Scotts Valley High School is proud to announce **Year 2** with our Hope Squad program. Hope Squad is a school based Peer to Peer Suicide Prevention and Wellness Leadership Program that builds a supportive community of students and school staff who are dedicated towards promoting the health and wellness of all students.

What is a Hope Squad?

Hope Squads reduce youth suicide through education, training, and peer intervention. Hope Squad members are nominated by their classmates as trustworthy peers and trained by advisors. They are not taught to act as counselors, but rather to be peer advocates, recognize signs of suicide contemplation, sharing and respectfully report any concerns to an adult. Hope Squads organize school activities that promote inclusion and connectedness. Hope Squad members are trained through scaffolded, evidence-based modules. Student participation in Hope Squad is voluntary.

Why Start a Hope Squad?

- Train staff and community members in youth suicide prevention
- Empower the natural helpers in your school through peer-to-peer suicide prevention training
- Raise awareness of mental health and youth suicide prevention resources
- Educate students on how to recognize suicide warning signs and respectfully report concerns
- Train students how to support fellow students who may be struggling
- Increase connectedness, inclusion, and social-emotional learning skills
- Increase help-seeking behaviors
