

Garrett Weber-Gale (1999-2003) is the most accomplished swimmer in Nicolet history.

Garrett is Nicolet High School's first Swimming and Diving National Record Holder. His first meet during his freshman year, he swam on the "C" medley relay and wore a shark Halloween costume for the team picture. However, by the end of the season he was a State Qualifier. During Garrett's four-year varsity letter tenure he set seven school records, runner up in one, set 3 North Shore Conference records and was a 2-time MVP, 17-time (event) All-State, 17-time National Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association All-American, National Federation of High School Coaches Association Swimmer of the Year 2003, National Runner-Up "Swimming World" High School Swimmer of the Year, National High School record holder (100 yd freestyle), broke two state records and currently holds the pool record at the University of Wisconsin Madison Aquatic Center in the 100 yd. Freestyle.

After graduating from Nicolet, Garrett graduated from the University of Texas-Austin (U.T.) where he was 2004 "Big12" freshman of the year and 2005, 2006 and 2007 "swimmer of the year", a 13-time Division I All-American, 10-time all Big12 conference and a 2-time WCAA Div. 1 Champion. He also swam on nine U.S. National teams, breaking five national records and three world records. Garrett's most notable achievement happened during his second summer on the men's 400 meter freestyle relay that won gold in the 2008 Olympic games. Garrett won two Olympic Gold medals at these games and was an ESPN Award Winner.

Garrett stands as an example of what can be accomplished through vision, commitment and a willingness to learn and seek out knowledge. His consistent hard work, desire to succeed, and strong competitive spirit combined with the support of strong family/community support were major components of Garrett's success.
