

This report highlights how students are using social media and tech and what they want educators to know about how it impacts their health, happiness, and success on a daily basis. This report represents the findings from The Social Institute's nationwide survey of 22,952 students at U.S. public schools and independent schools, conducted Aug. 1 - Dec. 1, 2022.


### What apps are students using on a weekly basis?



### BeReal

Step aside, Instagram. This app is inspiring people to be their most authentic selves – no filters, no influencers, no ads, and only two minutes to capture a photo to share. Oh, and no do-overs. At different times throughout the day, users get a notification on their device that it is time to "BeReal."



### Gas

See who likes you. That's the goal behind this new trending app. "Gassing someone up" refers to complimenting or hyping up a friend – which is one of the reasons why this app has become so popular. Users see positive, pre-generated poll questions (e.g., "the most beautiful person you have ever met") and then vote on classmates' names based on contacts already in their phones.



### **ChatGPT**

This free-to-use artificial intelligence chatbot gets the answers you want in "a conversational way." No more scrolling through pages of articles to try and find what you're looking for. ChatGPT is reimagining artificial intelligence with its quick, conversational answers.










