement for any reason whatsoever upon 30 days'

written notice to the other Party.

4. Consideration.

- a. In consideration of the Services provided under Section 1 of this Agreement, Client agrees to pay Momentum three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350) per individual enrolled in the Program.
- b. Momentum will invoice Client upon completion of each training.
- 5. Expenses. The cost of all training materials and platforms is included in the consideration and Momentum shall not charge Client any additional amounts for these materials. Client agrees to reimburse Momentum for all other reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the provision of the Services. All such expenses must be approved in advance by Client.

6. Confidentiality.

- a. "Confidential Information" refers to any data or information relating to any Party, whether business or persona, which would reasonably be considered to be private or proprietary to that Party and that is not generally known.
- b. The Parties agree that they will not disclose, divulge, reveal, report or use for any purpose-except as required by law-any Confidential Information which either Party obtains in the course of the performance of this Agreement. This obligation shall survive the termination of this Agreement or the severance of any portion of this Agreement.

7. Intellectual Property.

- a. "Intellectual Property" shall mean all trade secrets, trademarks, service marks, moral rights, goodwill, relevant registrations and applications, patents, copyrights, designs, trade names, and related materials.
- b. All Intellectual Property developed by Momentum in connection with the performance of this Agreement shall be the sole property of Momentum.
- c. Each Party grants the other Party a world-wide, non-exclusive license to use the trade names and marks of the other Party to the extent necessary for the provision of the Services in any media and manner whatsoever. This license shall expire upon the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- 8. Sub-Contractors. In its sole discretion, Momentum shall have the right to engage a third-party sub-contractor to perform any or all of the Services hereunder. Momentum shall be responsible for the compensation of such sub-contractors and shall ensure that the services provided by the

sub-contractor shall be of the same type and quality as if provided by Momentum directly. Client shall not engage any third-parties to perform the Services covered by this Agreement or take any action to interfere with Momentum in its provision of the Services.

- 9. Relationship of the Parties. The Parties acknowledge and agree that Momentum's relationship to the Client hereunder is that of an independent contractor and that nothing in this Agreement does or shall be deemed to create a partnership, joint venture, employer/employee relationship or any other relationship other than that of independent contractor.
- 10. No Exclusivity. The Parties acknowledge and agree that nothing in this Agreement shall prevent Momentum from providing services identical or similar to the Services to any other party anywhere in the world at any time and that this Agreement does not create an obligation on the part of Momentum to provide such services exclusively to Client.
- 11. Notices. All notices, requests, demand, or other communications required or permitted by the terms of this Agreement will be given in writing (email will suffice) and delivered to the Parties at the following addresses:

- 12. Indemnification. Except to the extent paid in settlement from any applicable insurance policies, and to the extent permitted by applicable law, each Party agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the other Party and its respective affiliates, officers, agents, employees, and permitted successors and assigns against any and all claims, losses, damages, liabilities, penalties, punitive damages, expenses, reasonable legal fees and costs of any kind or amount whatsoever, which result from or arise out of any act or omission of the indemnifying party, its respective affiliates, officers, agents, employees, and permitted successors and assigns that occurs in connection with this Agreement. This indemnification will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- 13. Modification. Any amendment or modification of this Agreement or additional obligation assumed by either Party in connection with this Agreement will only be binding if evidenced in writing signed by each Party.
- 14. Assignment. With the exception of the provisions of Section 7 above, neither Party will voluntarily or by operation of law assign or otherwise transfer its obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of the other Party.

- 15. Governing Law and Venue. This Agreement will be governed by the laws of the State of California and any action to enforce this Agreement shall be brought in the Superior Court of Santa Clara County.
- 16. Entire Agreement. This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement of the Parties on the subject matter herein and shall supersede all other agreements of the Parties on the same subject matter, whether written or oral or otherwise.
- 17. Severability. In the event that any of the provisions of this Agreement are held to be invalid or unenforceable in whole or in part, all other provisions will nevertheless continue to be valid and enforceable with the invalid or unenforceable parts severed from the remainder of this Agreement.
- 18. Waiver. The waiver by either Party of any breach, default, delay, or omission of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver by that Party of any other provisions of the Agreement or of any subsequent breach of the same or other provisions of this Agreement.
