Title I-C: Migrant Education Program

A student is MIGRANT if they meet the following criteria:

- Within the last 3 years moved from one school district to another,
- and the move was to seek or obtain employments in agricultural or fishing industry
- the employment is seasonal

The purpose of the Migrant Education Program is to:

- support high-quality and comprehensive educational programs for migratory children to help reduce the educational disruptions and other problems that result from repeated moves;
- ensure that migratory children who move among the States are not penalized in any manner by
 disparities among the States in curriculum, graduation requirements, standards;
 ensure that migratory children are provided with appropriate educational services (including
 supportive services) that address their special needs in a coordinated and efficient manner;
- ensure that migratory children receive full and appropriate opportunities to meet the same challenging State academic content and student academic achievement standards that all children are expected to meet;
- design programs to help migratory children overcome educational disruption, cultural and language barriers, social isolation, various health-related problems, and other factors that inhibit the ability of such children to do well in school, and to prepare such children to make a successful transition to postsecondary education and employment; and
- ensure that migratory children benefit from State and local systemic reforms.
