



## **Library Media Centers**

### *Section 2000 - Instruction*

The district's library Media Centers provide a broad, flexible array of services, resources, and instruction that support student mastery of state standards in all subject areas. The programs include resources that promote a positive impact on student learning, like a variety of resources for reading advocacy, student communication skills, and electronic and print information.

Library staff will collaborate as instructional partners and informational specialists with teachers to develop student's information and technology skills, help all students to meet content goals in all subject areas, and assist high school students in completing their high school and beyond plans.

The superintendent shall establish procedures for selecting library materials with the understanding that media literacy resources will consist of a balance of sources and perspectives. Parents who wish to express a concern about specific material included in the collection may do so according to the procedures outlined in 2021P, with the understanding that criteria and rationale for reconsidering library resources differ from those for reconsidering classroom instructional materials
