# Superintendent's View

Welcome to a new school year filled with fresh opportunities, renewed purpose, and the chance to do something extraordinary

together. Before anything else, I want to say thank you. Thank you to the teachers and staff who show up each day with energy and care. Thank you to the families who trust us with their children. And thank you to the entire Humble ISD community for believing in what public education can be. The start of a school year is always full of possibility, and that is especially true here in Humble ISD.

That possibility becomes real when we look at the lives of the students who have walked our hallways and taken what they've learned into the world. Our Class of 2025 included more than 3,700 students who were offered \$38.8 million in scholarships. Our graduates are making their mark across our state and nation. For example, students who ranked in the Top 10 at our six high schools

AC Entry Level; Adobe Certified Professional Illustrator; Cosmetology Operator License; Elanco Veterinary Medical Applications Certification; Patient Care Technician; and Pharmacy Technician – just to name a few examples.

Humble ISD students outperformed the state and national average on the SAT. Humble ISD students scored an average of 1040 compared to the state average of 971 and the national average of 1024.

The work of education is complex, and while many students excel, we also recognize that our STAAR scores are not yet where we believe they can be. We are committed to ensuring our students are taught Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) in reading, writing, math, science and social studies and can show academic growth on STAAR.

Growth has been made in just one year! We anticipate that about 15 campuses will move up a letter grade in the state school accountability ratings from 2024 to 2025. We have a clear plan and strong

Our students in grades 9-12 earned a total of 37,742 college credits last year through dual credit, dual enrollment, and Advanced Placement. Our high school students earned a total of 1,541 industry-based certifications. ## Supporting Teachers Every Step of the Way: Meet Our New Chief Academic Officer

***Melissa Hayhurst** was named Chief Academic Officer for Humble ISD in January 2025. With 35 years of service in the district as a teacher, principal, and administrator, she brings both depth of experience and a clear vision for the future of teaching and learning. In this Q&A, Hayhurst shares insights into her leadership approach, priorities, and what academic success means for students across the district.*

### Q: What's your top priority as Chief Academic Officer?

**Hayhurst:** Simply put, the top priority of the Teaching and Learning team is to help every student succeed. That starts with making sure every teacher, on every campus, has what they need to teach effectively, starting with a clear, consistent curriculum.

clarity on what to teach, while still giving them the freedom to decide how to teach in a way that works for their students. The curriculum is continually refined to stay aligned with state standards and to keep lessons rigorous, engaging and relevant.

But the curriculum is just one part. Teaching and Learning includes a team of specialists who support instructional coaches and teachers throughout the year. They help write curriculum, plan lessons, model instruction in classrooms, co-teach when needed, and provide targeted professional development. Their job is to make sure teachers never feel like they're doing it all on their own.

When curriculum, coaching, and training all work together, teachers can focus on what matters most: helping students learn and grow. That's the everyday mission of the Teaching and Learning team.

### Q: How have your past roles shaped how you lead?

**Hayhurst:** My time as a teacher and principal keeps me grounded in what really matters. It reminds me that the best solutions come from listening and making sure our work at the district level is guided by the voices and needs of our campuses. That's how real progress happens – together.

### Q: What does "academic success" mean to you?

**Hayhurst:** As a high school teacher and assistant principal, I was focused on graduation. But students' lives don't stop there. That's where College, Career, and Military Readiness (CCMR) comes in. It challenges us to think beyond high school.

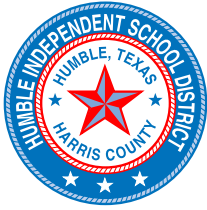
### Q: What should teachers know about the support they'll get?

**Hayhurst:** We're focused on doing more for campuses, not to them. In January, a curriculum framework was provided for STAAR courses and their respective lead-in courses. This framework breaks down the content into units that highlight the most important concepts and learning goals for each part of the course, along with a planning guide that suggests pacing and helps teachers stay on track throughout the year. This gives teachers

What I have learned is academic success isn't just one outcome. It means students should leave us with real opportunities, a clear sense of direction, and the tools to get where they want to go. Not every student follows the same path, and success doesn't look the same for everyone. It's no longer just high school to college. It's about preparing them for life and empowering them to build their own future.

## SAFETY MATTERS

### iHELP: A Safety Resource for Humble ISD

Students, staff, and parents in Humble ISD can use iHELP, a mobile app and web tool, to anonymously report safety, social, or emotional concerns and get help quickly.

Monitored 24/7, iHELP connects students to caring adults and provides emotional support, especially for those who may hesitate to ask for help in person. Users can attach photos, videos, or audio and engage in two-way conversations with a real person.

The ability to report anonymously often encourages students to share more than they would face-to-face, helping build trust and positive relationships on campus.

While face-to-face support is best in emergencies, iHELP offers an extra layer of protection and encourages students to open up.

### Humble ISD Enhances Safety with Evolv Detection Systems

To support a safe and secure environment for students, staff, and visitors, Humble ISD has installed Evolv Weapons Detection Systems at Turner Stadium and all high school campuses.



Unlike traditional metal detectors, Evolv screens for weapons with minimal disruption, helping daily routines continue smoothly. The system was first introduced at Turner Stadium in October 2024 and expanded to all high schools in Spring 2025.

Evolv Express meets all government safety standards and uses low-frequency radio waves that are safe for everyone, including pregnant individuals and infants.

### Centegix Safety Platform Enhances Emergency Response

In the 2024–2025 school year, Humble ISD's Department of Emergency Management and Safety launched the Centegix Safety Platform across all campuses and departments. The system includes a simple, wearable panic button that lets any staff member report an emergency instantly.

With real-time alerts, dynamic digital maps, and precise location tracking, Centegix ensures a rapid, targeted response from on-site emergency teams.

Starting in 2025–2026, every Humble ISD teacher and staff member will receive a Centegix badge. Pressing the button discreetly alerts responders from anywhere on campus or district property.

This platform is part of Humble ISD's continued commitment to a safe, supportive environment for all students and staff.

## Humble ISD Police Department Spotlight

The Humble ISD Police Department is the first school district police department in Texas to be named an Academy Training Provider by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE). This distinction led to the creation of the Humble ISD Law Enforcement Academy, which provides training for those pursuing law enforcement certification and continuing education for certified officers.

TCOLE Deputy Chief Cullen Grissom announced the designation at the December 2024 Humble ISD School Board meeting.

**5th+ Offense** – 2-5 days ISS; Parent/Guardian picks up device after school, same day

*\* High School students with more than 1 Extended D-Hall or In-School Suspension cannot exempt final exams*

#### **ELEMENTARY SCHOOL CONSEQUENCES**

**1st/2nd Offense** - Device turned in to front office; Written notice sent to parent/guardian; Student picks up device at the end of school day

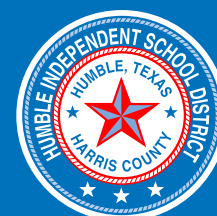
**3rd Offense** - Student office referral; Lunch or recess detention; Parent/guardian picks up device from campus at end of school day

**4th Offense** - Same as 3rd offense; Device Intervention plan created; Meeting with parent/guardian and counselor; Parent/guardian picks up device from campus at end of school day

**5th + Offense** - Student office referral; 1 Day of In-School Suspension; Device intervention plan review/update; Meeting with parent/guardian and counselor; Parent/guardian picks up device from the campus at end of school day

### HOW PARENTS CAN SUPPORT THEIR CHILD

- Contact the front office to have a message delivered to your child
- Do not call or text your child during the school day
- Speak to your child, encourage appropriate PCD use
- Promote the importance of students focusing on instruction
- Upon 2nd offense, a parent or guardian will be required to pick up the PCD after school

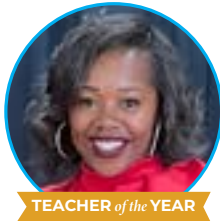

District-provided transportation is available to all Humble ISD students in the IB Academy.

## Soccer Around The World: Kindergarteners Learn Reading, Writing and Math Through Summerwood Class Project. Pro Soccer Players Give the Assist.

Six-year-old Faith Brady may be the Portland Thorns' biggest fan.

Her love for the National Women's Soccer League Team was sparked in Ashley Shirey's kindergarten class at Summerwood Elementary, where students participated in a project called "Women's Soccer Around the World", following professional women's soccer teams. Students utilized subjects such as math, geography, culture, reading and writing to complete a final report for the project.

"I enjoyed seeing Faith and other students get to engage in something that is real world," Karen Brady, an English II teacher at Summer Creek High School and Faith's mother, said. "It was interesting to see how they were able to incorporate different subjects through soccer."

At the beginning of the project, students drafted teams from the NWSL (United States), Barclays WSL (England), Fran Bundesliga (Germany), Division I (France), Liga F (Spain) and the newly created Northern Super League (Canada).

### The purpose of the project went far beyond soccer.

"It brings my two passions together," Shirey, who played soccer at Atascocita High School and has taught in Humble ISD for eight years, said. "It makes teaching fun and enjoyable."

Faith drafted the Portland Thorns and dove headfirst into learning about the team and the city they call home during the 2025 NWSL season. She watched matches, read soccer-themed books and tracked team stats throughout the project.

Ultimately, the main goal is for students to build confidence in writing throughout the project.

To strengthen their writing skills, each student wrote a personal letter to their team, introducing themselves and asking questions about the team.

"I think it's great from a teacher's perspective to see them so engaged in writing," Karen said. "I saw Faith grow a lot. That's something that will stick with them throughout their K-12 experience."

They understand how writing can be relevant to real world things and things that they are interested in."

Shirey placed the letters in the mail. Weeks later, to everyone's surprise, the responses started flooding in. They came

in the form of letters, autographed player cards, team-autographed soccer balls, team scarfs, team flags, social media shoutouts and more. Soccer clubs Arsenal, Racing Louisville, North Carolina Courage, Orlando Pride, Kansas City Current, Angel City, Washington Spirit, and the Chicago Red Stars were ones to each send back items.

But the biggest surprise came for Faith. On the day the Portland Thorns played the Houston Dash, Thorns manager Rob Gale showed up in person to surprise her at school. Faith was gifted official Thorns gear, including a custom jersey, and received an invitation to the game. She got to meet the players after the final whistle.

"It was a dream," Shirey said. "I never thought teams would send things back, especially not offer to come to our classroom. The kids and I will never forget those moments."

The class wrapped up the project with a field trip to a Houston Dash match, where students were treated to a post game on-field experience.

"I created the project so my girls could see that [a soccer player] is something they could be, it's possible," Shirey, who once dreamed of being a professional goalkeeper, said. "And for my boys to see that they can look up to the female players. They are just as good and cool to watch as the guys."

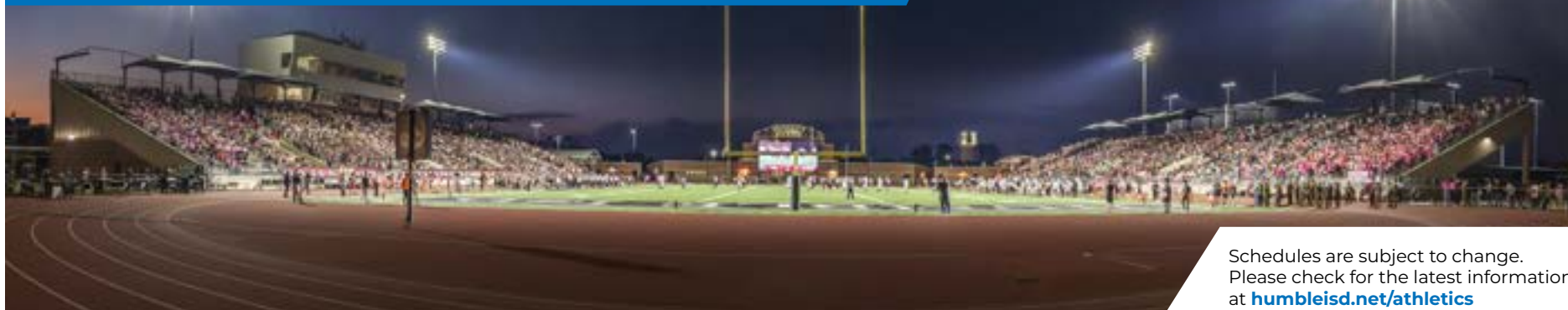

# Humble ISD Athletic Ticket Sales Now Cashless Only!

Beginning in the 2025-2026 school year, all ticket purchases for Humble ISD middle school, sub-varsity and varsity athletic events will be cashless.

Concession stand purchases at Turner Stadium will continue to accept **cash and cashless payments**. The concession stands are primarily operated by each high school's band booster club parents.

Surrounding districts have moved to the cashless model for tickets, including Aldine ISD, Clear Creek ISD, Cy-Fair ISD, Goose Creek CISD and Katy ISD.

All tickets can be purchased digitally through [humbleisd.net/athletics](https://humbleisd.net/athletics) or the Hometown Fan App for all varsity, sub-varsity and middle school games

hosted on Humble ISD campuses. On-campus presale for tickets will not occur in 2025-2026.

All major credit cards will be accepted along with Apple Pay and Google Pay at the gates if tickets are still available. A small processing fee (ranging from \$1-\$2) will be attached to each ticket purchase. The processing fee is subject to change as that rate is set by Hometown Ticketing.

When purchasing tickets for Turner Stadium, make sure the tickets purchased are for the correct team. Guests will not be permitted to use tickets at a gate not designated for the team listed on the ticket. Once inside Turner Stadium, fans are not allowed to walk from home to the visitor side and vice versa. To ensure entrance to a sporting event, employees, students, families and community members should consider purchasing a ticket in advance.

Ticket prices for high school athletic events are set by the District Executive Committee, which is made up of athletic participating districts' Superintendents, while middle school athletic event ticket prices are set by Humble ISD:

## HUMBLE ISD ATHLETICS TICKET PACKAGES



### GOLD CARD

**(Senior Citizens Age 65 or Over):**

Humble ISD offers a FREE Gold Card to members of the community who are age 65 or over. The Gold Card grants admission to any middle school or high school athletic event for FREE, barring a sell out. Gold Cards are not valid for entry to playoff games or fine arts events; a ticket will need to be purchased.

Gold Cards can be acquired by showing your ID at ANY Humble ISD athletic event. A gate worker will give you a Gold Card that you can keep and use indefinitely. A new Gold Card is not required each year. Gold Cards are also available for pickup at the Humble ISD Administration Building (10203 Birchridge Drive Humble, Texas 77338) during normal business hours (8 a.m. - 4 p.m.).



### TURNER STADIUM SEASON PASS (Varsity Football Only):

Fans can save money on processing fees by purchasing season tickets rather than individual games. Fans can purchase season tickets (with chairbacks) for \$10 per ticket or general admission season tickets for \$8 per ticket for

home games of your selected school. Tickets can be purchased on [humbleisd.net/athletictickets](https://humbleisd.net/athletictickets) from August 5 at 8 a.m. until August 15 at 11:59 p.m. The home games have to be for the same high school team and cannot vary between teams. There will be a one-time processing fee attached to the purchase.



### FLEX PASS

**(Non-Turner Stadium Middle School and High School Athletic Events):**

Fans can save money on processing fees and purchase either a 10-game or 20-game flex pass for Humble ISD middle school or high school athletic events held on Humble ISD campuses. There will be a one-time processing fee attached to the purchase. Flex Passes can be purchased at [humbleisd.net/athletictickets](https://humbleisd.net/athletictickets).

Middle School Flex Passes for adults will cost \$30 for a 10-game and \$60 for 20-game pass. There will be a one-time processing fee attached to each flex pass purchase.

High School Flex Passes for Atascocita, Humble, Kingwood and Summer Creek High School fans will cost \$50 for a 10-game and \$100 for a 20-game pass plus processing fees

for adults and students. For Kingwood Park High School, a flex pass will cost \$30 for a 10-game and \$60 for a 20-game pass plus processing fees.

Flex Passes can be utilized for any middle school or high school sport throughout the 2025-2026 school year. **They are not eligible for varsity games at Turner Stadium.**

### Humble ISD Employee/Student Ticket Options

Employees and students who hold passes/employee badges will be allowed to access games at Humble ISD athletic events.

Employees and students will not be able to enter tournaments and playoff games with passes/employee badges. In the event all tickets to a game are sold out, which includes varsity football games at Turner Stadium, or any other venue within Humble ISD, employee and student passes will not be permitted. Only purchased tickets will allow entry, and only on the purchased side.

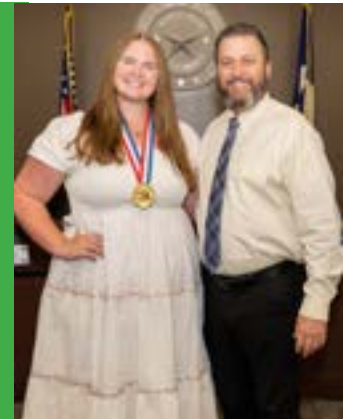

## Lake Houston Middle School opens August 2025

Lake Houston Middle School, Humble ISD's 11th middle school, opened its doors in August for the 2025-2026 school year.

The 213,000-square-foot, three-story campus is located at 15014 Timber Forest Drive, just south of Centennial Elementary. Lake Houston Middle School is designed with sixth grade on the ground floor, seventh grade on the second, and eighth grade on the third.

Funded by Bond 2022 and designed to relieve capacity at nearby middle school campuses, the new school features modern safety measures, cutting-edge technology, and flexible learning spaces that promote collaboration. One of the school's standout design elements is its use of natural light throughout the building—an intentional feature shown to support academic performance, focus, and student well-being.

Dawn Peter, the principal of Lake Houston Middle School, brings over 19 years of experience in education. She has served in Humble ISD for the past 10 years, most recently as an assistant principal at Riverwood Middle

School. Looking forward to the new campus and her new role, Principal Peter has been counting down the days until the new school year begins.

"August is here, and with it comes the excitement of a brand-new school year bursting with opportunities!" Peter said. "This year is extra special as we proudly open the doors of Lake Houston Middle School for the very first time."

## New Mosaic Building to Open in 2025, Supporting Young Adults with Special Needs



Exciting changes are on the horizon for the Mosaic program as construction continues on a new state-of-the-art facility designed to support young adults with special needs as they transition to life after high school. Set to open in late fall 2025, the new 56,600-square-foot, two-story building is located off Timber Forest Drive behind the Community Learning Center and is funded by Bond 2022.

The Mosaic program serves students ages 18–22 who received special education services and continue to qualify for educational support after high school. These students are currently based in portable buildings, but the new facility will soon offer them a modern, permanent home with purposefully designed spaces to foster independence and workforce readiness.

"We are thrilled that the new facility will provide a dedicated space for our young adults to work toward their postsecondary goals," said Leslie Johnson, Director of the program.

The first floor will house the Mosaic program

and include a variety of specialized learning spaces where students will practice important life skills. "The new campus will feature model apartments equipped with beds, laundry machines, cleaning supplies, and fully functional kitchens and living areas, so students can learn essential cooking and housekeeping skills," Johnson added.

Additional features include a dedicated workroom where students can practice office-related tasks such as making copies, using computers, and delivering supplies. A production lab will give students the opportunity to create items—like handmade T-shirts, dog treats, and jewelry—that will be sold in the onsite spirit store and at the Humble ISD Administration Building.

Outdoor learning environments, including a garden, will enhance the program's focus on practical, hands-on learning.

The second floor will be office space for more than 60 special education professionals who serve students throughout the district. This centralized location will strengthen collaboration between staff and provide more efficient support for campuses across Humble ISD.

Once complete, the new Mosaic building will stand as a cornerstone of Humble ISD's commitment to inclusive education—providing a dynamic, supportive space where young adults can gain the skills and confidence they need for successful, independent futures.

## Humble ISD's New Dental Assistant Program Helps Jumpstart Dental Careers in High School

Over the course of the school year, students learn essential dental skills such as how to make impressions for dental models, sterilize equipment, take and develop x-rays, and assist with routine procedures—all while working in a brand-new, state-of-the-art dental lab that mirrors a real clinic.

Humble ISD students with aspirations in the dental field now have the opportunity to graduate high school with a professional dental assistant certification in hand—thanks to the district's new Dental Assistant Career & Technical Education (CTE) Program. Launched during the 2024–2025 school year at Summer Creek High School, the program allows students to earn their Registered Dental Assistant (RDA) certification before graduation.

“The dental assistant program at Summer Creek High School had an incredibly successful inaugural

year, with 16 students earning their Dental Assistant certification in the spring!” said Larry Wilson, Humble ISD CTE Director. “We are grateful that we could cater to the needs of our students interested in pursuing careers as dental assistants, and we are optimistic about an even more successful 2025-2026 school year, as we have managed to expand the program by doubling the number of available seats.”

Not only does Humble ISD's new dental assistant program offer early exposure to the profession, it also saves time and money. By covering the cost of tuition and fees—which typically exceed \$4,000 outside the district—Humble ISD is removing financial barriers and helping students fast-track their career goals.

**Dress code standards** are in place during instructional time for the 2025-2026 school year. Students and parents should keep these points in mind when planning back-to-school outfits:

- District-issued student identification badges must be worn by middle and high school students.
- Dresses, skirts, fashion slits, and holes higher than midthigh are not permitted.
- The midriff must not be exposed when a student goes through the normal activities of a school day (bending, stretching, reaching, etc.).
- Male students may not wear shirts without sleeves.
- Hair must be neat, clean and well groomed. Hair style/color must not create disruptions or distraction.
- Facial hair, while allowed, must be neatly groomed and a natural color.
- Makeup is not permitted at the elementary level.
- Students may wear earrings. No other piercings are allowed.
- Tattoos must be covered.
- Steel-toe shoes, house slippers, cleats and roller/wheeled shoes are not permitted.
- For elementary students, heels over ½ inch and flip flops are not permitted.

## Required Immunizations

All students must be immunized in accordance with state law before entering Texas schools. Vaccines are available from doctors' offices, the Harris County Public Health and Environmental Services Department, 281-446-4222, or the Houston Department of Health and Human Services, 211texas.org or call 211. All immunization records must be validated with the healthcare provider's signature/stamp.

### NOTE

Incoming 7th grade students are required to receive Tdap and MCV4

### Immunization Exemptions:

For students who require medical exemptions, a written statement by a physician should be submitted to the school nurse annually. If the exemption is for reasons of conscience, which includes religious beliefs, visit [dshs.texas.gov/immunizations/school/exemptions](http://dshs.texas.gov/immunizations/school/exemptions) for instructions on how to request and complete an immunization exemption. Exemptions for reasons of conscience must be submitted to the school nurse on the original exemption form once completed and must be renewed every 2 years from the date it was notarized.

- Select your student's school from the School drop down menu. If there are no schools available to select, you have entered an address outside the district.
- If your student is eligible, the tool will display their bus stop location and pickup time.
- If no route appears, a message will display that your address is within the parent responsibility zone and not eligible for bus service.

**Should I download the Zūm Transportation App?**

Use the Zūm Transportation App to receive information about your child.

#### ELEMENTARY STUDENTS:

Parents can see in the app when their child entered and exited the bus. Parents can also see the estimated time of arrival for the bus at their stop.

#### MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS:

Parents can see estimated time of arrival for the bus at their stop.

**NOTE:** These are the only features in the app available for Humble ISD students at this time.

**NOTE:** Students with specialized transportation requirements outlined in an Individualized Education Program (IEP) will receive route information personally from the Transportation Department.

## Services For Students with Disabilities

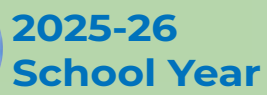

Daily Attendance = \$ to Your Student’s School

When students stay in school until 10 a.m. (Elementary) and 10:40 a.m. (Middle and High School), it ensures the school receives **FULL FUNDING** for the day!

In Texas, public school funding is primarily based on Average Daily Attendance, meaning the state allocates funds based on the number of students present each day, not the total number enrolled. Every family member plays a role! Your support in helping your child be present every day not only helps them academically but also boosts your school’s success. If your child must miss school part of the day, it’s helpful when the student stays in school until after official attendance time - which is until 10 a.m. at the elementary level and 10:40 a.m. at the middle and high school level. Schools receive full funding for the day if the student is present at official attendance time. Making doctor’s appointments after official attendance time is appreciated.

If your child sees a healthcare provider during the school day, parents are asked to submit a note from the healthcare provider (such as doctor, dentist, mental health professional) documenting the visit. The school can receive full funding if the student was present part of the school day and submitted a note documenting a medical appointment. For every type of absence, even when the school does not receive full funding, parents are required to submit notice of the absence to their child’s school within 48 hours of the absence because Texas requires schools to keep accurate attendance records for each child.
