

Recipe Corner.

No Bake Cookies

Single Double

½ c butter 1 c. butter

2 c. sugar 4 c. sugar

½ c. milk 1 c . milk

¹/₄ c. cocoa powder 1/2c. cocoa powder

½ c. peanut butter 1 c. peanut butter

1 tsp vanilla 2 tsp vanilla

3 c. quick oats 6 c. quick oats

Place butter, sugar, milk and cocoa in a large saucepan.

Heat on medium, stirring often until butter is melted.

Bring to a rolling boil for 1 minute. (SET TIMER)

Remove from heat. Add peanut butter, oats and vanilla, stir well. Drop by small (no bigger than TBSP) spoonfuls on to wax paper.

Cool to set.

2 eggs

1c Sugar

1 tsp vanilla

1/4 tsp almond extract

Mix until fluffy! Then Add:

3c flour

1tsp soda

2tsp baking powder

Pinch of salt

Mix until dough is formed and it starts to pull away from the sides of the mixer. Then add:

2Tbsp milk.

Mix until dough looks good! Drop on cookie sheet. Sprinkle sugar on top, press down a bit with a fork, add sugar sprinkles.

Bake 350 for 10 min.

In The Classroom.



Classroom instruction is well underway!
Your students are now switching their
brains from summer mode to school mode.
What does this mean? School mode simply
means engaging in learning, pushing
students to apply prior knowledge to new
concepts. Questioning is a positive strategy
which helps students process their day,
retain material, and put into words
unarticulated thoughts.





As a parent, some days I only have a few minutes for this conversation in between the car ride home from practice and throwing together dinner. THAT IS OK! We all have to squeeze it in where we can.

Here are some tips that might guide your questions at home:

- Avoid Yes or No questions
- Ask Open-Ended questions or use phrases like:
 - Tell me more
 - What did that look like?
 - What is something you know NOW that you didn't before?
 - Can you teach me something you learned today?
- It is also important to ask questions beyond academics like:
 - Tell me something that made you laugh today.
 - What types of things are causing you stress?

Students don't always know what to say when you ask how their day was, so using a couple of these questions can help.







Assessments.

PK-12 grade teachers

utilize a set of assessments called FastBridge to measure student learning. FastBridge scores in reading and math help teachers know what kind of instruction and skills each student needs, also known as MTSS. MTSS stands for Multi-Tiered System of Supports. MTSS is for all students K-12 for reading and math. FastBridge assessments are administered three times a year (fall, winter, spring). Your student's progress over time can be viewed on the FB Family Report and shared by the classroom teacher.

Thank you to our volunteers at the Lebo Fire Department for helping students and staff cool down and celebrate our first full week of school! SO MUCH FUN!




