Spanning 165 square miles, in the North Central part of Washington County and Center Township of Morgan County, Ohio, Fort Frye Local School District serves the educational needs of the villages of Beverly, Lowell, Lower Salem, and the surrounding rural areas. This geographical area is recognized as a part of Appalachia; many of our students are first generation college attendees. The impact of the continuing global economic downturn is evidenced by the district free and reduced percentage of 53%. Industry, agriculture, construction, and tourism comprise the economic base. Despite the economic struggles the community faces, our students attained 92.3% attendance district wide and a graduation rate of 99%. Starting with the school year 2021-2022, the Fort Frye Middle School was created for grades 6-8 and Fort Frye High School is a separate IRN for only grades 9-12.
