English Language Learner

English-language learners, or ELLs, are students who are unable to communicate fluently or learn effectively in English, who often come from non-English-speaking homes and backgrounds, and who typically require specialized or modified instruction in both the English language and in their academic courses.

How are English Language Learners Identified?

- 1. The Home Language Survey (HLS) is given to a parent/guardian during the initial enrollment of a student into an Idaho public district/charter school.
- 2. The HLS is evaluated by English Language staff to determine the need for language screening services.
- 3. Results of the language screening determine the need for English Language development services.

English Language Services:

- 1. are provided through the Fruitland School District's English Language Learner program which may appear different from school to school,
- 2. include instruction in the areas of speaking, listening, reading, and writing,
- 3. is monitored locally and by participation in the annual state assessment annual language assessment.
