Talented and Gifted (TAG) Program

- Grades 3-8 pull out program (Tier 3) for identified students in need of enrichment support

Academic/Educational Program: Upper Program



- Advanced Math starting in 6th Grade.
- Algebra and Geometry for 8th graders meeting the criteria.
- Science lab-based inquiry and STEM integration
- Robotics, coding, and engineering design challenges
- Makerspace or Innovation Lab

Academic/Educational Program: Upper Program

Upper Program Eagle Period

- Redesigned to focus on math support while still allowing students to address individual needs as needed.
- Math department collaborates and calibrates so that the lessons/activities provided during Eagle Period are aligned with their current learning objectives.

Social Emotional Learning (SEL)

- A.C.E. Program (Assertiveness, Courage, Empathy) in our Upper Program that teaches students to be upstanders, create positive interactions between staff and students and celebrate students that do the right thing.
- Upper Program Character Ambassador program with school counselors acting as the lead where students are afforded leadership opportunities.

Created PreSchool Disabled Program & Redesigned the Multiply Disabled Program

- (1) PreSchool Disabled (PSD) Classroom Program with specialized instruction (inclusive of ABA/discrete trial training as needed per student), feeding support (as needed per student) with inclusion opportunities into Integrated PreSchool Classroom for generalization of skills and peer modeling.
- (2) Sections of Multiple Disabilities Classes: Grades K-3 and Grades 4-8 with specialized instruction (inclusive of ABA/discrete trial training as needed per student) and inclusion opportunities into General Education Lunch/Recess and Specials.
- 2025- "Milestones in Motion" Initiating Monthly Parent/Team Programming Meetings for PSD/MD students who receive ABA/Discrete Trial programming to discuss progress, challenges, etc.

Increased staff support with in specialized programming: BCBA + Social Worker



- Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) on site to provide behavioral/social support to students in need, provide social skills/life skills lessons to specialized program classrooms, provide parent training and support and support general education teachers in supporting student needs as they arise in MTSS plans.
- Social Worker to provide counseling, social-emotional learning/resources training, student support as needed

Enhanced Summer Programming

- Supports students in specialized programming to prevent regression of academic skills over the summer
- Extended School Year program for PSD/MD students, as well as integrated preschool students.

Increased Parent Communication

 Annual Review Notification Documents in accordance with the new New Jersey law, S3982 (P.L.2025, c. 107). All parents/guardians receive special education documentation at least 2 days prior to the scheduled meeting and are invited to provide feedback and participate collaboratively.
