>> WHY NOW?






- In spite of the 2% Tax Levy Cap, the Board of Education and Administration have successfully addressed many facility needs within the operating budget.
 - Roofing Systems Replacements Various Sections
 - Door & Hardware Replacements
 - Mechanical Equipment Upgrades 1951 & 1994
 - Main Office and Business Office Renovations
- We are dealing with an aging school building with the oldest sections dating back to 1952 & 1967 - with over 30 year-old roofing, windows and doors; items that have reached the end of their life expectancy.

WE NEED TO CONTINUE TO DO MORE...

**District cannot complete a significant amount of work out of their capital budget and still stay below the 2%. **Projects completed out of capital reserve are ineligible for state aid. They are paid at 100% of the cost.

>> WHY NOW? - THE RIGHT TIME...






- The District has DEBT SERVICE ROLLING OFF which could allow for significant work to be completed with a "Net Neutral Tax Impact" or Zero increase to the taxpayers.
- Current INTEREST RATES have stabilized and we want to secure the lowest rate possible.
- » By allowing the School District to finance these substantial facilities improvements over many years, future families who benefit will also help pay.

>>> STATE AID APPLIED FOR . . .





CURRENT DEBT SERVICE PAYMENTS WILL BE ENDING IN MARCH OF 2026

This can offset any new debt being assumed under a targeted March 2026 Referendum.

- » UP TO 34% SAVINGS on all ELIGIBLE projects (Could mean \$\$\$\$ in aid for Norwood Public School)
 - » Must be funded through a REFERENDUM
 - » Must be tied to EDUCATION OR MAINTENANCE
- » Debt Service Aid from the state helps to pay down the bond and this helps reduce the impact on the taxpayer.



PROCESS

>> HOW DID WE GET HERE?





» DECEMBER OF 2024:

The District broached the subject of a potential Referendum that would address needed projects and take advantage of retiring debt that would result in a net netural or zero tax impact.

» WINTER OF 2025

Solutions Architecture and Consultant Engineers, met with the Administration and reviewed facilities improvements to be entertained.

- Obtained District/Board approval of selected projects including an understanding of balancing costs that result in a net neutral Referendum for the Norwood Public School Community.
- Issued a Community Engagement Survey.
- We established Proposed Budget Costs for the proposed projects attempting to maximize Debt Service Aid and capitalize on the Debt Service Roll Off with ZERO TAX IMPACT.

>>> ROOFING SYSTEM REPLACEMENTS













- The District is proposing to replace the aging 23,100 square foot roofing system over the 1967 section of the building, which is currently out of warranty and beyond its useful life. This roof replacement will head off failures that could result in leaks that disrupt the building's functionality and require costly ongoing maintenance.
- By upgrading these roof sections, the District will address water infiltration issues, improve energy efficiency, and upgrade the roof drainage system, ensuring long-term protection of the facility and more comfortable environment for students and staff.


>>> UPGRADE EXISTING TOILETS











- WHY RENOVATE (2) EXISTING TOILET ROOMS NEAR GYM FOR PUBLIC USE?
 - To expand equal access for all individuals, the District is proposing to renovate two existing general Toilet Rooms near the Gymnasium to meet current ADA accessibility standards.
 - These upgrades will expand accessible facilities for students, staff, and community members with disabilities, further supporting inclusivity and reinforcing the District's commitment to upholding the standards of the Americans with Disabilities Act.









- WHY CONSTRUCT (2) NEW CLASSROOM TOILETS FOR **REASSIGNED PRE-K CLASSROOMS**
 - To meet state requirements for licensed Kindergarten and Pre-K classrooms, the District must reassign classrooms and construct individual toilet rooms within two rooms
 - This essential upgrade enables the creation of two fully compliant Pre-K classrooms, expanding early childhood education opportunities within the District. By providing age-appropriate facilities, the project ensures a safe, accessible, and developmentally suitable environment for our youngest learners.

>> LOCKDOWN/ACCESS CONTROLS







These systems will allow staff to secure and restrict access to these spaces during a critical incident, such as an active shooter event, thereby improving the District's ability to protect students, staff, and community members during emergencies.



>> ADD A FORMAL DROP OFF / PICK UP LANE ON TAPPAN ROAD














- ADDING A SHORT-TERM DROP OFF LANE FOR PARENT DROP OFFS ON ON TAPPAN ROAD
 - To improve safety, traffic flow, and delays with arrival and dismissal procedures, the District is proposing to construct a curb cut with parallel drop off spaces for parent drop off / pick up.
 - This new drop off lane will allow parents to do what they are currently doing, however in a safer manner than what is currently occurring parking on the lawn area and walking students in. The enhances safety for students, staff, and the general public. Students will be required to walk around to the front of the building for entry.








WHY CONSTRUCT A MODULAR ADDITION?

This two-classroom addition will allow the District to bring back out-of-district placements for Special Education, Least Restrictive Environment, creating a more inclusive learning environment and strengthening its educational offerings, while significantly reducing costly tuition payments to other districts.


INTERIOR CLASSROOM RENOVATIONS











- CONSTRUCTING THE (2) CLASSROOM ADDITION WILL SACRIFICE A FULL SIZE CLASSROOM
 - The existing full sized classroom will become a corridor and (2) SGI Classrooms. We will reclaim that full sized classrooms by combining (2) existing SGI Classrooms 10 &12 into a larger room.
 - The resulting room will be used for MD (Multiply Disabled) student instruction.







- » Project Reviews and any financial assistance are pending from the Department of Education we have requested about 24.16% in eligibility for included projects. They would be eligible because...
 - We are funding the projects through a REFERENDUM
 - They are tied to EDUCATION OR MAINTENANCE
- 24.16% PROJECTED DEBT SERVICE AID is REQUESTED for the eligible projects. (Based upon current calculations) (\$1.47MM in State Aid is pending APPROVAL for Norwood Public Schools).
- Debt Service Aid from the state helps to pay down the bond and this helps reduce the impact on the taxpayer.

>>> PROJECTED COSTS - THE FACTS







- » Current Debt Service Aid Calculations are estimated and subject to change during the DOE review process.
- All costs projections are based on an assumed a
 4.1% interest rate over A 20 year term.
- The District was intent upon being fiscally responsible with this Referendum and made every effort to deliver a Net Neutral / ZERO TAX IMPACT scenario.
- » Ultimately, through their work with the Architect, Bond Counsel, and Financial Consultants, the Board of Education was able to include all of the needed scope and actually deliver a tax reduction to the taxpayers of Norwood.

- "The decrease takes into consideration the current Debt Service Aid Roll-Off which offsets that Taxable impact for the Referendum.
- Current Debt Service Aid Calculations are estimated and subject to approval by DOE.
- Assumed interest rate is 4.1% for a 20 year term.



Q: How will my taxes be impacted if I'm part of the NJ Senior Tax Freeze Program

A: If you are currently participating in the NJ Senior Tax Freeze Program, your taxes will remain unaffected by this Bond Referendum.

- » If the Bond Referendum Passes your taxes remain the same.
- » If the Bond Referendum Fails your taxes remain the same.

>> TAX IMPACT CALCULATOR



- You can obtain the ASSESSED value of your home from the tax assessor's office or your tax documents.
- ASSESSED value of your home is NOT THE MARKET VALUE of your home. It is NOT what you can sell your home for.
- If your home is reassessed in the future, the additional tax related to the Referendum will not change. The tax impact is locked after the Bonds are sold.
- If you are currently participating in the NJ Senior Tax Freeze Program, your taxes will remain unaffected by this Bond Referendum.

>>> SOME FACTS . . .





- There have been significant increases in the construction industry due to material cost increases, shipping increases, material shortages, and expanded schedules – we still need to work within the original budget numbers and will need to adjust accordingly.
- The designs shown within this presentation are conceptual only.
 We are simply providing an "idea" of what these spaces can look like at this time.
- » If and when the referendum passes, we will be conducting numerous meetings with the staff and administration to work on the detailed design of all of the individual spaces. Looking at needs, finishes, furniture, and overall "feel" of these rooms.

>> CAN MORE BE SPENT? F.A.Q.





Q: Can more money be spent than the amount approved in the question?

A: No. The Cost of the Referendum Projects cannot exceed the amount approved by the voters. The amount approved by the voters includes a reasonable budget under which to complete the work as well as required contingencies to address unforeseen conditions and construction issues.




Q: What will happen to the children before, during and after construction work?

A: Safety, Security and superior education are just three of the variables we take into consideration when planning District operations. In most cases, construction and renovations will be scheduled to be completed during the summer months or at other times when students are not in the schools. When school is in session, students will be separated from work at all times, this way, students can attend classes with minimal disruption.

>> WHY WASN'T THIS WORK DONE BEFORE? F.A.Q.





Q: Why hasn't the Board of Education done any of this work over the past 20 years?


A: It must be noted that this Board of Education and those that came before it, use Capital & Maintenance Reserve monies to conduct repairs and upgrades on an annual basis and have done so since the last Referendum in 2006.

It should be noted, however, that because of the District's 2% cap, it is impossible to complete the amount of work necessary out of the capital account. While some work has been completed, other work has been deferred and unfortunately that work continues to build up.

It's been nearly 20 years since the last referendum and the amount of work necessary to improve programs is significant - at least through the Referendum - \$1,475,479 in state aid is available for approval.

>>> POTENTIAL CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE





Q: When would the work begin and when will it be completed?

- A: » The schedule for implementation of the projects will be carefully reviewed & crafted into a detailed timeline that works best for the School District.
 - » While some projects could begin construction as early as summer of 2026, given the timing of a March Referendum, we would determine our ability to strategically bid projects at appropriate times.
 - » Projects that require more time to design & develop will begin later in the 2026 year or the summers of 2027 thru 2028.
 - Allowing for flexibility of scheduling allows us to bid at the most appropriate times resulting in the best pricing for projects.
