Scratching the Surface

For years, I have told my children that, "95% of people talk nonsense 100% of the time." We all know those types of people who are quick to talk and slow to action. We start with Avraham Avinu buying Maarat Hamachpela from Ephron Hachitti. Even back in Avraham's time, they knew the old saying, "You get what you pay for." Avraham approached Ephron in the presence of the other important members of the community and asks, very specifically, for the Maarat Hamachpela which is located on the corner of Ephron's field. Cue the lights! It's showtime! Let me set the scene. Avraham approaches Ephron in front of all the other important people in his community. The conversation went like this:

Avraham: Please sell me the cave in your field.

Ephron: What? I would never! Take it for free, it's yours.

Avraham: Come on, Ephron. Just let me pay for it.

Ephron: Avraham, what's a field worth? 400 shekels (wink, wink, nudge, nudge) between friends?

Avraham: Yeah, I get it. Here's your money. Ephron: Yeah, I'll take that in large shekels.

In the end, Avraham paid an enormous sum for the land and the Torah took great care to detail the exact specifications of the deal. Avraham, the master of chesed and emet knew exactly what Ephron was and knew that if he didn't pay for the property, in front of witnesses, there would be problems in the future. Avraham knew Ephron had no intention of giving away the land for free and given the opportunity he would demand a large sum for it.

Next scenario, Eliezer is charged to find Yitzchak a wife. He goes to the city of Nachor and davens. He asks Hashem to accept his litmus test in finding a suitable mate for Yitzchak. The test will be that Eliezer will ask a girl for some water. The girl that offers him and his animals water will be the one for Yitzchak. Just as soon as he finishes his davening, Rivka shows up. Eliezer asks her for some water and not only does she give him water, she waters all 10 of his camels! That's a lot of water!

Ephron and Rivka are two complete opposites once you scratch the surface a little bit. Ephron said a lot but did little. Rivka on the other hand, said little and did a lot. There is an old saying that most of us have heard, "Words are cheap." We so easily open our mouths and make lofty statements and promises, but many times, the follow through is not there. It all boils down to character and reputation. We spend our entire lives building and maintaining our character. We hope to become someone that people can trust. Someone that people know will do their best to help them if asked.

It may surprise you, but there is an industry today which is run almost completely on the character of its members. The diamond trade is a very tight group who will make deals and lend diamonds to one another based only on their character and reputation. It takes years to make a name in that business, and only minutes to lose it. Once someone in the diamond business gets a negative reputation, it's nearly always the end of them in the diamond trade.

Let us all take the lessons of this week's parsha and continue to say little but do a lot in our commitment to Hashem and Klal Yisrael . This will iy"H ultimately help bring the ultimate final geulah.

Dear Parents,

This week's Parsha, פרשת חיי שרה, begins with the sad news that שרה אמינו died.We learned that while שרה was alive there was a special cloud (ענן) that protected her tent and her Shabbat candles always stayed lit from one Shabbat until the next. We also learned that the Challah that שרה אמנו baked always stayed fresh all week. However, these miraculous phenomena stopped when she died That is, until יצחק and went into the tent of שרה אמנו.

We also learned that אברהם sent Eliezer to find a wife for Yitzchak.
