ASBESTOS - In 1978, Air Quality Testing, Inc., of Moline, IL conducted inspections of all District #223 buildings for asbestos containing materials (ACM) and wrote an Asbestos Management Plan for each of the buildings where ACM were found. Asbestos containing materials were found in each of the buildings in varying amounts. In 1990, almost all of this ACM was removed. C. R. Hanna Elementary School still has floor tile containing asbestos. This tile is non friable and has little potential for contact damage. As required by Federal and State laws, all buildings underwent a three year re-inspection in May 2020 by an Illinois licensed asbestos inspector. No new asbestos containing materials were found.

To maintain the safest possible conditions for our children, surveillance of asbestos containing materials is conducted continually and documented every sixth month to determine if any of the ACM has been damaged or has deteriorated.

All asbestos inspection reports and management plans for Orion Community Unit District #223 have been approved by the Illinois Department of Public Health. The asbestos management plan and project managers report (reports on removal) for each building are available for examination in the office of the principal of respective buildings and at the District Office, 1002-11th Avenue, Orion.



SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES -

The Orion School District offers a variety of services for students with special needs.

Students experiencing difficulty achieving success in the classroom due to learning disabilities, behavioral disorders, speech deficiencies, or other social/emotional problems can receive assistance through the special education program. These services can range from consultation with the student and/or parent to instruction in special education classrooms.

Appropriate placement is determined jointly by the student, parents, and district personnel only after a complete assessment of the student has been done.

Additional specialized services are available through Black Hawk Area Special Education District. Anyone interested in accessing these services should contact the school office for further information.

PBIS CORNER - Having clear routines is really important to students making good choices. Routines are predictable (so students know what to expect), they give students clear cues about what to do, and they enhance adult consistency (so students get the same message from everyone). Here at school we are working hard to develop clear and consistent routines that will help students be successful. At home, having a clear and consistent routine for homework and studying will have a big impact on your child's academic success!

PBIS TIP! - Model the behavior you seek. Whether it's apologizing when you're in the wrong or treating others with respect and kindness, children learn a great deal about relationships from observing the behavior of their parents.

The CR Hanna library is coordinating the Box Tops 4 Education program.



UPCOMING EVENTS:

Friday, October 6 - PSAT/NMSQT (Juniors)

Seniors should begin applying to their postsecondary schooling choices. Student transcripts may be requested from the school counselor via the Orion School District website. Some applications will also require a recommendation and/or secondary school report. Early decision deadlines vary from institution to institution so please check with each institution for their deadlines. Early decisions can be either binding (student is legally bound to attend that institution when admitted under early decision) or unbinding (student is not legally bound to accept the offer of admission). The student will need to call each institution to determine whether the decision is binding or unbinding.

Seniors are allowed three days to visit colleges. Many colleges will require placement tests for classes and interviews for scholarships. Saving these days allows the student the flexibility needed for these activities. A college visit may be requested through Mrs. Amador or Mrs. Jackson, office secretaries. The process is the same as any prearranged absence except that there is a yellow college visit form that will need to be signed by an official at the college visited and returned to the high school office in order to confirm the visit.

The NEW FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) becomes available this December. Stay tuned for more information. Completing and submitting the FAFSA is not only free and quick, but it gives you access to the largest source of financial aid to pay for college or career school every year. In addition, many states and colleges use your FAFSA data to determine your eligibility for state and school aid, and some private financial aid providers may use your FAFSA information to determine whether you qualify for their aid. Completing the FAFSA as soon as possible is crucial to determine your family's financial need and eligibility for the Federal Pell and Illinois MAP Grants...because the money available will run out. Even though you may not have made a final decision about which college/school you plan to attend next

RECRUITER ACCESS TO STUDENT

INFORMATION- The No Child Left Behind Act requires that schools that receive federal assistance under the act provide recruiters from our armed forces or institutions of higher learning, access to student names and directory information such as addresses and telephone numbers. Orion High School receives assistance under this act. Therefore, we are obligated to provide student directory information to military or college recruiters when it is requested. However, you as parents have certain rights under the act as well. You can request that your child's directory information not be released without your prior written approval. If you do not want your child's name released, please send a signed written note to Orion High School, and we will see that your child's name is not released. Please submit this letter to Orion High School no later than Friday, October 6.



NURSE'S CORNER - Parents, if your child goes home ill, they should not be attending events that same day. Flu, strep, colds, all are caused by germs and are contagious. Uncovered coughs, as well, spread germs 10-15 feet, by droplets, like an aerosol spray.

Also, if you give your child medication for pain, cold, or headache, PLEASE give them age-appropriate medication. Too much may cause liver problems or other problems as well. With the current ongoing situation, they may need to stay home.

Cold weather will be here before we know it. Please have your student dress for the weather! Also, the schools tend to be a little chilly so make sure they have a jacket or sweatshirt they can put on. Please have CRH students label their clothing. We get too many items unclaimed. **Just a reminder:** What the students wear to school is what they go to recess in. We do not have coats to borrow. 


We are still looking for some kindergarten, 2nd, 6th, and 9th grade dentals and kindergarten vision exams.

ORION BACKPACK PROGRAM

The Orion Backpack Program is a local mission of the Orion Food Pantry being implemented throughout the Orion School District to address the needs of the children living in extreme poverty (families with an income less than 300% of the federal poverty level).

The Orion Backpack Program provides nutritious kid friendly food to children who live in "food insecure" households (households without consistent access to food) to get them through the weekend when school meals are not available. This program is provided at no cost to the children or families.

The Orion Backpack Program provides each participating child with a backpack with 8-10 food items weekly to provide them with food on the weekends when free or reduced cost meals are not available at school. Each backpack contains items such as canned meals (stew, soup, pasta or ravioli), fresh fruits and vegetables when available, granola bars, cereal bars, cereal, canned fruit, instant oatmeal. **The bag is discreetly placed in the child's backpack on the last day of school each week.** Food for the backpacks is purchased from The Orion IGA and River Bend Food Bank.

The Orion Backpack Program is administered through the Orion Area Food Pantry with funding provided through private donations and local public grants. If you currently receive food from the Food Pantry or are in the SNAP program, you are eligible for this program. You may contact your child's teacher or the school office to arrange for your child to participate.
