Amateur Radio Class

In the Amateur Radio class, also known as the Ham Radio Class, we learn a lot of stuff that is very important. We learn all the sciences and geography and learn about the radio waves and the frequencies. There is even some math involved. We also learn Morse Code, which is a language made up of short and long beeps, and learn about how different countries have different call signs. A call sign is what we use to identify ourselves. Everyone has a different call sign. We also learn Q-codes, which are a couple of letters that stand for something, like QTH stands for location. We also learn the phonetic alphabet which is really fun. We also learn a lot of survival skills, because Radio is mostly used for emergency situations and services because when the phones go down, then the radio still works. We are doing a contest called the School Club Roundup and we make as many contacts as we can with schools and individuals and the more contacts and points we have the higher up we are on the leaderboard. Last year we got twelfth with 11 contacts, but this year we improved and had 38 contacts!

Ham Radio is very important when it comes to emergency transmissions and emergency situations. Radio is the only way to communicate with everyone if the phone lines are down. We learn about what is supposed to be in a bug-out-bag and what we should do in an emergency. The radios can also be charged or hooked up to a car battery to use if the power goes out. We are also taught survival skills in class as well, which could definitely come in handy if we need it.

Radio is also very fun to use and learn about. You can make contacts all over the world and it is very amazing to know morse code and the phonetic alphabet. It can also be extremely difficult if you don't want to do it, so if you're not interested then you shouldn't try it out. People who do not want to learn will not learn and it will be extremely boring and they will not be very interested. No one wants to waste time on something they don't love, but if you do like radios and how wavelengths work and how the frequencies work and what you can do with a radio then you should definitely try it out for yourself and enjoy it. Radio is just so fun and it can be a blast to do things with. Skills we learn in this class can also be used for a long time, and can help us to live when an emergency comes or even when we would like to talk to the rest of the world. It can be very fun and exciting to talk to places we have never been to before.

Eighteen operators checked into the net prepared to provide information from all over the area. A second net was opened on 40 meters (for longer range communications) from the middle school and Damon Tilger, KK7GWC, served as net control. Additional drills and activities are planned to increase the readiness of the local area for any emergencies that might arise.

INCOMING 7TH GRADERS FOR THE 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR**

Dear Parents or Guardians:

Immunize Nevada, the Division of Public and Behavioral Health and Elko County School District would like to remind you to schedule required vaccinations for your son or daughter entering 7th grade.

According to Nevada State Law, NRS 392.435 & NRS 392.443, the following vaccinations are **required prior to the start of your son or daughter's 7th grade school year.**

- **MCV4** (Quadrivalent meningococcal conjugate vaccine); which provides protection against bacteria causing meningococcal disease. Meningococcal meningitis is a serious illness that can lead to death in as little as 48 hours.
- **Tdap** (tetanus-diphtheria-acellular pertussis); which is a booster vaccine to protect against tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (whooping cough).

A list of local providers that offer vaccines is included.

Don't wait until the last minute! We encourage you to schedule your child's appointment today to ensure that they are up to date on required vaccines prior to entering 7th grade. Once your child has had the required immunizations, please provide a copy of the shot record to your child's School Health Office. **Students that are missing immunizations will not be allowed to attend school in the fall and will not receive a schedule until proof of immunizations are provided.** Thank you for your prompt attention to this matter.

If your child attends any of the following schools, they will be charged for meals starting next year: Liberty Peak Elementary, Mountain View Elementary, Spring Creek Elementary, Sage Elementary, Flag View Intermediate School, Carlin Combined, Wells Combined, Jackpot Combined, Adobe Middle School, Spring Creek Middle School, Spring Creek High School, and Elko High School.

To prepare for this change, please consider filling out a [Free and Reduced Meal Application](#) if you believe you qualify based on household income. The application can be filled out online at [ECSDNV.net](http://ecsdnv.net). An approved application guarantees free meals for the first 30 days of the 2024-2025 school year. This allows processing time, as 24-25 school year applications will be distributed during the first week of school. Parents will need to reapply for continued benefits after this initial period.

Additional schools may become eligible for the CEP program, potentially changing the list of affected schools. However, applying now ensures you'll benefit from free meals for the initial 30 days, regardless of future adjustments.

We understand the importance of providing nutritious meals for our students and remain committed to supporting families in accessing meal assistance programs.

SafeVoice offers a hotline, mobile app, and website to report threats to the safety or well-being of students. SafeVoice was established by the Nevada Department of Education and is operated in partnership with the Nevada Department of Public Safety. Reports are anonymous unless the reporter chooses to share his or her name.

Of course, our hope is that your child will talk directly to you, as well as with us here at school, about their concerns. However, if that is not possible, students can use SafeVoice as a way to speak up for their friends, the safety of their school, or themselves. *We encourage students to take a stand against meanness and bullying and to contribute to creating a positive school climate* and we think SafeVoice can help them do it. I will appreciate it if you reinforce that message.

Reports are Completely Confidential.

The reports submitted are received live 24/7/365 by trained Public Safety Communications Specialists who will gather information, engage emergency responders if necessary, and pass the report on to a team of us here at school so that we may respond, letting students know a friend cared enough about them to share a concern. *We will notify you according to our school policies and if the report raises a serious concern about your student's well-being.*



Netiquette

Rules of Behavior on the Internet

The etiquette guidelines that govern behavior when communicating on the Internet have become known as netiquette. Netiquette covers not only rules of behavior during discussions but also guidelines that reflect the unique electronic nature of the medium. Netiquette usually is enforced by fellow users who are quick to point out infractions of netiquette rules.

- **Identify yourself:**
 - Begin messages with a salutation and end them with your name.
 - Use a signature (a footer with your identifying information) at the end of a message
- **Include a subject line.** Give a descriptive phrase in the subject line of the message header that tells the topic of the message (not just "Hi, there!").
- **Avoid sarcasm.** People who don't know you may misinterpret its meaning.
- **Respect others' privacy.** Do not quote or forward personal email without the original author's permission.
- **Acknowledge and return messages promptly.**
- **Copy with caution.** Don't copy everyone you know on each message.
- **No spam (a.k.a. junk mail).** Don't contribute to worthless information on the Internet by sending or responding to mass postings of chain letters, rumors, etc.
- **Be concise.** Keep messages concise—about one screen, as a rule of thumb.
- **Use appropriate language:**
 - Avoid coarse, rough, or rude language.
 - Observe good grammar and spelling.
- **Use appropriate emoticons (emotion icons) to help convey meaning.** Use "smileys" or punctuation such as :-) to convey emotions. See website list of emoticons at <http://netlingo.com/smiley.cfm> and <http://www.robelle.com/smugbook/smiley.html>.
- **Use appropriate intensifiers to help convey meaning.**
 - Avoid "flaming" (online "screaming") or sentences typed in all caps.
 - Use asterisks surrounding words to indicate italics used for emphasis ("at last").
 - Use words in brackets, such as (grin), to show a state of mind.
 - Use common acronyms (e.g., LOL for "laugh out loud").
