#### Parshat Vayikra Feathers and All

In Parshat Vayikra, we learn about the various korbanot that we can bring in the Mishkan. When it comes to animal korbanot, the Torah tells us that one can bring cattle, sheep or goats and birds (turtle doves or young doves). With each of these korbanot, the Torah uses the language of אַשָּׁה רֵיָחַ נִיחַחַ לִ' - a pleasing fragrance to Hashem. When you read the pasuk closely regarding a korban using a bird, we are instructed to put the entire bird on the fire, feathers and all. I think we can all agree that burning feathers smells awful, so how could this be אַשַּׁה רֵיחַ נִיחֹחַ לִ'הַ נִּיחֹחַ לַ'.

The year was 1996 in Yerushalayim on a Friday afternoon. Having changed Shabbat plans at the last minute I needed a place to eat on Friday night. My friend and I were advised to go to the Mirrer Yeshiva and wait until the end of davening at which point the gabbaim would find us a place to go. At the end of davening we were paired up with an elderly English speaking man who took us to his house. I was thrilled that we found a place for our meal, but I was not ready for what happened next. Arriving at his apartment in the Battei Ungarin neighborhood, which could best be described as a hole in the wall, five of us were crammed around a small table. The Ba'al Habayit was not married and had extremely modest furnishings... in fact, I'm pretty certain there was only one room with a tiny kitchen. After kiddush, the Ba'al Habayit brought out tiny slices of gefilte fish, and the rest of the meal followed suit with tiny portions for each person. The food was minimal but the overall experience was surreal. This elderly Ba'al Habayit very likely sacrificed his meager shabbat meal to share it with us.

Rashi tells us that the bird korban is put on the fire with its feathers so that the mizbeach should be adorned and sated with the korban of the poor person, who could only afford a small bird. Removing the feathers would make the korban look smaller. Regarding the smell of burning feathers, Rashi continues to teach that regardless of whether the korban is big or small, it is always a אֵשֶׁה רֵיָחַ נִיחַ רָיַחַ נִיחַ לִיֹחַ בִּיחַ לִי מּ long as the bringer of the korban's heart is directed towards Shamayim. Needless to say, the elderly Ba'al Habayit knew this lesson long before I did.






