First and Only High School Principal 1954-1969



During segregation, Carver-Hill School was the only school in Okaloosa County where black high school students could be educated. The last graduating class was the class of 1965-1966. It became 1st-9th grades and later a Kindergarten Center in 1970. The Carver-Hill School closed due to integration. As a result, the Carver-Hill Memorial and Historical Society was incorporated on August 18, 1969 under the leadership of Mrs. Caroline J. Allen (Founder) to preserve the history and legacy of the school. After much community hard work, the Carver-Hill Museum opened in May 1975. The Carver-Hill Museum in Okaloosa County is the only museum that emphasizes Black History. The museum's objective is to inspire hope and pride in the lives of all African Americans.

Under the leadership of past President David Wheeler, the society presented its first scholarship in 2018. Our scholarship is named after the first and only principal of Carver-Hill High School, 1954-1969, Marcus G. Davis, Sr.

- 1. To be eligible applicants must meet the following criteria:
 - A high school senior
 - A resident of Okaloosa County
 - Maintain a 2.0 4.0 GPA (upon graduation)
 - Provide proof of acceptance into a college program prior to funds being disbursed
 - Submit an essay between 250-300 words telling of one person in the community who inspired you to continue your education. Also, include how you plan to give back to the community upon graduating from college.
 - Provide two letters of recommendations i.e. one from your high school and one from the community in which you live.
 - Submit completed application, including reference letters and an official transcript postmarked no later than April 12, 2024
