### PARSHA VAYERA "NEW LEVEL UNLOCKED"

After years of challenges, waiting and praying, Avraham and Sarah are blessed with the promised child Yitzchak. It is through this child that Hashem promised Avraham that his life's mission will be passed onto and begin the growth of a great nation. Yitzchak was so protected by his parents that they even had to send Yishmael and Hagar away from him so that he would not be influenced by their ways. Avraham and Sara were "all in" on Yitzchak.

Things seemed pretty good for Avraham and Sarah. Avraham just agreed to a treaty with Avimelech as the posuk said, "וַיָּגֵר אַבְרָהָם בְּאָרֶץ פְּלִשְׁתִּים יָמִים רַבִּיִם – And Avraham resided in the land of Plishtim for many days". Avraham seems to have finally settled down in peace in his old age to focus on his mission of bringing people closer to Hashem and raising the next generation through Yitzchak. Then Avraham got the call...

The tenth and final pion, akeidat Yitzchak. This is the test that unlocked the final level of Avraham's potential, and he passed with flying colors. What does it mean to unlock potential? We all have potential, in fact, we tell our kids that they have the potential to be whoever they want to be – even the President! However, there is a big difference between potential and execution. Sure, I have the potential to learn an extra hour of Torah after a long day of work but the execution is the hard part. #### Dear Parents,

There is always something that we can learn from the Parsha, as the Torah is our guide to life. In this week's Parsha, פרשת וירא, we see that even though Avraham was recovering from his ברית מילה he was upset that he did not have visitors coming to see him. Avraham loved to do the mitzvah of - הכנסת אורחים - welcoming guests.

If you would have entered our classroom this week you would have seen that our Succah was transformed into a tent with four doors, similar to the tent that Avraham must have had. We learned that Hashem had made the sun extremely hot on the third day after Avraham's brit so that Avraham could rest up and recover quickly. However, when Hashem saw how unhappy Avraham was by the lack of guests He sent three angels disguised as men to visit Avraham. That led us into a discussion of how we can make our guests feel comfortable and at home. We used אברהם אבינו as our role model. We also decorated welcome mats that the girls took home.

We very much enjoyed practicing the mitzvah of חוכמת אורחים when we invited the first grade for snack on Wednesday afternoon and Mrs. Michelle Choina as our special Shabbat party guest on Friday. We tried to make them feel at home and offered them chairs, food and drinks! We authored a book entitled "How We Welcome Our Guests". We learned in the Parsha that each angel that came to Avraham had a special task he had to accomplish. The מלאך מיכאל had the job to tell Avraham and Sarah that they would have a baby boy. When Sarah heard she laughed. After all, Avraham was 100 years old and Sarah was 90 years old. When their son was born they named him Yitzchak because of Sarah's laughter when Hashem told them she would have a son. We understood from this that often names have special meaning and so we compiled a "Guess Who I Am" book. The girls were so interested to share with the class who they were named after and the meaning of their names.

The מלאך גבריאל was in charge of destroying Sodom. We learned that even Lot was impressed by Avraham's ability to make his guests comfortable. In fact, Lot invited the מלאך גבריאל and the מלאך מלאך into his house even though it meant going against the whole city of Sodom. The job of מלאך was to tell Lot that he should leave Sodom .... The girls know the story of Lot's wife. We also discussed the mitzvah of ביקור חולים , visiting the sick in order to help people feel better. We realized that if it is impossible for us to visit the sick person we can also perform this mitzvah by sending a get well card. Also, when a classmate is sick we can use our class lists to call our friend to wish them a תפואה שלמה שלמה. We really want to follow in the ways of our forefathers! As we know, children who are read to every day have a better chance of becoming successful readers. Since the beginning of the school year we have set time aside on a daily basis to read to the girls. During this time we have been introducing the girls to the title of the book, the author, illustrator, and different parts of the book such as the publisher, title page and even the copyright. We have familiarized ourselves with various authors. Now, we are going to introduce our "Author of the Month" series.

Each month we will look at another author's specific style of writing to see what he prefers to write about, e.g. people, animals or places. For the month of November we are reading books written by Tomie de Paola. When we began reading books he authored we realized that the ideas for a great number of his books originated from real life experiences. Tomie de Paolo based his book "The Art Lesson" on an event that occurred in school when he was young. We, therefore, decided to write our own stories. We are amazed at how easily the girls came up with their true stories!







