## Parshat Va'eira What have you done for me lately?

(And Hashem said to Moshe, "Say to Aharon: Take your staff and hold out your arm over the waters of Egypt—its rivers, its canals, its ponds, all its bodies of water—that they may turn to blood; there shall be blood throughout the land of Egypt, even in vessels of wood and stone.")

Rashi tells us that Aharon was the one who was commanded to bring this plague because the river had protected Moshe when he was placed into it as a baby. Moshe didn't bring this plague or the plague of frogs which both involved the Nile River. We learn an incredible lesson from Hashem about Hakarat Hatov from this. Moshe wasn't allowed to bring this plague because he was showing hakarat hatov to water, an inanimate object.

There is an incredible story about Rav Yisroel Gustman, a tremendous talmid chacham and Rosh Yeshiva of Yeshiva Netzach Yisrael in Yerushalayim. Rav Gustman had a small garden outside his office at the yeshiva and every day he would go out and water the plants. This was a very curious sight to the talmidim in the yeshiva who could not comprehend why the Rosh Yeshiva would be using his precious time for watering plants. He explained to his talmidim the following story. Prior to the onset of World War Two, he and Rav Chaim Ozer Grodzinki would take walks on shabbat afternoons while talking and learning. One week, as they were walking through the forest, Rav Grodzinki, uncharacteristically, began pointing out the different types of edible vegetation in the forest to Rav Gustman. An unorthodox lesson indeed, but Rav Gustman took the lessons of his rebbe as seriously as any Torah topic. When the War began, Rav Gustman had to escape into the forest, and it was there that he survived on the edible vegetation that his rebbe showed him. By watering the plants outside his office, he was demonstrating his Hakarat Hatov for the plants that saved his life.

We see how we need to show hakarat hatov to something as small as a plant or water. How much more so should we show it to Hashem and other people? When it comes to hakarat hatov, there is no such thing as, "What have you done for me lately?"

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## Preschool News

#### **Dear Parents**,

In this week's Parsha, פרשת וארא, Hashem commands Moshe and Aharon to return to Pharaoh to tell him that it is Hashem who wants the בני ישראל to leave מצרים. Pharaoh demands proof that the request comes from Hashem. The girls learned about what happened when Aharon threw his staff on the ground and as Pharaoh was not impressed by this sign from Hashem, he still refused to let the Jewish people leave.

We learned that Hashem sent ten מכה. We learned that משה רבינו was told by Hashem that Aharon should be the one to put the stick in the water at מכת דם. Moshe learned to show הכרת הטוב (gratitude). He was thankful that the water had stayed calm when, as a baby, he was placed in a basket in the river. From this we learn that we, too, should show הכרת הטוב to people who help us. We discussed that Aharon hit the river with his staff and the entire river turned into blood. Your daughters know how the מצרים reacted to this and what happened when they tried to take the water from the Jewish people.

We enjoyed learning about the מכה צפרדע. These were not little, harmless frogs. However, the moment the frogs were gone Pharaoh forgot how terrible they were and refused to let the Jewish people leave. We discussed the next five שחין – שחין – wild beasts, – דבר – animal diseases, שחין – boils, and – hail.

We are learning about Tu B'Shevat. We know about the שבעת המינים and that the Torah describes the Land of Israel as a good land "a land of.... vines, figs and pomegranates.... olives and sweet dates, and that is why we eat these food on Tu B'Shevat. We also eat a fruit that we have not eaten during the year so that we can say a "שהחינו" to thank Hashem for keeping us alive and healthy.

We continued reviewing the brachot we make on different foods and this week we concentrated on foods for which we say בורא מיני מזונות. We really enjoyed the pretzels, cookies and cupcakes we ate for snack.

We very much enjoyed our pre-Tu B'Shevat trip to the Hot Houses in the Brooklyn Botanical Gardens. We walked through a tropical forest, a desert, and other climatic zones. We saw various plants and flowers that grow in these regions. We were able to see coffee beans, chocolate plants, and medicine plants growing near to the ground, and some really tall trees, including banana trees. We also saw orange trees. It was very interesting to see firsthand the cycles of trees and plants. Morah took us to the aquatic hot house were we saw water lilies and she showed us the type of reeds that Miriam hid behind when she was watching baby Moshe in his basket in the river. Morah Caroline told us that one of her favorite exhibits is the little bonsai trees.

We continued with our Ezra Jack Keats author study. We learned that Ezra Jack Keats was very gifted and enjoyed writing and illustrating his own books. A number of his stories originated from his personal experiences and he would use collages to illustrate his work. We, too, decided to copy Keat's techniques and enjoyed designing collages to illustrate our own stories. These collages can be viewed in our classroom.


