Hello Lebo!

Can you believe it is already October? With the end of the first quarter fast approaching, the start to the school year has felt like a whirlwind!

For the Junior High and High School, September brought us Homecoming, Spirit Week, trips to the State Fair, and student organizations firing on all cylinders. Roughly 90% of students passing all their classes, and we have launched our tiered interventions groups focusing on comprehension and vocabulary to support our goal of having 80% of our students successful in Tier 1 classroom instruction. Our students have engaged in goal setting, discussions of grit, and showing kindness.

At the Elementary and PreK level, this past month sent kids to the playground to enjoy the outdoor classroom space; Book Buddies have been launched between Kindergarten and Fifth grade, and teachers nominated the September Leaders of the Pack. The new math curriculum is showing evidence of scaffolded instruction at all grade levels. Tier groups for reading and math are underway; classes are earning Friday movies in the cafeteria, and we had an amazing celebration of our Grandparents at the Community Center. PreK partnered with the Lebo Branch Library for story time; and our Guidance lessons have been around diversity, inclusion, and helping students celebrate their differences.

As a building, late start has allowed teachers to focus on establishing Professional Learning Communities with an emphasis on student data and instructional practices. We continue to prioritize school safety and teaching our students to be RESPECTFUL, RESPONSIBLE, and SAFE.

Recipe Corner.

Caramel Apple Cake

- 1 pkg Yellow cake mix
- 1 pkg Vanilla Flavor Instant Pudding
- 1 cup water
- 4 eggs
- 1/3 cup oil
- 1/4 cup milk
- 3 Granny Smith apples (1 lb.), peeled, coarsely chopped
- ½ bag caramel bits or 20 caramels
- 3 Tbsp. milk

Heat Oven to 350°F.

Beat first 6 ingredients in a mixer until blended. Stir in the Apples.

Pour into a greased and floured bundt pan.

Bake 45-50 or until a toothpick comes out clean.

Let cool for about 15 minutes; Pop out onto a cake plate. Make a caramel sauce with caramels and milk; combining and microwaving 30 seconds at a time until creamy. Drizzle over cake and Serve.

This cake is a fall favorite at our house! I like to mix Granny Smith and Honey Crisp Apples which is a good combination of sweet and tart!





Pumpkin Banana Pecan Muffins

Muffin

1 pkg Yellow cake mix 1 can pumpkin puree 2 ripes bananas (smashed) Small splash of vanilla Pinch of Pumpkin Pie Spice

Pecan Streusel Topping

1/4 c oats
1/4 c brown sugar
1/4 c melted butter
1/2c chopped pecans
1/4 tsp cinnamon

Mix the muffin ingredients. Spoon into muffin tins. Mix all streusel ingredients in a bowl until crumbly. Spoon on to muffin mix. Should make 18-20 cupcake sized muffins.

Bake 350 for 20 minutes or until done.

MINDFULNESS.

The school year is in full swing; students are settling into the routines of learning while learning to navigate schedules, activities, and social pressures. Regardless of age, students can experience stress, anxiety, and lack of focus due to being over-stimulated. I recently read an article on mindfulness, when looking for ways to support my own daughter will stress reduction.

Maura Bradley, the author of Mindfulness for Kids, defines mindfulness as "paying attention to where you are, what you're doing, and how you're feeling—all at the same time." Bradley believes that mindfulness can improve all aspects of our lives by reducing stress and anxiety. It can also strengthen our ability to focus on the tasks at hand (Education Week, 2023, p 24).

Building these techniques into our home and school routine can give students tools to manage their bodies when encountering stressful situations.

Here are TWO mindfulness techniques to try at home:

To start, GET IN POSITION OF MINDFULNESS:

- Sit cross-legged on the floor or in a chair, with your back straight.
- Place your hands gently on your knees or legs.
- Close your eyes.

FIVE FINGER BREATHING:

- Hold up one hand with your palm facing away from your body.
- With your pointer finger from the opposite hand, inhale and simultaneously trace your pointer finger up the left side of your thumb.
- As you exhale, trace down the other side of your thumb.
- Continue this way, inhaling and exhaling, with the other four fingers.

20 BREATHS:

All you have to do is count and breathe!

- Close your eyes.
- Take an inhale and exhale. That is one breath.
- Continuing inhaling and exhaling, counting 10 breaths. When you reach 10, count backwards through 0.

Reality UTM brings a bit of "reality" to students in 8th and 10th grade through a 75-minute interactive and engaging personal finance simulation. Students imagine their life as 26-year-olds and complete an online lifestyle survey. This information is entered into our trademarked software, along with their current GPA, to create a unique and individualized future scenario.

Each scenario includes the student's monthly income, credit card debt, student loan information, as well as marital and family status. Students are given a checkbook register to track their monthly purchases from the 12 booths representing services and/or products that adults typically must purchase or consider each month. Sometimes they must return a "purchase" and make a different decision. The checkbook register can't fall below zero!

This event actively engages students to help them understand the importance of how their performance in school today impacts their future. It also provides the community an opportunity to share in local students' learning and develop an understanding of the world of work.





Dear Parents,

This letter provides information about our school's efforts to identify all students who need additional help to meet this year's student learning goals. To help us know which students might need additional support, the students complete screening tests up to three times each year. These tests help teachers see which students are likely to meet the end of year learning goals, and which ones need more help. Our school uses the following FastBridge Learning® assessments to screen students:

earlyReading (Grades PK-1) aReading (Grades 2-12) CBMreading (Grades 2-5) AUTOreading (Grades 2-12) earlyMath (Grades PK-1) aMath (Grades 2-12) CBMmath Automaticity (Grades 2-12)

Lebo Schools use Benchmark Indicators when interpreting data.

The teachers look at the screening scores immediately after the testing and compare their students' scores with other information about school performance. Those students whose scores are low across different tests are provided with additional support to help them meet the learning goals.

All of the students who participate in extra instruction also take regular progress tests to see if their skills are getting better. These tests are given weekly to monthly, depending on the student's learning needs. Both screening and progress monitoring score reports are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences or at other times during the school year. These reports help the teacher, student, and parents know if each student is likely to meet this year's learning goals.

If your child has a low score on a screening test, and other information shows that the student needs extra help in that area, extra instruction will be given automatically during the daily school schedule. Your child's progress will be shared with you by his or her teacher. If you have questions about your child's school performance, screening scores, or progress monitoring results, please contact your child's teacher. We look forward to working with your child and you during this school year.
