### **ACADEMY OF FINANCE**

The Academy of Finance (AOF) is a district program that bridges the gap between the classroom and the workplace. It helps students develop career skills and become college and career ready. This 3-year career-themed, academic program allows our students to share in a variety of professional experiences and competitions through our work-based learning opportunities, corporate job shadows and field trips, industry guest speakers, Business partnerships and Advisory Board, paid internships and our multi-faceted DECA club. ### **ART CLUB**

Students will learn more about the world of art through activities, meetings, field trips, group projects and informational meetings. The Art Club provides materials, instruction and support for those students who are seeking a creative outlet in addition to their academic schedule.



### **ASL HONOR SOCIETY**

Since 2006, the American Sign Language Honor Society (ASLHS) has been a valued addition to the field of ASL education. Its primary mission is to encourage and recognize high academic achievement in ASL studies for students. Like honor societies for other languages, the ASLHS seeks to enrich the learning experience of those studying ASL. The ASLHS aims to increase the interest in the ASL program, expose students to Deaf Culture activities and give back to the Deaf Community, as well as promote leadership and responsibility among students.



### **AUDIO / VISUAL CLUB**

The Audio/Visual Club trains students to operate lighting and audio equipment for school productions. This is great training for students interested in live sound and theatrical lighting.

### **BUSINESS & TECHNOLOGY HONOR SOCIETY**

Junior and Senior students enrolled in business courses will be afforded the opportunity to become members of the East Meadow Business & Technology Honor Society. This membership provides honor and recognition to outstanding students who demonstrate talent and character in courses within the business education program, East Meadow High School and within the community. Meetings/activities are held monthly.



### **CHESS CLUB / GO CLUB**



The Chess/Go Club is designed to offer students the opportunity to learn and enhance their playing techniques and the strategies involved in the game of chess. Both games are games of strategy and help members develop problem solving skills. The club participates in competitions and has won several awards including trophies, plaques, etc. The club is a great place to meet people and we welcome new members.

### **CHRISTIAN CLUB**

The Christian Club provides a safe space for Christian students to identify with each other as well as for other students who are interested in learning about Christianity as a religion.

### **COMIC BOOK CLUB**

### **COMPOSERS CLUB**

The Composer's Club is an opportunity for students to work in the music lab for projects that go beyond normal class time restriction, and to share compositional techniques and concepts with peers. The club enables students to have access to the music lab to use the equipment under the guidance of teachers and senior students. At the meetings, students benefit from sharing ideas with peers in collaboration on songs and extended compositions.

The music in this club is shared with the rest of the student body, which extends to family and community audiences as well. One activity included a holiday project that extended to people all over the country because of students sharing with distant family and friends. Students are proud of the fact that their music is heard and appreciated by so many.



### **COMPUTER SCIENCE CLUB**

The Computer Science Club is a club where students who are interested in all aspects of computer science can meet and learn. The club will be discussing potential career paths available to computer science majors, learning new coding languages, talking about current issues/events in the field of tech like AI and cybersecurity, playing problem-solving games, participating in hackathons and much more.



### **CONNECTIONS CLUB**

DECA prepares leaders and entrepreneurs for careers in marketing, finance, hospitality, management, and other business areas. DECA has different events in which students will compete against each other in various categories and disciplines.



### **ENVIRONMENTAL CLUB**

The Environmental Club is focused on educating and learning more about environmentally friendly practices. The weekly recycling program and Earth Day are two main activities of the club. On EMHS Earth Day the members of the Environmental Club, Horticulture Club, and others, educate elementary school students in the district on Earth-friendly projects and activities.

### **EPIC CLUB**



EPIC (Expressing Pride in Israeli Culture) is a club for students interested in discussing Israeli culture and traditions. We will celebrate holidays throughout the year and organize the annual Holocaust Awareness Assembly in the Spring.



### **ETHNIC AWARENESS CLUB**

The Ethnic Awareness Club is designed to promote cultural awareness as well as to bring people of world-wide cultures together to share one another's way of life. To accomplish the goal of sharing cultures from around the world, a variety of activities are planned each year.

### **FASHION CLUB**

The Fashion Club works towards educating high school members about current fashion trends. Members of the club become informed about careers in the fashion industry and how to achieve their fashion goals. The year ends with the annual fashion show featuring students from EMHS. Each year, proceeds are donated to a different charitable organization.





### **FILM STUDIOS CLUB**

The EMHS Film Studios Club is open to all grades and gives students an experience in the filmmaking process and guides them through filming, microphone work, interviewing, and more. The club is a great place to meet new people and collaborate with other clubs on seasonal filming projects.

### **FIRST RESPONDERS CLUB**



The First Responders Club purpose is to raise money for organizations that support first responders and veterans who have been killed or hurt in the line of duty and their families. The club would also like to provide our members with opportunities to learn about various first responder careers and do hands on activities, such as trying on firefighting turnout gear.



### **FRENCH CLUB / HONOR SOCIETY**

The French Club / Honor Society is open to 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students who are enrolled in French. Its purpose is to expose students to authentic examples of French culture through various activities such as celebrating French holidays and sampling French food. The club meets once a month.

Students who have a 90 average in French may apply in 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade to be a member of the French Honor Society.



### **GEM CLUB**

The Gender Equality Movement is designed for any students who are interested in celebrating the roles of different genders in society and discussing current issues and controversies in the news revolving around this topic.

We will work towards the goal of equality of the genders as well as equality of minority groups. We will increase awareness of gender-related issues and work toward gender equality. Political, economic, cultural, and social issues regarding gender relations will be discussed.

### **GSA CLUB**



GSA provides a space in which LGBTQ+ and youth can flourish in terms of their community and education. Discussion, conflict resolution, education and group activities will take place during the weekly meetings.



## **HANDBELL CHOIR**

Handbell Choir is a music ensemble that rehearses once a week and gives multiple performances throughout the school year. The ensemble performs a wide variety of music from classical, to show tunes, and everything in between. The group meets on Tuesdays in the afternoon in the Old Band Room.

## **HOOPS**

### **(Homework Offers Opportunities Promoting Success)**



HOOPS is an afterschool program which provides students with the opportunity to do homework, projects (including computer use) and study for tests either individually, in small groups, or with the assistance of a teacher.

The “drop-in” format allows you to stay for as long as you need. The program provides a designated time and space for homework completion, as well as organizational, time-management, and study skills. Snacks are served and textbooks and school supplies are available for use.

## **HORTICULTURE CLUB**



The Horticulture Club members participate in a variety of activities that center around plants and gardening. We work in the school greenhouse and maintain various school gardens, including a seasonal vegetable garden.

## **ISU INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ALLIANCE (ISA)**

## **ITALIAN HONOR SOCIETY**

The Italian Honor Society’s goal is to promote an understanding and appreciation of the Italian cultures, as well as to give recognition to the achievements of students enrolled in Italian for more than two years. Students enrolled in this club must keep an outstanding work ethic, participate in various club activities, and attend all meetings. New members will be formally inducted into the Italian Honor Society at an appropriate ceremony and receive a membership certificate.

## **JAZZ BAND**

The Jazz Band is an ensemble for students new to playing jazz music. Membership is by audition. The Jazz Band meets weekly and is directed by TBD.





### **JAZZ ENSEMBLE**

The Jazz Ensemble is for experienced jazz players and membership is by audition. The Jazz Ensemble meets weekly and is directed by Mr. Engle.



### **JET GAZETTE**

The Jet Gazette is East Meadow High School's very own school newspaper. Students have the opportunity to write articles, take pictures and create the paper. This club is student run and focused on the common goal to create and foster school spirit. Four times a year, the students publish a 16-page full color paper. JG staffers hope to highlight issues affecting the lives of the East Meadow students both in and around the school.

Students interested in journalism may join as staff writers, writing sports, news, features, editorial, and arts and entertainment articles. Additionally, students interested in photography, advertising or the business side of journalism may participate.



### **JETS BOOK CLUB**

Jets Book Club is where lovers of literature and reading enthusiasts can come together once a month. We read novels of different genres and reflect on the morals and values of society through the novels we read. We also dwell on why literature matters and how it has shaped history.



### **KEY CLUB**

Key Club is an international student led organization that provides its members with opportunities to provide service, build character and develop leadership. It is the high school level of Kiwanis and the oldest and largest service program for high school students. The core values are leadership, character building, caring and inclusiveness. The club members support the endeavors and charities of the Kiwanis Club.

Some of our major events include the Convention, Senior Citizen/Veteran Thanksgiving Dinner, SAFE Halloween, food drives, and Adopt-A-Family.

### **KICKLINE / ROCKETTES**

The East Meadow Rockettes are a kickline team. The Rockettes participate in all home football games, basketball games, and homecoming events. There are captain positions available for seniors that have been on the team the previous year.

To become a member, the student must be a sophomore, junior or senior. Students may try out entering their sophomore year.



### **K-POP CLUB**

K-Pop Club is something to help relax after a long day of school. Join us in debates, watch parties, Jeopardy, competitions, and so much more! Let us foster a safe space to explore and indulge in K-Pop.



### **MATH TEAM**

The Nassau County Interscholastic Math Team students compete at a monthly math competition against students from across the county. Contests are held once a month beginning in October and ending in March.



### **MEDITATION & HEALTHY LIVING CLUB**

Come join us for meditation and relaxation exercises, which are scientifically proven ways to relieve stress and improve focus. Learn proper techniques to help relieve anxiety and get better sleep in a very comfortable and supportive setting.

### **MODEL CONGRESS**



Model Congress is a debate-type club. We take current issues, turn them into potential laws, and argue the pros and cons of those issues. Visitors from other schools are allowed to attend meetings. During the weekends conventions take place.

A Regional Convention is held at East Meadow High School and other Model Congresses are invited to come and participate in debates and contests.

### **MU ALPHA THETA MATH HONOR SOCIETY**



The Mu Alpha Theta Math Honor Society is an organization dedicated to promoting a deeper understanding of mathematics and enriching students' mathematical experiences. Students that are initiated into this honor society have exceeded in their math classes and share their understanding with others.

Members of the East Meadow chapter for Mu Alpha Theta participate in engaging math-related activities and provide free weekly one-to-one math tutoring to their peers. In addition to tutoring, members compete in the Nassau County Interscholastic Math League and the American Mathematics Competition (AMC).



### **NATIONAL ART HONOR SOCIETY**

The National Art Honor Society of EMHS is designed to inspire and recognize students in grades 10-12 who have shown an outstanding ability and interest in Art. The club promotes positivity by recognizing students who are dedicated in their pursuit of the arts and have shown their ability in all subjects through their overall grade point average. Members must maintain an overall grade point average of 85 or higher as well as a 90 or above in Art. Activities include individual or group projects along with a visit to a local museum.



### **NATIONAL ENGLISH HONOR SOCIETY**

The National English Honor Society recognizes student achievement in English. Students must maintain a 90 average in English and an 85 average overall to be a member of this national organization. Students in 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade are eligible. Among other activities and events, the NEHS organizes an annual book drive and poetry reading and participates in Safe Halloween.

### **NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY**

As the most prestigious club in the school, the National Honor Society provides a program for the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students who have an overall GPA of 90. The club promotes intellectual stimulation and growth by interaction with others who share the same enthusiasm for learning. The goals of the club include establishing an Academic Wall of Fame. This wall has pictures of past Valedictorians and Salutatorians. Another goal is to raise the standards of the club. The NHS meetings are held after school and are held monthly. One of the National Honor Society's major events is the Induction Ceremony for the new NHS members. Some other activities include trips to museums, Broadway shows, and movies. The National Honor Society also ushers events such as graduation, Senior Scholarship Night, and "Meet the Teacher Night."

A major accomplishment of the National Honor Society is that it established a student-run 1-on-1 tutoring service. This service is provided for any student needing help in any area of study. The club has grown to be much more than something to write down for college. The members of the organization are expected to and do contribute their services to the school. There is an application and admissions process.





### PEER LEADERS

East Meadow High School's Peer Leaders are a select group of Seniors who undergo a rigorous interview process in the Spring of their junior year. Those selected are trained on several topics throughout the year.

Peer Leaders goes into classes once a month to lead discussions and activities to help clarify misconceptions, aid, and educate students to make well-informed decisions by passing on their knowledge and expertise. Their role is not to preach, but to educate.

### PERSPECTIVE



Perspective is a creating writing club that meets weekly to discuss, analyze, and critique student writing. The year's activities will culminate in the publication of the school's literary magazine.

### PRE-MED CLUB



The Pre-Med Club relates to service professionals associated with the welfare of people, animals, and society in general. We learn about different professional careers associated with serving people.

The club is for any student who has a strong interest in any field of medicine. Students must commit to 40 hours during the school year doing volunteer work in any type of medical field.

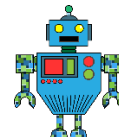
### RED CROSS CLUB

## SADD

### (STUDENTS AGAINST DESTRUCTIVE DECISIONS)

Students Against Destructive Decisions, commonly referred to as SADD, is dedicated toward helping to educate and raise awareness about issues affecting teens. SADD provides peer to peer education, prevention, and activism to prevent destructive decisions. Some of SADD's campaigns include the Semicolon Project, Adopt-A-Family, Texting and Driving, Drug and Alcohol Prevention, and Teen Violence.

## SASA

### (SOUTH ASIAN STUDENT ASSOCIATION)



South Asian Student Association (SASA) is dedicated to honoring students of South Asian descent and representing their various cultures, while also strengthening their collective identity at EMHS. This club shares their culture and heritage with the school. SASA is open to all students regardless of their background.

## SCIENCE HONOR SOCIETY



The Science Honor Society's purpose is to encourage an interest and understanding of science and science-related careers, as well as to recognize the academic achievement in science of high school students.

Students who are members are enthusiastic about research, participate in science-related activities, have demonstrated achievement in science learning, tutor peers in science classes, and present excellent personal character.

## SOCIAL STUDIES HONOR SOCIETY



The purpose of Rho Kappa National Social Studies Honor Society is to recognize academic excellence in Social Studies among high school students, encourage interest in, understanding of and appreciation for the social studies and encourage members to become a responsible and productive citizen of our community.



## SPANISH HONOR SOCIETY

The Spanish Honor Society is open to those students who have an average of 90 or better during their freshman and sophomore years and continue to maintain that average into their junior and senior years. The students must also have an average of 85 or above in their core classes. This club accepts only junior and senior foreign language students that are enrolled in honors Spanish. They must be able to meet all the requirements before the induction ceremony. Obligations include peer tutoring, submitting an original piece of written work in Spanish, and fundraising.

Several cultural events are held during the year. Meetings are mandatory and are announced in advance.



## **SPORTS FANATICS CLUB**

The Sports Fanatics Club is for students who share the love of sports and fantasy sports teams. It is a social network for students who love sports. Meetings will include participating in fantasy drafts for multiple sports, playing sports trivia games and Sports Kahoots, activities for sports championships, and sharing sports memorabilia.



## **STEM CLUB**

STEM Club provides a stress-free environment to give all students a chance to introduce themselves into various realms of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. Meetings consist of projects/experiments, thinking activities, guest speakers, STEM based trivia games and school outreach.



## **STRING ENSEMBLE**

String Ensemble is a conductor-less community string orchestra that is open to all high school students regardless of in-school ensemble and/or level. Auditions are not necessary! Genres of music that are performed range from classical to pop. Two concerts are given each year (one in the Fall and one in the Spring) and rehearsals are held every Monday immediately after school.



## **TABLE TENNIS CLUB**

In the Table Tennis Club, students will get to actively participate in table tennis games. Students will get to work with their peers and friends in different pairs to play competitive games against one another. The club will meet monthly in the small cafeteria.

## **THEATRE GUILD**



One of East Meadow High School's largest clubs is the Theatre Guild. Theatre Guild provides many opportunities for students interested in the arts. There are two major performances throughout the year. The fall production is directed by Mrs. Priole and is typically a comedy or drama. The spring musical is directed by Ms. Schick, and the pit orchestra for the musical is directed by Mr. Engle.

In addition to performing on stage, students can choose to participate behind the scenes in the Tech Crew, AV Club (audio/visual), or perform in the pit orchestra.

## **TRI-M MUSIC HONOR SOCIETY**

The formation of the East Meadow chapter of the Tri-M Music Honor Society signified the school's recognition of the importance of the arts in the development of a comprehensive educational program. Tri-M Music Honor Society provides a means of recognizing the efforts and achievements of music students who volunteer their time and share their musical talent with others. Students are selected for membership based on musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to their school and community, as well as their attitude toward teachers and fellow students.

Students must have participated in NYSSMA and achieved an A on a level VI solo and must be in good academic standing. The organization's high standards serve to challenge students to greater effort and accomplishment, and to encourage them in the pursuit of excellence. Music students will be invited to become members by the music teachers of the department, and then fulfill the requirements set forth by the Tri-M manual.



## **WORLD HUNGER AWARENESS CLUB**

The World Hunger Awareness Club, commonly referred to as WHAC, is a service organization concerned with promoting awareness about world hunger. Under the supervision of the advisor, WHAC aims to make positive changes within our community.

Locally, we organize food drives, volunteer at a soup kitchen, participate in Safe Halloween, Adopt-A-Family in December, and conduct fundraisers. The club also raises money for global organizations, such as Heifer International, a worldwide program committed to ending hunger and poverty by teaching self-reliance.
