#### One Mission, One Team

Parshat Nitzavim is a very unique parsha in which you, yes you, make a cameo. At this point in the Torah, Moshe Rabeinu is giving his final charges to Bnai Yisrael before he passes on the responsibility of leadership to Yehoshua. The parsha opens with Moshe saying,

"אַמֶּם נִצָּבֵים הַיּוֹם כַּלְּכָם לְפָנֵי ה' אֱל-כֵם"

(You stand today, all of you, before Hashem your G-d). When referring to all of you, Moshe leaves nobody out. He specifically mentions the heads of the Shvatim, the elders, the officers, and the head of each household. He further includes the children, wives, and even the woodchopper and water drawers. The pasuk went out of its way to show that literally everyone was standing there before it introduces a seemingly odd statement,

Wait, what? We just took all that time to state everyone was there? Who wouldn't be there with them on that day? The people coming back late from summer vaca-

Rashi explains that this is referring to all future generations of Am Yisrael. He was talking about you! What was the message he was conveying? The message is about making choices, Moshe outlines the blessings that Am Yisrael would receive for following the Torah and, G-d forbid, the curses for not following it. We are not only responsible for ourselves, but for all of Am Yisrael. We are united with a single mission. Eli Rowe, the tremendous baal chesed, as well as founder of Hatzolah Air, accomplishes the near impossible every single day. He leads an organization that flies sick and injured people, at a moment's notice, around the world on multimillion-dollar jets without charging the patient. Anyone who knows anything about the costs of medicine and aviation can tell you that it is simply a miracle that this could be accomplished. I am not surprised in the least, because Eli understands the lesson of this parsha. He understands that no person can accomplish or fail on their own when there is, "One mission, One team". As we read Parshat Nitzavim, we are reminded that unity, responsibility, and commitment are pivotal aspects of our cove-
