Position Summary: Camp counselors live in community for the majority of the summer and facilitate all camp activities and some of the programming. The role of a counselor is to build authentic relationships with campers by living as an example of Christ's love for them and providing spiritual leadership to those in their cabin. If you are ready for an unforgettable summer spent serving, mentoring, and having fun with youth all while praising the Lord, this is the place for you!

Counselors Receive Reports From: Camp staff (including Program Director, chaplains, camp

nurse) and parents

Specific Responsibilities:

- be present during program periods (and other periods as required) to provide direct support
- implements summer program together with other camp staff
- creates and implements new program activities (as needed)
- ensures activity set-up/break-down is done in a timely fashion
- assists with weekly camp check-ins and check-outs
- participates in daily camp worship
 - officiating, preaching, providing music, and other assistance according to the order of ministry (lay, deacon, priest)

General Duties:

- Leads camp activities as needed, including sports, arts/crafts, games, devotions, etc
- Helps set up meals (as needed) and monitors campers during mealtimes in collaboration with the counselor team
- Supports and contributes to a safe, clean environment for all campers
- Exhibits behaviors of a positive role model to campers in attitude, behavior, and exercise of leadership
- Maintains clear and positive verbal and written communication with others
- Participates enthusiastically and is supportive member of the community

Job Qualifications/Requirements:

- Holds a high school diploma or equivalent
- At least 18 years old when or before the camp season begins
- Willing to take 5 hours of free Safe Church training mandated by The Episcopal Church
- Willing to obtain First Aid/CPR/AED certification (at no cost to you!)
- Willing to take 2 hours of free LGBTQIA+ Allyship training mandated by The Episcopal Church
- Successful completion of all necessary background checks required by The Episcopal Church
- Willing to be present at TEC for the entire camp season except during designated days off and vacation periods. On-site at TEC from June 1st August 5th, 2024.
- Be a team player
- Seeks resolution in conflict
- Passionate about camp and retreat ministry and sees this position as a vital part of ministry
- Have a love for children and youth
- Experience as Camp Counselor or similar role working with children is preferred
- Familiarity with camping and various outdoor activities is preferred
- Be patient and reliable
- Have solid organizational and communication skills
- Be energetic and positive personality
- Ability to meet the physical demands of the job (strength and stamina to follow strenuous activities like hiking, running, crouching or lifting 15 lbs.)
- Adjusts quickly to changes with an open mind and flexibility
- Recognizes and responds to emergencies in a safe manner
- Willingness to obtain other training/certifications as needed

Compensation and Time Off:

Camp Counselors who stay the entire camp season (on-site at TEC from June 1st - August 5th, 2024) will receive a stipend of \$3000 and free room and board. Additionally, camp counselors will receive one hour of paid time off a day and one 24-hour period of paid time off a week. Each camp counselor will receive the week of July 4th off (June 30th - July 5th).

Arrival and Departure:

Camp Counselors are expected to arrive at camp on Sat., June 1st - in advance of the TEC counselor training week. Counselors are also expected to arrive ready to work weekly camp sessions by 2 pm on Sundays. Counselors are welcome to leave TEC anytime after August 5th.
