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## From the Superintendent

It is my pleasure to write to you as the superintendent for Logan View Public Schools. We take pride in serving all students, families, and the community and believe each child is unique with special talents. Our experienced teachers and staff are committed to supporting each student in their educational journey.

Logan View Public Schools mission is to develop lifelong learners in a nurturing, challenging and disciplined environment. We strive to ensure each student becomes a productive member of society and possesses a skill set that contributes to the greater good of the community in which they reside.

In 2021, the board of education completed a strategic planning process that identified the following guiding principles for the district: 1.) Expansion of Student Learning Opportunities 2.) Personnel Effectiveness 3.) Culture and Climate 4.) Curriculum and Instruction 5.) Family and Community Partnerships and 6.) Facilities. The board prioritized guiding principles 1 and 3 as the most important among the six guiding principles.

Over the past year, much work has been done to assess what learning opportunities we currently offer and what opportunities could we offer. Currently we are examining our high school and junior high master schedule to determine what efficiencies can be realized. Expanding our offerings in the area of Career and Technical education along with dual enrollment opportunities are the first two priorities.

The board also prioritized improving the climate and culture of Logan View Public Schools. This principle was selected based on the survey completed by students, staff, and patrons of the district. As I have described to our staff, culture isn't any one thing, it is everything. Everything we do influences the culture of this organization.









## Student Achievement











