As with all student dress, in alignment with the SPSB Student Dress Code Policy, students are required to be responsible in their dress and grooming by avoiding extremes and manifesting self-discipline. Cooperation of parents is essential.

Student dress and grooming are not to be a source of disruption in classes, school programs, or other school-related activities or detract from the learning environment of the school.

No student shall wear, possess, use, distribute, display, or sell any face covering with evidence of affiliation with tobacco, drugs, alcohol, or violence or gang related activities or that exhibits profane or obscene language/gestures.

Administrators are authorized to use their discretion in determining extremes in style of dress and grooming and what is appropriate and suitable for school wear.

The school administrator shall be the final interpreter of the dress code.

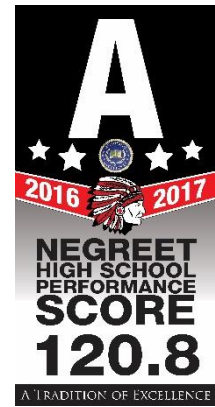

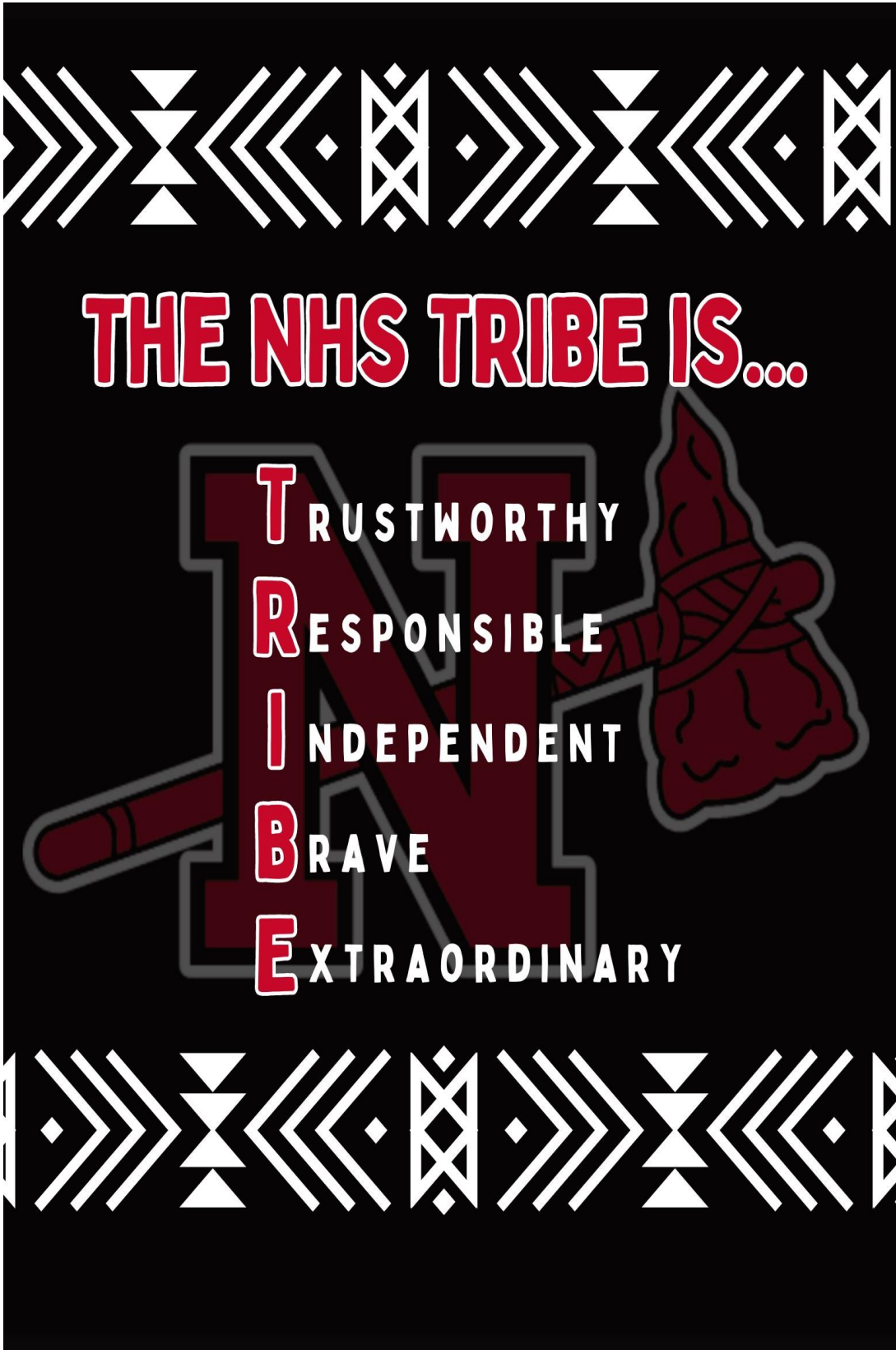

Other Points of Emphasis (include but are not limited) to the following:

1. **Closed Campus:** We operate a closed campus policy. Students must stay on the school grounds from the time they arrive, even if the first period has not yet started, until dismissal or until they are picked up by the bus. Any student leaving the school grounds must have permission from a parent or guardian and must check out through the office with permission from the principal or other official office personnel and must leave campus immediately. If a student returns on the same day, he must sign back in. If a student leaves campus without checking out through the office, then the student will be considered skipping school and will be suspended for three days.
2. **Cars on Campus:** All vehicles driven on school campus are to be in compliance with Louisiana motor vehicle laws. Students who drive to school will park in designated parking spaces only. Vehicles are to be locked and may not be visited at any time during the day without permission from the principal's office. Alcoholic beverages, weapons, illegal drugs and/or controlled and hazardous substances are not permitted in vehicles parked in the school parking area. Students will be required to purchase a parking permit from the office. Students who purchase permits will be drug tested and subject to random drug screening throughout the year. Failure to be in compliance will result in loss of driving privileges and loss of parking in the student designated area.
3. **Electronic Telecommunication Devices:** (Cell Phones, pagers, etc.) - No student shall use or operate any cell phones on campus during the course of the regular school day. Operate is defined as the device being turned on. Cell phones should never be visible (whether it is in their hand or through clothing) during the course of the regular school day. These may only be used in the event of an emergency as defined in the parish policy. Any student that has a cell phone visible **OR** is found to have a cell phone turned on during the course of the school day will have the phone taken. **It does NOT matter who the cell phone belongs to.**
4. **Locks and Lockers:** Students are required to rent a locker with a school lock for a cost of \$5.00. Homeroom teachers will issue the locks and lockers. Only one student per locker is allowed. All locks and lockers remain the property of the school and may be searched at the discretion of the administration.
5. **Visitors:** Visitors are welcome at our school, but must check in through the office before entering the school area. All visitors will either wear a visible, visitor badge and/or a Visitor name tag.



ELECTRONIC TELECOMMUNICATION DEVICES

Grades Pre-K – 12

No student, unless authorized by the school principal or his/her designee, shall use or operate any electronic telecommunication device, including any facsimile system, radio paging service, mobile telephone service, intercom, or electro-mechanical paging system in any elementary or secondary school building, or on the grounds thereof or in any school bus used to transport public school students.

Such prohibition shall not apply to after-school functions or events when the coach, sponsor, or other school employee in charge of the event authorizes the use of such devices. A violation of these provisions may be grounds for disciplinary action, including but not limited to, suspension from school. Nothing shall prohibit the use and operation by any person, including students, of any electronic telecommunication device in the event of an emergency. *Emergency* shall mean an actual or imminent threat to public health or safety which may result in loss of life, injury, or property damage.

For purposes of this policy, the terms *use* and *operation* shall mean whenever the electronic telecommunication device is turned on.

A principal shall have the discretion to allow the use of electronic devices in accordance with established written guidelines as part of a “Bring Your Own Device” program as approved by the superintendent.

Each school principal or his/her designee has the authority to impose consequences for violations of the district’s electronic telecommunication device policy. The consequences include removal of electronic telecommunication device from student for a determined amount of days, community service, in-school suspension, out of school suspension, and/or expulsion.

The consequences progress in severity for continued violations of policy. The consequences for misuse of an electronic telecommunication device shall apply to students in grades Pre-K – 12.

SABINE PARISH SCHOOLS

No Cellphone Use In School

Louisiana Law now prohibits student use of a cell phone within the school. All cell phones and smart watches must be stowed in lockers or powered off during instructional hours. Specific school guidance, regulations, and consequences will be covered during open house and start of school assemblies. Thank you for helping make our schools safer learning environments!

Student Refusal to Turn Over Electronic Telecommunication Device to School Administrator	Immediate contact with parents/guardian will be made. If the parent agrees with student action (noncompliance with district/school policy), the student will be immediately subject to 3 Days Out of School Suspension and must complete any assigned disciplinary consequences for the initial cell phone violation upon his/her return to school. Student and parent will be required to conference with the principal or his/her designee. During the conference, the parent/guardian and student will be informed that said student has lost the right to possess a cell phone on the school campus for the remainder of the school year. If the student violates the signed Electronic Telecommunication Device agreement upon his/her return from OSS, he/she will be subject to a 3-day OSS upon each subsequent offense leading to a recommendation for expulsion on the third occurrence of out of school suspension, per district policy JDE.

DRESS CODE FOR GRADES 4-12

1. Building character is one of the responsibilities of the school. Proper dress and good grooming are conducive to building both character and self-confidence. Therefore, dress and grooming should be appropriate and safe for school activities. Some fashions, though stylish, are not appropriate for school. As a general guide dress code includes but is not limited to the following:
 - a. Students in grades 4-12 may wear:
 - Shorts as long as they are knee length
 - Jeggings and warm ups with pockets
 - Slacks and jeans-belts must be worn by students as needed
 - b. Students in grades 4-12 are **NOT ALLOWED** to wear:
 - Jeans with holes or frays
 - Cut-off shorts
 - Sagging pants, leggings, athletic/exercise leggings, Skin tight pants, sweat/tights pants.
 - House shoes/slippers, sliders, flip-flops (example, foam rubber soled shoes)
 - Headgear such as caps, hats, hoods, sunglasses in the building or classroom
 - Tank shirts and undergarments may not be worn as an outer garment
 - No clothing will be permitted that causes distractions-clothing with profane or obscene language, pictures, alcoholic beverage, questionable printing, etc.
 - Tattoos that are vulgar, obscene, or disruptive to school environment are not allowed.
 - No body piercings and bull nose rings are allowed other than earrings. Earrings are to be worn within reason.
 - c. Shirts of young men should not exceed past the fingertips when in a standing position.
 - d. For young women all tops must be long enough so that no skin is showing when the student is in a standing position with arms by the sides. Only tops with sleeves will be allowed. Tank tops will only be allowed if worn under a top with sleeves. Blouses should show no cleavage. Mini- skirts are not acceptable attire. All skirts, including split skirts, must be long enough to reach the knees.
 - e. Even though students are important as an individual, the way they look reflects the school. Since clothes and hair styles (only natural color allowed) change yearly, the principal or designee will decide what is considered to be nice, decent, and respectable. The teachers will know the requirements to look for. Students are expected to abide by the principal's and designee's judgment.
2. **Attendance Recovery:** Any students that go over on attendance days will be allowed to make it up with the Attendance Recovery Program. If a student is assigned a Saturday attendance recovery and does not attend, it will not be assigned again. **It is the responsibility of the student and parent to make sure they attend.**
3. **Absences:** Excuses for student absences must be presented within five (5) school days of the student's return. Parents may provide up to five (5) written/verbal notices as excused absences. If not, the student's absence will be considered unexcused. NO excuses will be taken after five (5) school days. Students are allowed three (3) days to make up assignments upon returning from an absence. It is the student's responsibility to get the assignments from the teacher.

Grades K-3 Discipline and Code Policies

Self-discipline is the most effective kind of discipline and students are to assume responsibility for their own behavior. When student behavior is not acceptable, necessary action will be taken.

According to state law, the teacher or school administrator has the right to control or discipline a student during the time such student is in attendance or in transit to or from school or any school-sponsored function. Misconduct will be dealt with immediately.

➤ Class Behavior Charts - Minor and Major Infractions

Minor Infractions: Include but are not limited to continuous talking and interruptions, disturbing others, teasing, continuous horseplay, and off behaviors.

Each class has a behavior chart. Each **day** the chart will start with four (4) cards.

When a student has to be corrected for minor infractions the teacher will turn the card and remind students of expectations of minor infractions. If a student turns card twice, loss of privileges will be taken.

- A fourth card flip is considered a **major offense** and will result in an office referral. Behavior charts will not be intended for use of constant repeat offenders receiving major infractions. This student is a disruption to the school environment and consequences will be at the discretion of the NHS administration.
- After the third minor infraction, K-3 students will be considered for suspension at the discretion of NHS administration.

Major Infractions: Include but are not limited to willful disobedience, defacing or destroying property, repeated violations of class rules (behavior charts), complete disregard of administrative authority.

Administrative options on major offenses can be **either of the following or a combination of consequences**- Student conference, parent conference, loss of privileges (snack, recess, etc.), suspension, or expulsion.

- Constant repeat offenders for 3rd grade can warrant a Saturday Detention at the discretion of NHS administration.
- Pre-Kindergarten - Conference with student, contact parents, followed by Pre-K Center contact.



GRADES 4-6 DISCIPLINE AND CODE POLICIES

➤ **Class Behavior Charts and Minor Infractions**

Minor infractions include but are not limited to continuous talking and interruptions, disturbing others, teasing, continuous horseplay, off behaviors.

Each class has a behavior chart. Each **week** the chart will start with three (3) cards. When a student has to be corrected for minor infractions the teacher will turn the card.

The first card flip will be a warning to the student. Two card changes will result in loss of privileges. A third card flip will result in a Saturday Detention for repeated violation of minor infractions.

- **Since students will be placed back in the school environment (grades 4-6) for Saturday Detention offenses they are not to receive any more card flips for the remainder of the week. Any more card flips will result in a suspension from school with the Saturday Detention still having to be served.**

Since students will be placed back in the school environment (grades 4-12) for Saturday Detention offenses they are to remain referral free until the Saturday Detention has been served.

- **ANY referral received before a Saturday Detention has been served will result in an automatic three (3) day suspension for the student.**
- **After 3rd Saturday Detention a student will be suspended.**



Saturday Detention Rules

The students will abide by all Sabine Parish and Negreet High School rules, including but not limited to the following:

1. Complete BASE Educational Modules complete as assigned for intervention
2. No talking to fellow students.
3. All questions to the teacher must be written.
4. Both feet must be kept on the floor at all times.
5. No sleeping or putting head down on desk.
6. Complete all assigned work.
7. Complete IXL, Edmentum, Exact Path and/or any educational program as assigned.
8. Student is responsible for bringing assignments, including Chromebook.
9. If a student completes or does not bring assignments work will be provided for them to complete.
10. Student must stay busy at all times.
11. If any rules are broken the student will receive a mark on the board. A 1st mark on the board for infraction of rules will result in a warning for the student. A 2nd mark warrants a phone call to the parent, the student being removed from the Saturday Detention, and a three (3) day suspension. Upon returning from suspension the student must still serve the Saturday Detention.
12. Students are to bring their own lunch and snack money.

Saturday Detention is an administrative decision and may not be refused by student. The Saturday Detention will be served.

Any “No Show” for a Saturday Detention will be considered a complete disregard of what is required by the student to improve behavior at school and will result in a one day suspension. The student will still be required to make up the missed Saturday Detention.

Saturday Detention WILL NOT be intended for use of constant repeat offenders.

Consequences for Repeat Offenders

- 1st offense - Saturday Detention; parents are notified by mail and phone
- 2nd offense - Saturday Detention; parents are notified by mail and phone
- 3rd offense - Saturday Detention; parents are notified by mail and phone
- 4th offense or above - Principals discretion; The Saturday Detention policy IS NOT working. This student is a constant offender and is a disruption to the school environment.
- For a student that enrolls in the 2nd semester, Saturday Detention will be limited to two detentions for the remainder of the school year.

Parent may request to move the date of an assigned Saturday Detention – one time per semester. This must be approved by the School Administration before the assigned date is to be served.

Grades 4-12 In-School Suspension (ISS)

The students will abide by all Sabine Parish and Negreet High School rules, including but not limited to the following:

1. Report promptly (7:40 AM) to assigned ISS Classroom.
2. Complete BASE Educational Modules complete as assigned for intervention.
3. No talking to fellow students.
4. All questions to the teacher must be written.
5. Both feet must be kept on the floor at all times.
6. No sleeping or putting head down on desk.
7. All books will accompany students to ISS daily.
8. Complete all assigned work.
9. Complete IXL, Edmentum, Exact Path and/or any educational program as assigned.
10. Student is responsible for bringing assignments, including fully charged Chromebook.
11. If a student completes or does not bring assignments work will be provided for them to complete.
12. Student must have permission from ISS teacher to get out of desk for any reason. (Ex. Sharpen pencil, submit papers, etc.)
 - ISS is not intended for the use of constant repeat offenders.
 - On a 2nd infraction in ISS the student will get an additional day; the 3rd infraction warrants suspension. When returning to school the student must then complete their ISS time.
 - A complete disregard of ISS authority is grounds for suspension.



Grades 4-12 Expulsion Policy

Possession of dangerous substances, alcohol, or weapons is grounds for expulsion from school.

Any student, after being suspended for committing violations of any discipline policies or other rules or infractions, depending on the severity of the behavior, may be expelled.

- On a 4th suspension from school student will be recommended for expulsion.

All the discipline, Saturday Detention, suspension, and expulsion policies will be enforced by the principal or his appointed designee. The final decision of any disciplinary action that is taken is at the discretion of the Negreet High School administration.

Bus Discipline and Consequences - District and School Policy

The school bus is an extension of the school building; therefore, all school bus behavior incidents shall be reported to the principal and/or designee within (1) school day. All incidents will be addressed according to the Sabine Parish Student Code of Conduct Handbook.

- 1st offense - Student is suspended from the bus for (1) week
- 2nd offense - Student is suspended from bus for (2) weeks
- 3rd offense or above - NHS administration discretion
- Parents are notified by mail and phone

Major bus infractions such as fighting, drugs, weapons, or inappropriate bodily contact may warrant more severe consequences that could include, but are not limited to, suspension from the bus or out of school suspension or recommendation for alternative placement from school.

The school level principal and/or designee will make the determination of consequences after appropriate assessment protocols and thorough investigation of events have been completed.

At no time shall the bus operator assume authority for suspending bus privileges or taking disciplinary action.

A pupil damaging a school bus shall be subject to restitution in addition to a discipline consequence.

Any pupil suspended off of the bus for damages to that school bus shall not be readmitted until payment in full has been made for such damage or until his/her re-admittance is directed by the Superintendent or his/her designee.



VAPING PROCEDURES – District and School Policy

All students who use or possess tobacco, including electronic cigarettes and ALL nicotine delivery systems will be given a Discipline Consequence according to SPSB's policy. This is to include all school sponsored activities and events. Students from ages 10 years through 12th grade may be given a citation by local law enforcement, in addition to a discipline consequence.

1. Mandatory Conference with Parent;
2. 1-3 days OSS;
3. Possible Citation from the Sabine Parish Sheriff's Office or Local Law Enforcement RS 14:91.8 Prevention of Youth Access to Tobacco Law;
4. Recommended Counseling;
5. Possible referral to FINS

2nd Occurrence

1. Mandatory Conference with Parent;
2. 2-3 days OSS;
3. Possible Citation from the Sabine Parish Sheriff's Office or Local Law Enforcement RS 14:91.8 Prevention of Youth Access to Tobacco Law;
4. Mandatory Counseling;
5. Mandatory FINS Referral

3rd Occurrence

1. 2-3 Days OSS and
2. Recommendation for Expulsion

Middle/High (Grades 6 -12)

Unpaid Paid Fee Collection Procedure

1. A club sponsor or school administrator shall notify a parent in writing before any adverse action or denial of opportunity to a student due to an unpaid fee.
2. The notification shall state the description of the fee, the dollar amount, how the fee is to be used and the payment method of collection of the delinquent fee.
3. The notification shall also state the original deadline of the fee and give at least 5 school days from the date of the notice for the delinquent fee to be paid prior to any adverse action or denial of opportunity to a student due to an unpaid fee.
4. The notification shall make mention of the economic hardship waiver and a blank economic hardship waiver shall be attached to the letter of notification.

Economic Hardship Waiver Procedure

1. The economic hardship waiver shall be posted on each school website and printed copies of the waiver shall also be made available at each school office.
2. A parent or student may fill out the economic hardship waiver and return it to the school office in a sealed envelope marked to the attention of the school's principal.
3. If an economic hardship waiver is denied at the school level, the denial may be appealed to the Director of Student Services at the Sabine Parish School Board Central Office.
4. Appeals should be made within 10 school days of the denial.
