

Nonresident Students

Section 3000 - Students

A letter with attached policy and procedure will be mailed to all nonresident students at the end of each school year explaining requirements for re-enrolling.

All applicants for nonresident attendance will be considered on an equal basis and are subject to annual renewal. Younger siblings of currently enrolled out-of-district students will be accepted for enrollment using the district standards identified in this procedure.

The district designee will accept or reject an application for nonresident admission based upon the following standards:

- Whether space is available in the grade level or classes at the building which the student desires to be enrolled;
 - A school, grade or program will be deemed to not have sufficient space to accommodate the request of a non-resident student when the school(s), grade, level(s), or program(s) enrollment is at or greater than 90% of capacity, after all in-District enrollment and transfer requests have been processed.
- Whether sufficient and appropriate staff and related resources are available to serve the educational needs of the student.
- Whether appropriate educational programs or services are available;
- Whether the student's attendance in the district is likely to create a risk to the health or safety of other students or staff; including consideration of such whether the student's disciplinary records indicate a history of violent behavior or gang membership, and whether the student has a history of and/or suspensions.
- Whether the student fails to make satisfactory progress, or disrupts the education environment, or for poor school attendance.

District enrollment will be reviewed by August 15th to make final determination of admission and placement of nonresident students. Acceptance of Non-resident kindergarten students will not be considered until August 20th.

Termination of Assignment

Building administrators may request a non-resident students waiver be terminated by the the district if:

1. The resident student population increases to the point that there is insufficient capacity for nonresident students in the assigned school or program, in which case the nonresident student(s) will be offered attendance at another school or program.
2. Information about the student's instructional needs, or academic or disciplinary records, were unknown or materially misrepresented on the application;
3. The student is suspended or expelled from the school or District under standard disciplinary procedures, and their continued presence would substantially disrupt the learning environment; or
4. The student has engaged in violent or disruptive behavior.

Transportation

Transfer students may arrange to be provided District transportation under the following conditions:

- Students may only utilize existing bus stops serving their assigned school.
- The parent/guardian must provide an alternative childcare address with the assigned school boundaries.
- The parent/guardian is responsible for ensuring transportation to the existing bus stop, childcare, or alternative address.
