**School District and Community**

Alvin ISD covers 252 square miles in northern Brazoria County and serves the communities of Alvin, Manvel, Iowa Colony, Liverpool, Amsterdam, and parts of Rosharon, Arcola, and Pearland. With its close proximity to the Houston Medical Center, Alvin ISD has over 29,000 students making it the largest school district in Brazoria County. With the building of new neighborhoods, the district continues to see significant student population growth. There are currently 4 High Schools, a Career and Technical Education Center, 9 Junior High Schools, 20 Elementary Schools, 1 School of Choice High School, and 1 Behavior Alternative School.

**School Information**

- Total enrollment for the 2024-2025 school year is approximately 2,209
  - 9th grade (568), 10th grade (569), 11th grade (594), 12th grade (478)
- Students attend 7 periods a day, 5 days a week for approximately 54 minutes
- There are approximately 18 weeks in each semester
- The school year begins on August 13, 2024, and will end on May 23, 2025

**Curriculum**

- Dual Enrollment Program offered through Alvin Community College
  - Dual Degree option available
- Alvin ISD Pathway to Advancement (APA), and AP Course offerings are available
  - APA courses were formerly PAP courses
  - MHS offers 28 Advanced Placement courses and 14 APA Courses.
  - Students have the opportunity to earn an AP Capstone Diploma.
- A variety of CTE courses offered that lead toward industry certifications
- Services available for LEP, Special Education and 504
- Co-curricular activities include band, choir, dance, Academic Decathlon, Debate, Model UN, Student Council, academic clubs
- UIL Sponsored athletic programs are offered in football, basketball, golf, Volleyball, tennis, track, cross country, soccer, swim/dive, softball.

**Graduation Requirements**

- 4 credits English (I, II, III, and one advanced English)
- 4 credits in Math (Alg. 1, Geom., 2 advanced Math courses)
- 4 credits in Science (Bio., Chem. or IPC or Phys. & 2 advanced courses)
- 3 credits in Social Studies (W. Geo., or W. Hist., US Hist. Govt. & Econ.)
- 2 credits in Foreign Language or Computer Science
- 1 credit in Fine Arts
- 1 credit in Physical Education
- 7 credits in Electives (must have credits towards an endorsement)
