Information for All Programs

- Students will complete applications online. They can be found on the District Home Page or the school's website in which the program is held.
- Acceptance into any program will be contingent on the final outcomes of Second Semester.
- Transportation is provided to all programs.
- Students accepted into Early College, Pre-Collegiate, or IB will become a student at the assigned school. If you leave the program during your high school tenure then you will return to your zoned school.
- Students can participate in athletics if they make the team and are eligible.

The Application Process

- There is a common application for all 3 schools/programs.
- The application will open on November 27th. All program applications will close December 15th.
- Students will select which school/program they are applying for while completing the application.
- When they have submitted their application, they will receive a "thank you for completing your application" email and directions for the next steps in the process.
- These directions include the link (within a prewritten email) to the teacher recommendation form. It is the STUDENT's responsibility to send the teacher recommendation to their teachers.
- Students will be notified of their acceptance status January 12. Students will be given 1 week to accept their spot into the designated program.

- Our program is designed to give students the opportunity to earn your high school diploma and Associate's Degree at the same time with no direct cost to you or your family
- We are housed at Alamance Community College
 - Direct access to ACC resources: Math Lab, Writing Center, Foreign Language Lab, Library, and much more

- Class of 2023 earned a little over \$8.3 million in scholarships


