## CollegeBoard Scholarships (11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> Grade)

### Deadline: Specific Deadlines to Meet through Junior and Senior Year

Amounts range from \$500-\$40,000 for each step completed and can be used toward a 2- or 4-year institution. Ways to earn entries in monthly drawings by completing steps toward college: Start a Career List, Build a College List, Practice for the SAT, Explore Scholarships, Strengthen Your College List, Complete the FAFSA, and Apply to College. BigFuture rewards you for doing what you already are doing: planning for life after high school. With no essay, minimum GPA, test score, or citizenship requirements, BigFuture makes it easy to enter drawings (yes, plural!) each month. Simply complete unlocked steps on your dashboard, and you'll be automatically entered to win. ## USC Upstate Promise Scholars

### Deadline: By Admissions Application Deadline

Amount: The amount will vary based on how much financial aid the student receives. To be eligible, **seniors** must be accepted to USC-Upstate, complete a FAFSA, and be eligible for Life or Palmetto Fellows Scholarship. Only 100 students will be selected from the applicant pool to receive this award. The scholarship will fill in any gap between the student's aid and the full cost of tuition so the students will not pay any tuition costs. The scholarship can be renewed for three additional years if the student remains eligible for their state scholarships.

## University of South Carolina Alumni Scholarships

### Deadline: November 15th

Amount: \$8,000 x 4 years. This scholarship program is highly competitive; there are a limited number of these scholarships awarded. This award is exclusive to high school **seniors** graduating and entering USC in the Fall. To be considered for the Alumni Scholarship, you must apply for admission to the South Carolina Honors College and complete an application for general admission. Awardees must attend the Columbia campus of the University of South Carolina. Maintain a 3.0 GPA & be enrolled full-time and the scholarship will automatically renew.

## SC Teaching Fellows

**Deadline: December 1<sup>st</sup> (Opens October 1<sup>st</sup>)**

Amount \$6,000. **Senior** students must major in teaching, must agree to teach in SC public schools one year for each year the scholarship is received, and attend one of these Teaching Fellows institutions: Anderson Univ., Charleston Southern, Clemson Univ., College of Charleston, Coastal Carolina, Francis Marion Univ., Lander Univ., USC-Aiken, USC-Columbia, USC-Upstate, Winthrop Univ. Notify the counselor, Donna Phillips at [donna.phillips@cherokee1.org](mailto:donna.phillips@cherokee1.org), once you have completed your application online and she will review your application. A completed application includes: answer all mandatory questions, high school transcript, ACT/SAT, and two references.

Must excel academically and show exceptional leadership potential, participate in community service activities, and demonstrate financial need.

Amount: Up to \$55,000 per year. **The Navy ROTC \$180,000 Scholarship Program****Deadline: December 31<sup>st</sup>**

Amount: Tuition and other financial benefits worth up to \$180,000 for 4 yrs. Be a high school **senior** & U.S. Citizen 17-23 years of age by September 1<sup>st</sup> of the year starting college. Test Scores Required (ACT: Math 21 & English 22; SAT: Math 540 & Critical Reading 550). Have no criminal record, be physically/medically qualified by Navy standards, and be admitted to an approved NROTC college or university.

For students, grades 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>, to help develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation of the Constitution of the United States.

**USDA 1890 National Scholars Program for 1890 Historically Black Land-Grant Universities****Deadline: TBA (check website for updates), Application is currently being developed into an e-application.**

Amount: Full Tuition, employment, employee benefits, fees, books, and room and board each year for up to 4 years. This program is available to high school **seniors** pursuing a bachelor's degree who exhibit leadership and community service, and desire to attend one of (19) 1890 Historically Black Land-Grant Universities studying agriculture, food, natural resource sciences, or other related disciplines. Must have a GPA of 3.0 or better, scores of a

1080 SAT, or a composite score of 21 ACT. Must submit a 500 to 800-word essay describing: 1) my interest in USDA, 2) how I envision the scholarship will impact me personally and my future as a public servant, and 3) my experiences and perceptions about agriculture, food, and natural resource sciences.
